

This is the season of Harvest, when we think particularly of our blessings and hopefully of how we can help those more needy than ourselves. I have been to a few Harvest Festival Services this year (about six), all of them different and all of them very enjoyable. But what has struck me more than anything is the fact that everyone celebrated what we had to be thankful for but also did show areat concern for others not so well off as ourselves. Fairtrade and Tearcraft (organisations that exist to provide fairness in trade for those in under developed countries, so that their farmers are not exploited) have been mentioned many times. But now we are starting to think quite rightly about Fair Trade here at home as well. Our own farmers are being exploited by big companies, and there is real danger that many of them could go out of business. Do we do enough to support? Do we make a concentrated effort to buy British goods and so support our own producers? 

What has happened to the Keld Centre?

That is what some of you may have been wondering. It was foot-and-mouth disease which initially caused the Centre to close temporarily. For the past two years it has been "moth-balled", but there are now plans to re-open it. The Keld Centre is part of the premises belonging to Keld United Reformed Church and consists of the former Manse, School and Institute. The Northern Synod of the U.R.C. recently agreed to plans for an up-graded, downsized, multi-use Centre.

Redevelopment will be done in stages. The first building to re-open, hopefully by next Easter, will be the Manse. At busy times of the year it is planned to house a student minister or a retired minister there to be a visible Christian presence to the many people who visit Keld. The Manse will also be available at certain times to ministers who are in special need of time and space away from their duties. For the rest of the year the Manse will be let as a holiday cottage with the intention that the income from this will help towards financing the other two buildings.

The School and the Institute will, at a later stage, be redeveloped as separate units to be used by a variety of smaller groups from the community and further afield, but with the possibility of both buildings being used together by larger groups. The aim is to be as flexible as possible and as wide-embracing as possible. 

Alderson Family History Meeting Muker Public Hall saw, once again, gathering of members and guests who all have an interest in the Alderson Family. This annual event, always held on the first Saturday in September after the Muker Show, attracts members from all over the world. This year we had visitors from South Africa and Canada. The day started with a general welcome and members could then examine the various records and books on display along with computers containing thousands of Alderson records. The AGM was held at midday followed by an excellent lunch supplied by Swaledale Caterers. Next, a talk was given by Alan Mills entitled "A window into the poor of Swaledale in the 19th Century". This was a fascinating presentation describing the rise and fall of the workhouse and the lot of the poor inhabitants. In the evening 35 members and quests joined together for a meal at the Kearton Country Hotel, which was of the usual high standard. The next day, the group assembled in Reeth and were entertained with a description of how Reeth developed around the Green along with a visit to the former workhouse. The guides were again Alan Mills along with Helen Bainbridge. The morning ended with a visit to the Swaledale Museum where Helen had laid out special articles of Alderson interest. Finally the weekend finished with a lunch at the Bridge Inn, Grinton. Godfrey Alderson Chairman AFHS

Hidden History of the Dales Exhibition Having toured venues in North and West Yorkshire, gathering information along the way, this exhibition is returning to the Dales Countryside Museum in Hawes. It will feature archive material, never seen

before, that describes the involvement of the Dales and Yorkshire in the British trade in enslaved Africans: that shows how many Yorkshire people in various capacities were employed in the trade and in the plantation economies which it supported; highlights how financially the benefited enormously from it; that many Yorkshire abolitionists other Wilberforce tried to end it and, perhaps most surprising, that from the 17th century onwards a number of Africans settled in the Dales and Yorkshire because Exhibitions about British Black History are rare and in North Yorkshire, rarer still, so it is an excellent opportunity to discover the links between people and places in the Dales, the Caribbean and Carnival costume from Africa Huddersfield and Leeds Carnival will also add a vibrant, colourful and telling element to the exhibition. The 30 day steam train operation in August proved a great attraction to visitors and was a success in all respects. 
Brenda was invited to cut the ribbon and open the Exhibition which houses wonderful pictorial wall boards recounting the

Fair Trade for British Farmers

Introduction to Fairtrade Many of us are familiar with the Fairtrade mark, and try to buy some Fairtrade products in our shopping. Fairtrade The Foundation website explains the history and the thinking behind this movement: The first Fairtrade label was launched in 1988 in the Netherlands and applied only to coffee. It was a specific response to the collapse of the world coffee price, which fell for some years to far less than the cost of production, and led to much suffering for coffee farmers and their families. It started with coffee, and now we can buy bananas, chocolate, coffee, tea, clothing, and even nappies and toiletries from the developing word, all of which carry a fair trade mark, and guarantee a fair price to the end producer. Most of producers at the moment are farmers in the developing world, for whom fair trade has allowed them to have a better standard of living and to educate their children

Granted, the issues for farmers and their families in this country are different - they can eat, and they have a home to live in, and are generally able to send their children to be educated. Even so, earning a living in farming in the UK is ever harder, and many people are giving up on farming as a life and a business, and doing other things.

That is not as simple as it sounds; it can be a big decision and a huge weight to carry if you are, say, the fifth generation farmer and it is you that has to decide to give up the holding. No wonder that this sort of pressure, combined with endless

paperwork and government demands, means that framers have the highest rates of suicide and stress related diseases of any workers in the UK.

What has caused this problem? The price for lamb is less now than it was ten years ago, for a number of reasons, but largely because of imports from New Zealand. The costs of feeding, transporting and slaughtering animals have increased, often because of the paperwork and rules that have come in. In the past, the wool clip and sheepskins were more valuable than the meat but today many fleeces, particularly those of the traditional hill breeds, such as Swaledales, are worth less than the cost of shearing the sheep. Foot & mouth has had a long-term effect, and in the last three years, farm incomes have fallen by a third overall. It is a sobering thought that the number of UK dairy farmers has fallen from nearly 200,000 some 50 years ago to just over 12,000 now. The number of working Hill farms has halved in a decade. There are a number of responses to this

There are a number of responses to this problem 1. There is a growing awareness in this country that we need to take seriously the issue of Fair Trade for our own farmers. Country Living Magazine, together with the Farmers Guardian trade paper and the supermarket Waitrose have started a campaign for fair trade for British farmers. Liz Falkingham, Editor of Farmers Guardian, says this: If there is one plea I hear from the readers of Farmers Guardian more than any other, it is for the paper to "tell it like it is" about the desperate plight of some parts of the British farming industry. Unfortunately, publishing such things in Farmers

Guardian has little effect. As a trade I don't know who or how he has helped. newspaper, we are simply preaching to but some of you will have benefited from the converted, which is why the Fair Trade for British Farmers campaign is right support can be at just the right crucial. Working with others gives us the opportunity to speak directly consumers and members of the general public. For many years we have rightly been encouraged to purchase Fairtrade products from countries around the world and somehow. yet, are overlooking the injustice that occurring on our very own doorstep. If we want to protect the rural infrastructure, to have the security of our own home produced food supplies, and even to keep cows in the fields and sheep on the hills, it is time to look more closely at our shopping choices. This is not just about what we buy, but about where we buy it and whether there really has been a 'fair trade' for the British farmer who produced it. There is an Early Day Motion going through at the moment. askina members to support this campaign. There is lots of information about it in the churches; please do take what you can use, and display a car sticker if you can to mark your concern and support.

2. Farm Crisis Network explain in their leaflets, why fair trade begins at home." They are a Christian based organisation that offers practical help to farming people in any need at all. If you need them, do contact them, and if you are able to support them - they are a charity - then that information is also in their form. Many of you will know Bob Baker, our local rep. His work is confidential, so

his help, and will know how valuable the time. Do make use of him if you need to, and encourage others to contact him.

3. Fair Trade and Christian Faith

I am not just being political in this address. Much of the Fair Trade agenda comes out of Christian principles, and many of the early pioneers of the Fair trade movement were Christians, who wanted to see how living out their Christian faith could make a practical difference in the world. You will have heard of Traidcraft and Tearcraft, both Christian organisations that sell fairly traded food and other products from around the world. You may have heard of a small chain of supermarkets, called Out of this World, these started in 1995, and were set up by a group of Christians from the Traidcraft organisation, and aimed to provide an alternative, fair traded option to the supermarkets. They now have shops in Newcastle, Nottingham, Leeds and York, and are looking to grow. The issues I have raised today connect with a number of areas of our Christian life and thinking: Fair trade is about how we steward God's Creation All that we have belongs to God, and we hold it in trust. God gives us the responsibility of how we use the land, and how we look after it for the next generation. This is where Fairtrade crosses over into the area of caring for the environment, and in food production the two are very linked.

Fair trade is about how we use our relationship with God. money as an expression of our Christian faith

How we use money - God's money, which we have in trust - is an indicator of what we think is important. Our personal and Christian priorities shout out from our bank statements. The choices we make about shopping, about giving money to Christian and other causes, and about using our money in the service of God, has an impact on the lives of others, at home and abroad.

Fair trade is about how we live in relationship with our fellow humans.

Dewi Hughes, a Christian writer on this subject asks how we apply the command to love our neighbour to our everyday life choices, like shopping.

He says this, "What we do when we shop is engage in trade. It is impossible to buy anything without impacting the lives of other people. Since Jesus asks us as Christians to love our neighbour as ourselves, and our neighbour is any other human being with whom we come into contact, the demand to love must prevail when we shop."

Just let me give you an example - do you ask where the money goes that you spend on clothes? Do you know if they were made in the UK or in a sweatshop abroad, by children who were doing that instead of going to school? Does that even cross your mind when you are spending money? Do you know where your food has come from? These are some questions to ask as you shop next week

Fair trade is about how we live in

All that I have said comes out of a Christian understanding of the world. Fair trade and the other issues that we have touched on are not just a good idea, or about being nice to other people. Respect for the land and for people comes out of a loving and gracious relationship with God who created all things.

God created the world and called it good. He made his creation as a place where human beings could flourish, and he gave them the responsibility to tend and care for his world. When we understand this, and that God calls us to share in this as part of our relationship with him, through Jesus Christ, then we can think about living in a different way, because we see the world as God's, and not ours to use. In that understanding, the land and its produce is a gift, and the way we treat it other people reflects understanding of how God treats us. God in Christ calls us to new life and to be bringers of hope and life to others as we remember his goodness and celebrate this Harvest Festival


