
The "Gazette" is written, published and printed by a team of unpaid volunteers and normally some 2000, 40 page copies are distributed throughout the two dales.

STAYING IN OR TOURING THE **SWALEDALE & ARKENGARTHDALE AREA**

The gateway to the area is via Scotch Corner on the A1 taking the road to Richmond, the old county town with its Castle, Georgian Theatre and riverside walks. Walk the narrow lanes, look at the old Friary, check the steep square. Stroll to Easby Abbey along the river Swale, then from Richmond take the road to Reeth and discover the beautiful Two Dales for yourself, with the stone walled natural hay meadows, and carpets of wild flowers from mid-June to the end of July, soft rolling hills with their banks of purple heather in August-September. The area boasts many historic Churches, all well worth a visit. The Museum at Reeth displays artefacts depicting the history of Lead-mining in the Two Dales and throughout the area there are old sites of mining interest. There are many other local places of interest to see including the Buttertubs Pass, the spectacular Waterfalls near Keld, the famous Tan Hill Inn (the highest Licensed premises in England 1732ft asl.) Call in to the craft shops/workshops and see the pots, models and ceramics being made. Perhaps treat yourself to a holiday memento or plan ahead for some-ones birthday or Christmas present.

We have the Swaledale Festival May 25th-June 9th featuring music and artists providing a wide choice from the classics to traditional folk, from Shakespeare to modern satire. Both Reeth and Muker village Brass Bands take part, putting on concerts in the churches and village halls. Illustrated Talks and Lectures are given on diverse subjects of local and general interest. From Spring to September each year there are normally Agricultural and Sheep Shows at Tan Hill, Reeth and Muker. Public Transport serves the dale and there are services to Richmond, Leyburn and Hawes Markets.

Why not visit the different film and TV locations and see for yourself where the BBC's Herriot Vet series "All Creature Great and Small" was filmed. The Fast Show and Countryfile have also filmed in the dales.

Further afield but within easy driving distance are the Settle to Carlisle Railway, Lightwater Valley Amusement Park, Beamish Open Air Museum, historic York City or the Lake District, ideal as day trips.

From Hotels to small Inns, from Guest Houses to self-catering cottages, travel by car or by public transport we are sure you will thoroughly enjoy a visit or holiday spent in the beautiful northern dales. Mike Beckwith

SWALEDALE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL

The churches of St Mary's, Arkengarthdale; St Andrew's Grinton; Holy Trinity, Low Row, and St Mary's, Muker are struggling to meet an increased commitment due to a sharp upward increase in the Diocesan Quota for 2001/2002, levied by the Synod of Ripon & Leeds Diocese. A considerable amount of time has been spent considering the apportionment among the four churches, and setting a budget for the year. The outcome of this was to agree a budget but with a shortfall on the parish share of circa f 1800.

A number of initiatives have been undertaken by church members to work together to raise money to meet this shortfall. One of these initiatives was a scheme called Pyramid Hospitality which began with a meal for ten guests hosted by Gladys Atkinson, Arkengarthdale. Each of her guests was asked to contribute £5 to Parish funds and then host their own form of hospitality for six friends/relatives/ neighbours. This has raised approx. £500 to date, but progress has been delayed because of the concerns caused by the foot & mouth disease.

A further bid to raise funds will be in the form of a CAKE STALL at Reeth Market. This will be held on the second Friday of the months of June, July, August and October and will commence on Friday, 8th June.

Please support the churches in the Parish of Swaledale. Reduction in tourists to our area also affects the income of the churches as well as the businesses. PCC

<u>Upper Dales</u> Family History Society

June 2001

At the end of April the group held its first meeting in its new Swaledale venue, the Old Sunday School, Fremington, an appropriate setting for a story of family history which began with the records of a nineteenth century Methodist lay preacher. Mrs Marion Moverley of Richmond told how the inheritance, in the 1960s of an old cupboard from a distant relative had led to the uncovering of her family links with Coverdale and Middleham, using her own experiences to illustrate a number of useful lessons for others struggling to make sense of old family papers. The cupboard, full of old Methodist plans and class registers, provided a link back through six generations and provided Mrs Moverley with the clues to trace her family to Teesdale and to "meet", through newspaper reports the grandparents who had died long before she was born. The May meeting at the Dales Countryside Museum, Hawes was a practical session covering some of the facilities and aids to research. Dr Ann Hartley gave a useful introduction to the indexes available covering civil registration of births, marriages and deaths since the 1830s, along with their advantages and limitations. Members were shown the facilities available to Friends of the Museum in the research room, and also had the opportunity to try out the recently published CD ROM of the National Burial Index and to look up their ancestors on the 1881 census, also available on CD ROM. Thanks to a generous volunteer, two fiche reading machines have been repaired, and one

will be available at all the Wensleydale and Swaledale meetings of the group. Anyone who has records on microfiche is welcome to bring them along to meetings to read themselves and for the benefit of others. Members are currently assisting with a major programme of cleaning and restoration of museum items as part of the ongoing audit. More volunteers are always welcome and a particular need at the moment is for anyone with experience or knowledge of tin smithing. Plans are underway for a two week exhibition, to be held at the museum, in November to mark the first anniversary of the group. This will incorporate a wide variety of topics researched by members and other local people, along with talks demonstrations on different aspects of family history. Full details will be available in the near future.

The Stroke Association is a National Charity which provides support to people who have had strokes, their families and carers. It campaigns, educates and informs to increase the knowledge of stroke at all levels of society. Each year about 100.000 people in this country suffer first strokes - 10,000 are under retirement age. All research and development activities are funded entirely by voluntary donations. After the concert a supper with a Raffle were held in Muker Public Hall and Mr & Mrs Guy thanked all for attending and helping to raise such a wonderful sum for the research into Stroke in Children.

Foot & Mouth Disease - The scientifically predicted decline of the epidemic nationally signals a welcome release for the farming community, but continued vigilance is still necessary as the 14 cases in 10 days in the Settle area indicates. Unfortunately during the month the total number of cases in North Yorkshire has doubled to 40. This means that although there have been no cases in our immediate area since the 23rd April, the National Park has not lifted any closure notices on any local rural footpaths. As footpath access to the river Swale continues to be illegal, fishing remains off-limits.

The club is in constant touch with all the organisations that influence the decision-making process and as soon as there are any confirmatory signs that some or all of our water becomes available, we will immediately broadcast the fact.

An Unparalleled Recreational Resource

Despite the curtailment of fishing caused by the F&MD we hope that soon we shall be able to start a foreshortened season. So in anticipation perhaps I could entice some new members to join. The club was established 14 years ago with the primary intention to provide reasonable access to the sport for local people. The founders of the club can rest assured that this guiding principle remains fulfilled with approximately 18.5 miles of the river Swale and its main feeder streams now available intermittently all the way from Rampsholme bridge, in the west to Stainton lane end, in the east. The joining qualification, apart from an interest in fishing, is that one must be a resident of the one of the local parishes. A 'resident' is generally defined as a ratepayer and/or resident family member.

Most rural rivers are lovely, quiet and contemplative places anyway, but surely the Swale in our locality ranks second to none in all these respects and more. The club maintains a regular re-stocking policy to ensure healthy levels of the native wild brown trout in the low nutrient rain fed environment. Consequently the sport is of the highest order, offering as it does easily accessible grass banks with gliding water on the one hand, for the beginner and deep, tree lined, steep sloped and fast flowing stretches on the other hand, for the more experienced and adventurous. There is something to tempt all levels of ability. Generally the fishing techniques are restricted to fly and worm but there are stretches where spinning is also allowed. In short the club offers an unparalleled recreational resource and all for the modest outlay of a £20 a year membership fee (£10 for juniors). All members must possess a current rod license, which can be purchased at the post office. Incidentally, the rod license for juniors has just been reduced and is now only £5 p.a.; this has been introduced specifically to encourage more youngsters to take-up the sport.

The club awards annually a number of trophies, however, this competitive element has always been considered secondary to the fostering of the sport of fishing itself. Preservation and enhancement of the natural environment is another key principle practised by the club, amongst other things regular, organised clearances of



Dear Sir, In your Letters (May Issue), Mrs Margaret Carney asked about John Bainbridge.

When I was in Swaledale, teaching at Low Row and preaching in the Reeth Circuit, I lived alone in Low Row and became very friendly with Miss Jane Hannah Cleminson (Peggy). I spent most Saturdays at her home in Reeth and met many people, as her home was always open to everybody. John Bainbridge was a frequent visitor. He was the eldest of the Bainbridge family and lived at Marrick Abbey Farm. He had several brothers and one sister and his parents who ran the farm, they all worked very hard there.

John was unable to walk except with crutches, but he was quite amazing on his crutches and never allowed his condition to stop him getting about. He and his horse were well known. I know he repaired shoes, so it is possible that he used his pony for deliveries. He was a very kind person and greatly interested in beautiful things, especially nature. John was quite an authority on the lovely countryside around and found his knowledge most useful. On the moonlight night when I had to cross the river by boat to preach at Marrick Chapel because it was too frosty to go by car, I remember walking from Marrick Abbey Farm with one of Johns brothers to the Chapel. The path had woodland on one side and I think it was a narrow paved path with a wall on the other side. It was very steep and slippery and seemed a long way. After the service John brought me back to the farm and at one point invited me to look over the wall at the scene.

In the valley down below the trees were all silver and the whole place was bathed in a blue glow from the brilliant moonlight. I have never experienced anything so ethereal in my life. My feet were sliding on the path and I was scared of falling, but John on his crutches seemed quite safe. I shall always thank John for allowing me to see this unusual vision of lovely Swaledale. I do not remember John as a preacher, as it would be after the time I spent in the dale (1937 - 1939).

I found Everill Squire's account of the Cleminson family very interesting. The things she related are just as I remember Peggy. We were great friends and I loved her very much and felt as if I really belonged to her family. It is obvious that the writer knew "Peggy" very well. Thinking about her unusual Christian name, I wonder if she was Everill Spence - if so, I met her when she was a little girl. Her mother was a widow with several children and they were members of the Congregational Church at Reeth. They were a lovely family and I visited them with Peggy quite often.

Thank you for the Reeth Gazette. It is helping me to Spring-clean my memory and recall many of the people I met so long ago. It is quite a good new hobby for anyone 80+!

A Summary of the Chairman's End of Year Report

At the end of the last financial year we showed a small overall profit, despite carrying out an extensive refurbishment programme.

We are grateful to the following for generous grant aid: *The Jack Brunton Trust* £2,000.00; Richmondshire District Council £1,215.00; North Yorkshire County Council's *Small Project Fund* £700.67 and Reeth Literary Trust, £150.00.

At the request of the Parish Council the Management Committee appointed a subgroup, the Reeth District Memorial Hall Millennium Committee, to co-ordinate village events to celebrate the Millennium. After a break of 49 years the Bartle Fair was revived to mark the Millennium. This included a demonstration of fire-fighting and use of car cutting equipment by the local fire service, a barbecue and firework display; a children's party hosted by staff from Marrick Priory; a united Songs of Praise service with Reeth Brass Band; a concert by the Bedale Band; a Swaledale Now & Then Exhibition featuring a photographic display of both the 1951 and the 2000 Bartle Fair; Reeth's first Farmers' Market with local arts and crafts; a car boot sale: Reeth Sports and a Ladies vs Gentleman's cricketmatch. The Boundary Walk later in the year also proved to be a success. I ended up wearing my running gear, thermal tights, my tack suit bottoms, a thermal top, a sweatshirt, and finally Ken's leather jacket, and gloves, and still I shivered. We tried to shelter from the wind and at about 8:15am I started doing some stretching exercises to loosen up, then started my regular warm-up at which point the leather jacket had to come off, unfortunately. Slowly the morning warmed up and so did I, and at 8:50 I left Ken (with all my surplus clothing!) and made my way to the starting pens. At this stage it was a cattle market; 32,00 of us huddled together. At 9:15 the gun went off and the race began, although I moved not an inch! In all, it took me 9 minutes to get to the starting line, and a further 12 minutes to shuffle the first mile (against my interided starting pace of 8 minute miles). Then the field began to thin out and my race really began. Everything came right for me together. The wind dropped and the sun came out and the temperature for the rest of the race was just as I like it best. Once my initial nervousness wore off, my running clicked into gear and was as smooth as it has ever been. During all the months of training I often cursed the hills of Swaledale for all the hard work they gave me in running up them, but on the day all the training paid off and I was able to run almost on automatic pilot, smoothly and sweetly, whilst I enjoyed the atmosphere. The crowds of spectators were magnificent - according to the BBC there were over half a million of them, and every one was shouting and cheering their

encouragement, not forgetting all the bands along the way. I even found myself singing along with them as I ran, and the miles seemed to fly by. Everyone talks about "the wall" in marathon running, but if it exists (and I'm sure it does!) I never met it that day. Whether I was just lucky or whether it was all the Swaledale hills, the running seemed almost effortless to me. By chance I got in with a girl from Harrogate half way round and we ran the rest of the race together. At about 18 miles, she started to flag a bit and I was able to chat to her and lift her up, so she could keep going. At 23 miles, when I started to feel tired for the first time, she returned the compliment and we ran around Westminster and up The Mall to cross the finishing line together.

And so it was over and I'd done it. It took me 4 hours and 20 minutes on the official clock, 4 hours and 11 minutes on my watch from the starting line. I collected my medal and tee shirt, then made my way to the family area to try and find Ken. Because of all the crowds, that was probably the hardest I had to work all day!! I had virtually no after-effects at all. My legs were tired. but no stiffness or strains, and I was even able to go for a jog in Kensington Palace Gardens the next day. I'm really fortunate that the only evidence that I'd run a marathon was a slightly blackened toenail, my battle scar.






