

The Editor stated last month that he hadn't received any support for the sentiments expressed in this column in the May issue. Swaledale Birds has received many messages of support along with one anonymous e-mail strongly disagreeing. All have been passed on to the writer. And as for the Editors puerile comment in reply to a letter that he sees grey partridge on the moor regularly, thus implying that they are 'about', I would just like to point out that in the last 30 or so years their population has crashed by about 80%. The only places where they are doing well is on estates where they are shot, as they are carefully nurtured when young.





Have you ever caught yourself complaining that we live 25 miles from the nearest hospital? Or that the surgery isn't open on a Tuesday afternoon? 
