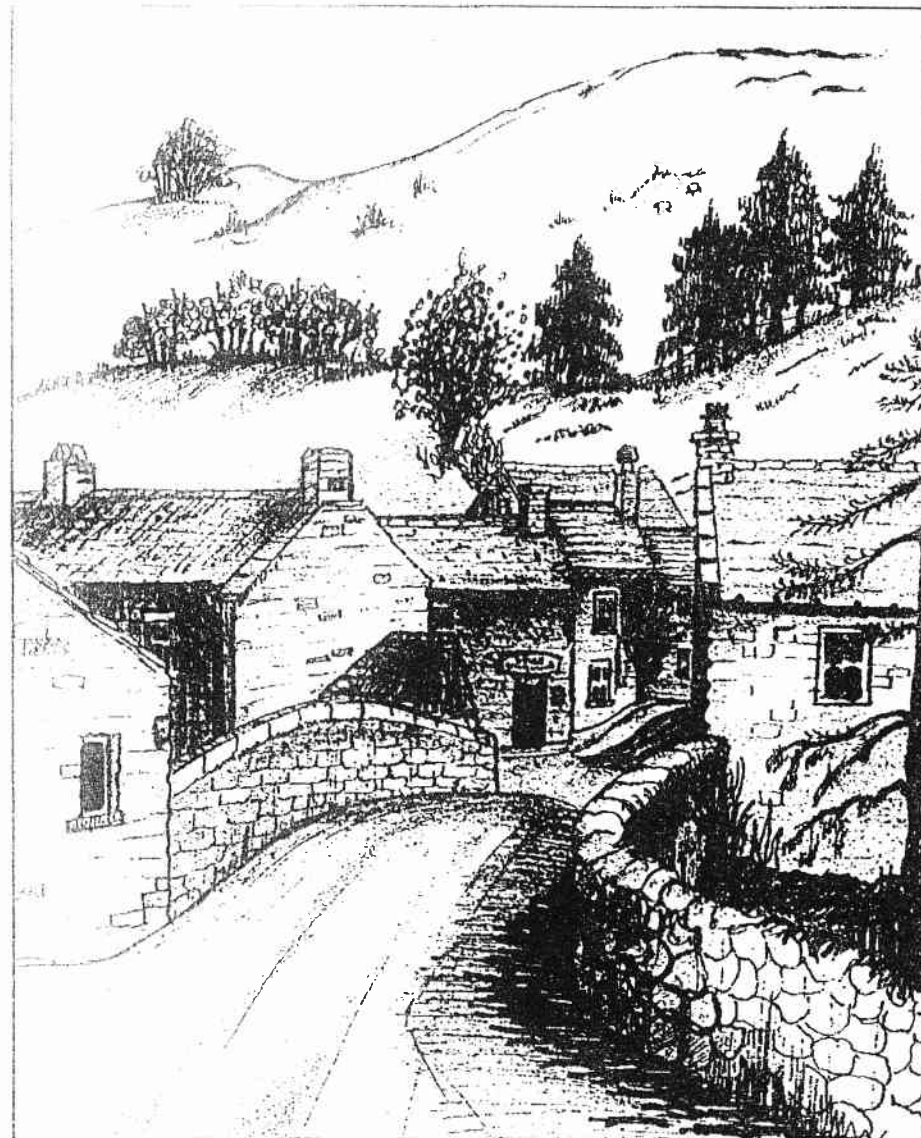

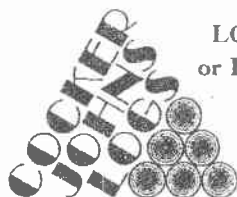

### BUS SERVICES

Arkengarthdale will at last get a regular bus service - provided there are passengers. After the successful pilot scheme for a link service with the popular Richmond - Reeth - Keld - Reeth - Leyburn Service in Swaledale on Fridays the service is being extended from 12<sup>th</sup> April to link with all the daily Swaledale services. Local bus operator Malcolm Terry of Reeth is working on a timetable for the new Service. The services will operate from Whaw though Arkengarthdale to Reeth to meet the respective bus. Initially passengers have to "pre-order" the link by telephoning 884533 before 6pm the day before. The service is supported by North Yorkshire County Council

### Dales Centre Project

Over thirty people, representing many local organisations and interests attended an open meeting on 5<sup>th</sup> March in the Black Bull to discuss progress with this idea. There is a need for improved facilities for young people in the Dale possibly with sports hall type facilities. Comment was also made that there is nowhere large enough for a single performance of local school concerts. Whilst improvements to local village halls are welcomed facilities remain restricted. A feasibility study is to be conducted to assess local needs whilst available sites and grant aid continue to be explored.

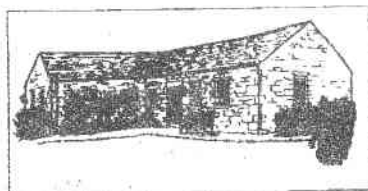

## *It's a Doc's Life*

### **A column with a medical slant**

Most of you will be familiar with how the surgery operates but if you are not here are some simple guidelines.

Morning surgeries are 8.30-10.00 and there is **no appointment system**. This was the most popular choice the last time I surveyed the patients. If you want a home visit please phone before 10.30. We dispense for all patients except those who live within a mile of a pharmacy.

The new out of hour's service has been running for a year now and is very successful, with a high level of patient satisfaction. To contact the doctor out of hour's always ring **884396** and listen to the answer-phone message.

If I am out visiting during the day and you are faced with an emergency, please do not hesitate in phoning for an ambulance. We live a very rural area and it takes 20 minutes for it to get to Reeth from Richmond, so the sooner the ambulance is on the way the better.

Apropos of that we will be distributing a card called HeartSave to some selected patients. It comes from a joint venture with the Health Authority and Ambulance Service urging patients with chest pain to dial 999 first. This is prompted by the fact that 50% of patients who die from a heart attack, do so without reaching hospital. There, doesn't that make you feel better!

The Government is convinced we are all out to swindle them out of their prescription charges. Consequently from the 1<sup>st</sup> April we are obliged to get everyone to sign the prescription form to say they have either paid the prescription fee or have produced proof that they are exempt. Therefore, I am afraid it means that if you either do not pay or have not produced proof of exemption you will not get your prescription. Each item on a prescription now costs £5.80p so please come armed. I do not enjoy acting as an unpaid tax collector but is the law!

On a slightly brighter note the new Primary Care Groups (introduced by the Labour Government to replace fund-holding) control the delivery of primary care in the locality. I am a board member and I hope we can favourably influence the future of local medical services.

## *Frogmore's Little Miracle*

I've just finished reading Duncan Bythell's *Banding in the Dale* and an interesting read it was too. Our Reeth Bookshop at the Post Office may still have copies. That's where I bought mine.

The book reminds me of my own banding days with my friend Frogmore. He was good on the cornet; had his own instrument, a treasured gift from his grandmother. I didn't get beyond the off beats of the third cornets! Together we enjoyed our trips to the national contests in Manchester. We loved the big bands. Not the big bands of the BBC - you remember, Henry Hall, Roy Fox and the like. No, for us it was the Bessies of the Barn, Wingates and Black Dykes and for a variety of tone colour the lads from Kneller Hall. And Fodens, of course.

Frogmore was with me back in the thirties when the great Harry Mortimer, then a strip of a lad, played one of his first public cornet solos, with Fodens, his father conducting, "Alpine Echoes," I think it was called.

Chatting about these old days after enjoying concerts by Muker Silver and Reeth Brass Bands Frogmore told me a relevant tale of his youth. During a band practice in an interval in the music, he foolishly held his cornet by the mouthpiece and the instrument landed on the floor. The damage to the bell almost broke his heart. He was so ashamed he could not tell the folks at home and his attempt to straighten it out with his father's pliers made matters worse.

Frogmore was religious little lad so every bedtime he added to his prayer a request that the dents be removed from his cornet. Every morning for a year or more he opened the case expecting the instrument to be in perfect shape, and always he was disappointed.

One day at band practice things weren't right in the cornet section. The bandmaster seeking the cause of the fault, examined the springs in Frogmore's instrument. One was broken so the bandmaster had it sent off for repair. When he received the cornet back, Frogmore was delighted to find that the craftsman involved had not only mended the spring but had removed the dents. "Was this a small miracle and answer to prayer?" Frogmore wondered.

## VOTES

*(Information on this subject was gained from Fieldhouse and Jennings  
"History of Swaledale," and my father E.Cooper's writings. )*

In last month's "Gazette" we were reminded that local elections are to be held soon, when we will be voting ( or not, as the case may be ) for Councillors to represent us on local matters. It is a fact that many of us don't bother to take up this privilege to choose among candidates for these positions. But, to have a vote is certainly a privilege when we consider the lack of voting rights of past times, when the average person was not considered responsible enough to choose whom he wished to govern his daily life.

In Swaledale and Arkengarthdale little changed over the centuries after the feudal system of the 12C. Although feudalism as such disappeared, the structure remained much the same, with Manor Courts, the Lord of the Manor and his steward, taking on much of the responsibility of governing local affairs. There were Manor Courts in Muker, Healaugh, Arkengarthdale, Fremington, Marske and Stainton. Matters to do with property, common lands, wood and peat cutting were their business. The Lord of the Manor and his steward looked to water supplies, provision of pinfolds, hobbletrees and stocks, to checking of weights and measures, to restriction on house building ( for control of immigration and settlement ) and to the regulation of the community generally including poaching, throwing stones and being rude. Although there were, over the centuries, a number of changes in the manner of law enforcement, the system remained undemocratic and self-perpetuating. Alongside the Manor Courts the Parish Vestry also had the power and responsibilities over the people. Care and control of the poor was in particular the responsibility of the Parish. This system remained, more-or-less unchanged until the formation of local county councils elected by the people in the late 19<sup>th</sup> Century ( albeit, only by a tiny percentage of the population. )

Sometimes the rulings of the Select Vestry, appointed by church wardens and holders of 'tenements and lands' with the vicar or curate usually in the chair, seemed harsh in their treatment of the poor and destitute. In 1832, in traditional Dales modes, a poem signed by "Observer" was sent to Edward Coates in Feetham, headed "lines written in consequence of the most infernal plot in the Parish of Muker, made against the poor of the said Parish by the Vestry, in order to deprive the paupers of all furniture which those wiseacres in the consummate wisdom supposed to be necessary, and selling them by public auction on the most memorable day, Muker Fair, January 1832."

"You honest men all, who have taxes to pay,  
Let your ear be attentive to what I shall say.  
Your wise vestry laws, restrictions and rules,  
Are left to a parcel of asses and fools.  
Yet who would have thought it could enter the brains  
Of any such men as had hold of the reigns.  
This business most surely was hatched in Hell,  
To take from the paupers their prayer books to sell.  
These hard hearted monsters, pursuing this plan,  
Seized clock, sir, and cupboards, with frying pan.

Fire-irons, hand-irons, kitchen and all,  
With various articles up the whole.  
Tis strange, sir, indeed that all those wiseacres  
Themselves should demean, and so be partakers,  
Church wardens, and members of vestry combine  
To accomplish and object which was not divine.  
Did e'er such a case as the present occur,  
All men in their senses must surely demur,  
None ever before this beheld such a sight  
When the poor by the rich were robbed of their right.  
On such an excursion, with two or three more,  
They did such an act as was ne'er done before.  
Tis hoped such another will not be again  
So long as the Parish of Muker remains."

Whether the Vestry were shamed into better decisions after this, I don't know!

In Richmond itself local government was in the hands of the Burgesses. In 1576 Queen Elizabeth granted a Charter establishing Corporations to supervise local affairs. They were to have an Alderman, twelve burgesses, a recorder and two Sergeants at Mace. The Alderman was to be elected by a common council ( which had no legal standing, not much influence and was often dispensed with. ) The Alderman was elected from two candidates chosen by the burgesses. The burgesses were self-appointing and held their position for life. The Corporation had powers to administer justice, maintain law and order and keep a prison. It forbade occupation of privately owned houses by single women. Also subletting and taking lodgers was forbidden ( this to ensure that vagrants and paupers would not enter the town and become a liability. ) The Corporation controlled the price of beer, looked after streets, conduits and wells and walls. It was responsible for markets and fairs.

Centuries later, dissatisfaction with local government became acute, and the mood for reform was keen. Parliamentary reform had already been achieved in 1832 and the Common turned their minds to the local situation. A Commission reported that local Corporations "whose powers are subject to no popular control and whose acts and proceedings, being secret, are unchecked by the influence of public opinion" should be abandoned and replaced by councils elected by the people. A new Act was passed and in 1835 Richmond formed a Council, although this was elected by only 289 people the franchise being limited to rate-payers with three years residence. They had to be householders, men, not women, and have a minimum income. It doesn't sound much of an improvement to us, but it was the foundation of our present day system, and took on a great many duties which continue today.

One would imagine the greater transparency in matters concerning the lives of ordinary people would have been greeted with satisfaction. However in Upper Swaledale and no doubt elsewhere, where the creation of local district councils had to wait several decades, it was Parliamentary Reform which made the greatest impact. Until the 19<sup>th</sup>C representation in Parliament was to "Two Knights of the Shire" and by burgesses of certain buroughs. Richmond received exemption from its obligation to send burgesses on grounds of expense. So Richmond,

Swaledale and Arkengarthdale were represented, with the whole of Yorkshire, by two knights. The control by the local gentry over who was sent to Parliament, and their persuasive methods of controlling the few voters was powerful and sometimes corrupt. Representation was increased by 1584 and Richmond sent its first burgesses. Burgesses (those who paid 'lot and scot' — local taxes and rates) had the franchise, only numbered 272. They of course were among the wealthy of Richmond, the man in the street had no vote. There were scandals and skulduggery among various powerful families who rigged the votes by buying up burgage property and gaining the voting rights as a result, and by dishonest recording officers who were open to bribes. Well known families 'cornered' parliamentary seats over long periods of time.

Voting took place in York, which was an expensive business for candidates, who had to pay for the travelling and accommodation of their supporters. As far as Swaledale voters were concerned we have an account from the 1807 election when Richard Garth had the right to vote. He set off for York to vote for the anti-slavery candidate, Wilberforce. Meeting with Archdeacon Headlam in Richmond they set off to join other yeomen on the Great North road to ride to York.

In 1832 the first Reform Bill was carried through by the Whigs, and gave the vote to all householders whose houses had a minimal rent value of £10 or more. Thus 6½% of the population gained the vote, men, of course! This may not seem a great step forward, but it caused considerable excitement in the dales. Polling Stations became more accessible, and those in upper Swaledale set off for Askrigg in a celebratory mood to cast their votes.

Edward Broderick writes "*Muker, Melbecks and Grinton are in the district to be polled at Askrigg. This is the first election. I went over with my father ..... The electors were to meet at Craketrees (Crowtrees) by none o'clock, Richard Garth and my father went round and I went up Satron side and as soon as I got to the long wall I saw the people coming up Oxnop side with four flags waving. The scene effected me very much by being so new. I overtook several from Gunnerside and Satron and we all met at Gill Head. They seemed very much animated and belonged to the Orange party and reformers, I don't see why they should not be, as it is the Reform Bill which has given copyholders the privilege of voting.*"

Today we should not forget that those few who a hundred and fifty years ago gained the franchise really saw it as a privilege and responsibility to have the vote. We are sometimes too apathetic, I fear, and prefer to grumble when our councils do things we disapprove of. We would be more responsible ourselves if we took the trouble to vote!

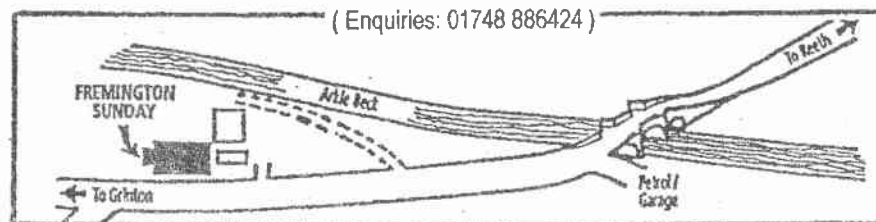

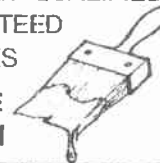

## DOWNHOLME PARISH - 1890

as the 20<sup>th</sup> Century draws to a close we reproducing entries from the "*Bulmers History and Directory of North Yorkshire, 1890*" to compare of the two Dales as they were recorded at the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century and as they are at the end of this Century - the last is Downholme .....

Wapentake and Petty Sessional Division of Hang West—Electoral Division of Catterick—Poor Law Union and County Court District of Richmond—Rural Deanery and Archdeaconry of Richmond—Diocese of Ripon.

This parish, comprising an area of 5,915 acres, lies between the parishes of Marrick and Marske on the north, and Wensley and Spennithorne on the south. A large portion of the surface (about 3,000 acres) is covered by moorland, but that lying near the Swale is generally fertile. The townships of Downholme, Ellerton Abbey, Stainton, and Walburn are included in the parish, and have a united population of 227.

The township of Downholme comprises 1,294 acres of land, including 724 acres of moorland, and lies on the southern acclivities of Swaledale. It is chiefly the property of Lord Bolton (lord of the manor); J. T. D'Arcy Hutton, Esq.; and the exors. of D. F. Alderson.

The village of Downholme is distant about five miles S.W. of Richmond. The Church (St. Michael) is an ancient edifice, standing in the dale, about a quarter of a mile below the village. It underwent a general restoration in 1886, at a cost of about £400, raised by subscription. The chancel has been re-roofed, the gallery taken down, the organ restored and replaced, and the cumbersome old pews substituted by modern open benches. The plan embraces chancel, nave, with north aisle and south porch, and a belfry, containing two bells. The four pillars which carry the arches of the north aisle are Norman, and probably belong to the original edifice; the porch also is Norman, and shows some very neatly carved work. The chancel arch is Gothic, as is also the greater part of the church; but traces of an Early English restoration are visible in a doorway, now walled up, a window in the north aisle, and a carved stone on one side of the chancel arch. A few fragments of very ancient stained glass remain in the two windows of the aisle, and a stone coffin, with cover complete, lies in the churchyard, whilst a portion of another has been built into the wall of the porch.

The *living*, formerly a perpetual curacy, is now a vicarage worth £175 a year, in the gift of J. T. D'Arcy Hutton, Esq., and the incumbency of the Rev. Joseph Cutler, Oxon.

The School was erected in 1814, at the expense of the Rev. Edward Ellerton and his brothers, and, in 1851, was endowed by the former gentleman with £513 6s. 10d., stock in the three per cent. consols. This, with other endowments, produces £25 a year, and the like amount is raised by a voluntary rate. The school is under the charge of Mr. Joseph Sedgwick, and has an average attendance of 32.

ELLERTON ABBEY township comprises an area of 1,664 acres, lying on the south bank of the Swale opposite Marrick. The surface is varied and picturesque, rising into bold scars and fells as it recedes from the river. The whole township and manor belong to Mrs. S. C. E. E. Erle-Drax, of Ellerton Abbey and Charborough Park, Dorset. The alder or eller once grew so abundantly here as to have impressed its name on the *ton* or farmstead of the Saxon owners. The rateable value of the township is £903, and the number of inhabitants 44.

Near the Swale are the fragments of the ruins of *Ellerton Priory*, consisting of a small portion of the west tower, and a few feet of three of the walls of the conventual church. It is supposed to have been founded by Warnerus, Lord of Aske, and sewer to the Earl of Richmond, or by his son Whymerus, in the reign of Henry II., and was inhabited by nuns of the austere Cistercian order. The convent was small and but sparingly endowed with two oxgangs of land in Ellerton and a moiety of the manor of Ellerton-cum-Staynton, yet it tempted the cupidity

of the Scots, who, in one of their predatory inroads into Swaledale in the reign of Edward III., sacked the nunnery and carried away several charters and writings. At the time of its dissolution in 1535, it was valued at £15 10s. 6d. per annum. The site and demesnes were demised to Ralph Closeby of the King's Household, gent., but for what term or on what conditions does not appear. In 1601 they came into the possession of Gabriel Drax, from whom they have descended in uninterrupted succession to the present proprietor, Sarah Charlotte Elizabeth Ernle Erle-Drax, who married 1871, John Lloyd Egginton, Esq., late 3rd Dragoon Guards, and by letters patent in 1887, resumed her maiden name.

The present substantial residence was built about 1830, by the mother of the present proprietor. At the west end of the estate, on the old foot road, is the historic "Stolerston Stile" which divides Swaledale proper from Ellerton dale.

This township is in the Reeth Union.

STANTON township comprises 1,851 acres, including about 1,000 acres of moorland, and is valued, for rateable purposes, at £487. It is solely the property of S. T. Scrope, Esq., of Danby Hall, who is also lord of the manor. Grey flags and slates are quarried here, and lead has been met with among the hills. The village of Stainton (Stone-town), consisting of three farm houses and a few cottages, is situated among the fells, 5½ miles S.W. of Richmond. Population, 41.

WALBURN is a sparsely populated township, containing 1,935 acres, including moorland, belonging to J. T. D'Arcy Hutton, Esq., Marske Hall. This place formerly belonged to the Scropes, but Walburn Hall, their residence, has long been occupied as a farmhouse. The township contains five scattered houses. Rateable value, £773, and population, 30.

## Parish & General News round up

**Upper Dale Road hold ups-** Road closures due to the installation of a new water main from West Stonesdale to Angram Head tanks is presently causing a few problems. **Tree & Shrubbery lopping** - Highways authority Contractors are doing a good job cutting back the road edge trees and shrubbery, some say they should have cut more off, however now it is possible to see the many roadside walls which need repair and are tumbling onto the road. Is it the farmer or the highways authority responsibility ? and whilst they are on why not open out all the blocked drains and gullies.

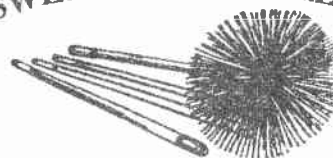

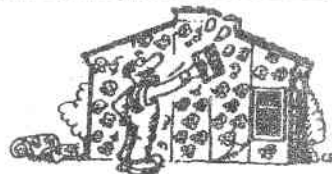

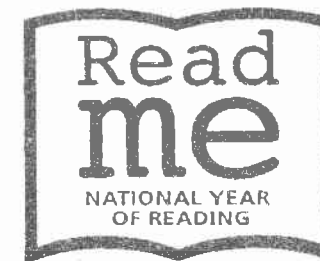
