

SWALEDALE - THE MOST DANGEROUS DALE

There appeared in the November edition of The Dalesman magazine an article entitled 'The Ale Trail' which told of a book written by Alfred J Brown entitled 'Striding Through Yorkshire'. The article, which you may well have read, told of the authors love of wandering the Dales and Moors, taking in the many views and what seemed comparable sampling а number of the local ales and hostelries whenever the desire or opportunity arose. An interesting article that led me to wondering whether or not I could get hold of a copy of the original book. Two days later through the combined efforts of the internet and the Royal Mail a package arrived courtesy of Amazon. Published in 1938 and reprinted in 1943 the board and cloth bound edition I obtained was given with Love and Best Wishes by 'Mary &

Frnest' to lady called Marjorie, Christmas 1944. The pages as you would expect had browned with age but the words were still as clear as the day they had been printed and it is some of those words which prompted this short article. It doesn't take A J Brown long to mention Swaledale, just 21 pages in fact, and turning to page 23, he describes Swaledale as 'the most dangerous' of the all dales. Dangerous? | think he may be right, but read on and see what you think. 'Of all the Yorkshire dales. Swaledale is, I think. the most dangerous - in the sense that once a man has really discovered it, he will not easily escape its thrall. Other dales may be prettier and gentler (Nidderdale and Yoredale for example), but there is something about Swaledale that sweeps a man off his feet and pulls at his heartstrings when the rest are forgotten'

Arkengarthdale C.E. School

We are already half way through the term and we cannot believe the work we have covered already. We have moved towards a 'creative curriculum' with a themed approach to our work. Key Stage 2's theme is 'Sugar and Spice and All Things Nice." This encompassed a lot of work on the Tudors and the influence of their exploration and trade. Within this we needed to know some background knowledge about the Tudor era. Here are some of the things we have been doing; making Tudor roses, compiling a Tudor portrait gallery, writing character studies of Henry V111, reading Tudor historical fiction, Tudor handwriting with dip pens, constructing Tudor houses to make a Tudor street, making Mercator maps and yet to come Tudor embroidery, Tudor pomanders, Tudor ships and log books, Tudor explorers, The Mary Rose, re-enacting the battle of the Spanish Armada and finally performing a Tudor musical composition as a class. As you can tell we are just about 'Tudored' out thoroughly enjoying it. To complement all this work Mrs Smith took KS2 to Knaresbrough Castle to study and play Tudor instruments and participate in some Tudor dancing. Key Stage 1 children have been equally busy living in a 'A Topsy Turvy World'. They had great fun in their cave studying night and day, light and dark and nocturnal animals. opposites thev have investigated included push and pull, happy and sad, past and present, straight and wavy, thick and thin, high and low and soft and hard and wet and dry. Talking about wet and dry we had a wet, messy, muddy, fun afternoon completing our Jump Rope for Heart, Yr 6 set up 5 stations on our cross country circuit eq skip in BIG wellies and skip with a ball, between your legs. We raised £283. Cross country has finished now and we had a lovely assembly with quests for the presentation of certificates. Every

runner had improved their time over the 6 week period. What a fantastic achievement. We were very surprised with our own harvest this year. We planted carrots, potatoes and lettuce and had a mouth watering addition to our lunch of mashed potatoes with chives. grated carrot and parsley and mixed lettuce. We have a very active and enthusiastic School Committee this year and they have organized a lunch time club for yrs 1/2 children called Club Club. So far they have made bookmarks. smoothies, done some drama and made puppets. What a super idea. The same yr 6 children have been the first to participate in our cookery club. This has developed as a result of our children questionnaire and we are very grateful to Shirley Gale who has helped us prepare some dishes from round the world - American muffins, Italian pizza, Welsh leek and potato soup. The children were so frustrated waiting for our tiny cooker they took the bull by the horns and contacted Andrea at extended schools and have managed to get funding for another cooker and a cookery shopping trip to Tesco. We have adopted a dolphin called Rainbow and by doing so are helping to protect whales and dolphins around the world. This came about as the children were so moved by the Ocean World story which was performed Richmond School, Busy we have been but even busier times are ahead with the run up to Christmas. Our Christmas play - 'Magic Mayhem at Arkengarthdale' will be performed on Friday 12th and Monday 15th December in school at 6:00pm. Tickets priced at £1:00 are available from school (01748 884335). .MUKER PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON

The Parish Council Meeting was held on Tuesday 18th November 2008. Councillors Whitehead, Reynoldson, Metcalfe, Calvert and Porter were present with Councillor Whitehead presiding. Also present was SPCO Taylor-Page and Mrs. J. Pealing, the Clerk. Councillor Raymond Alderson sent his apologies. There were no declarations interest. The clerk stated that Councillor Blackie had not vet come back to the Council with regard to correspondence between RDC and the Parish Council concerning refuse collections within Muker Parish. Information received from RDC regarding code of conduct training, parish precept information, scrutiny review into out of hours service and upper dales feasibility study launch were all tabled at the meeting. Discussions were held and various documents were taken by the Councillors for further reading. regard to Alternate Weekly Refuse and Kerbside Recycling Schemes - a discussion ensued and, whilst the council were in general agreement that the scheme is working to a degree and that they would continue to support it; there are still several outstanding queries that RDC have not yet addressed. The council feels that the refuse collection vehicle should travel up every adopted highway as it has done in the past. It has also been noted by members of the council that bins are now littering land which does not necessarily belong to the owners of the bins. It was stated that if the general public are paying Council Tax then they should be entitled to a full refuse service and the rubbish should be collected from curtilages, this

appears to be a "cut in service". RDC have still not answered why collection vehicles travel into housing estates on non adopted highways and will not travel on certain adopted highways in the countryside. It was stated that there is concern for the elderly in the parish in having to move their rubbish unassisted. The legality of placing bins on common land was questioned again. All of the above concerns have been raised with RDC, but the Parish Council has not yet received an adequate response.

Planning permission has been refused for re-occupation of former dwelling at west Calverts Farm. Gunnerside. 5D925980. The council was disappointed that planning permission had not been given as the house had been once lived in and is situated next to other dwellings. There is concern for the upkeep of the area as Gunnerside Estates provide employment within the area. The Clerk was instructed to fill out the generic documents from the model scheme in the guide for the Freedom of Information Act in preparation January when it will come into force. The next Parish Council Meeting will be held at 7.30 pm in Muker Institute on Tuesday 6th January, 2009.

Community Bus Weekend Away


Last month, though famous for his 'Mystery Tours', Ray Wright guided a Community bus load of elderly (some even geriatric!) ladies on a thoroughly planned weekend to Liverpool. With high spirits we left the Dale on Friday evening. In spite of snarled-up traffic on the M6, road works and one-way streets, Ray patiently found our hotel on the edge of Liverpool. It being Halloween we had a good dinner served by grotesquely disquised staff in a restaurant bedecked in cobwebs, flying witches and bats. It gave us a great introduction to Liverpudlians, as families celebrated in a relaxed and cheerful mood. Children dashed about covered in face paint, and friendly people who, during the whole weekend, gave us a comfortable feeling of being welcome to their city. So we embarked on a packed two days in the European City of Culture. We parked near the Albert dock in fresh but sunny weather. We explored the renovated warehouses, visiting the Tate, and Maritime galleries, the amazing exhibition on the Slave Trade and its ultimate abolition (though some would acknowledge that it still exists in the western world). We rested and fed at little cafes and took a hilarious sight-seeing tour on an ex World War Two landing craft. Some enterprising body has refurbished a number of these vehicles, painted them yellow and is taking organised trips around the city, an excellent way of establishing the various sites for our trip. The tour finished when the craft plunged into the docks giving one a view of the city landscape from the water, while scattering swans and being viewed by alarmed sight seers.

After some difficulty our patient tour leader, who was putting up with seven back-seat drivers, found a parking spot on a double yellow line near the Catholic Cathedral. Here we had been promised by one of our group, a good lunch in a café nearby. Alas it was closed. Black mark Sylvia! However the Everyman Theatre provided excellent food in its basement, apparently a very popular venue.

Thus strengthened we climbed the steps to the

Cathedral. An amazing building, as everyone knows. Beautiful and vast stain glass windows throwing shafts of brilliant coloured light across the interior. One disappointment was the acoustic quality in this circular building. An Italian choir were performing on our arrival, but all one could hear was a mish-mash of echoing sound which gave no justice to the singers. In the crypt was a wonderful exhibition of the work and life of Le Corbusier, both his architectural achievements and his paintings displayed in the extensive brick caverns. Then we visited the Anglican Cathedral, more conventional in style, though equally huge. On Sunday morning we returned for more culture around the docks and then to the Walker Art gallery, where the extraordinary picture of the city by the artist Ben Johnson, was on show with equally enormous paintings of Hong Kong and Jerusalem. A visit to St Georges Hall, a quick cuppa, and then Ray drove us out to see the Gormley figures on the beach at Crosby . A hundred cast iron figures stand on the sands and in the waves, looking out to sea as it receded from high tide. Such an interesting and spectacular sight against the red sunset, with wind farms gently turning on the horizon and the mountains of Wales beyond. In general we behaved well, no one was lost. One member of the party, who shall be nameless, fantasised a bit, expressing the wish to be embraced by a famous footballer! There was a fair amount of female chatter. And so Ray brought us safely back to a rainy Reeth. What a man to survive this witches' coven! Jocelyn Campbell







SWALEDALE GARDEN CLUB

It was a rainy, cold November afternoon when Ray Hodgson took the members to the tropical Caribbean and the island of Grand Cayman. She explained how this hurricane lashed island only 22

miles long by 4 miles wide was succeeding in conserving the local flora and fauna for future generations. Grand Cayman was first visited by Columbus where turtles, crocodiles and mosquitoes abounded. The scrub covered island was discovered by pirates and used as a lonely hiding place. Later the island was inhabited by over 900 people of whom 500 were slaves. Now the population is 50,000 consisting of a mixture of Caymanians and other nationalities. These people have learnt to live with winds of over 100 mph whipping up huge waves which flood over the low flying island and destroying buildings and plant life. Ray took us to see the Botanic Park which was established to conserve the native flora and fauna. It was opened in 1994 by Queen Elizabeth. We saw the lush vegetation of palms, ferns and flowers which can grow there and the large 2 foot long blue iguanas which instead of their normal plant diet will stroll along the paths and steal your sandwiches if you are not careful. Then we went on to visit Turtle Farm where you can swim in the lagoon pools with multicoloured fish and handle the beautifully marked turtles. When Drake arrived n 1586 there were so many turtles piled up in the shallow water that

they looked like rocks on the shore. But the turtles were very nearly wiped out by people who caught and ate them. Now, thanks to a successful breeding programme which has been instigated just in time, they are back on the increase.

Among other places we visited was a private garden hedged by colourful red Acolypah and Croton Bushes. Here we saw Bromeliad Plants, Lobster Claw Flowers, Bird of Paradise Plants which grow almost like weeds and the huge Poiniana Tree covered in brilliant red blossom. As well as seeing the typical coloured houses with a shady verandahs, we saw the oldest building built in 1780, which has survived the hurricanes due to its thick walls and sturdy roof. The turquoise sea is never far away, tempting all to play in the shallow water or cool off with a swim in the lagoon or take a lazy walk along the firm sand of Seven Mile Bay. For those of us who prefer to 'rest' we can lie in the shade of the great palm trees and look up at the fronds of leaves gently waving above our head.

At the end of the talk we were brought back to reality by the Chairman who thanked Ray for bringing the Cayman Island to Reeth in a very professional presentation. He reminded everyone that the next meeting on December 8th would be a social afternoon with a light hearted quiz and afternoon tea contributed by the members. This meeting will conclude with a bran tub, where everyone will produce a gift costing less than £2 and 'Father Christmas' will present the tub for us all to dig into. Anyone who would like to join us in this jollifaction will be most welcome.

Look After Our Garden Birds

With winter drawing in and temperatures across the country plummeting, life is once again about to get tough for the UK's wild bird population. Freezina conditions. combined with a lack of food, mean that their survival skills will be seriously tested. A bird can use around 10% of its body weight keeping warm during a cold night in winter, and a prolonged cold spell can easily prove fatal if reserves aren't sufficiently replenished during the day. This is why it is so important to provide the wild birds in your garden with a plentiful supply of high energy food during the cold winter months of October to March - it can be the difference between life and death during this part of the year. Step one is to introduce a bird feeder and/or bird table to your garden, making sure it is high off the ground and in a place where the birds will feel safe and undisturbed (avoid positioning them near to fences, walls or hedges, where cats can reach them). Make sure that the feeders are full for the birds' early morning feed and again for their pre-dusk feed. It is important to keep the feeders clean and free from droppings or mouldy food, as this can lead to infection. A useful tip is to make sure you drop some food on the ground, as some birds prefer to not to dine at feeders or tables. Finally, don't forget to provide them with a fresh supply of water every day. In addition to feeding, you can also put up nest boxes to provide roosting sites for breeding birds. Nest boxes can be fixed to walls, trees or building - again, choose somewhere high above ground level, as this will allow for easy flight access whilst also being out of the reach of produced and sold to the public.

prowling felines. All this nourishment and shelter will attract all manner of species of bird to your garden, including house sparrows, starlings, blackbirds, robins and tits, thrushes, and chaffinches. To return the favour the birds will eat many garden slugs, snails, such as wireworms, caterpillars and insects. They're also fascinating to watch and their daily antics will soon have you hooked.

History of Christmas Cards People around the world send Christmas

Cards to their friends and family. Traditionally, Christmas cards showed religious pictures of Mary, Joseph and baby Jesus, or other parts of the Christmas story. Today, pictures are often winter pictures, Father Christmas, or jokes. In England, we have cards which are traditional e.g. pictures of the nativity scene; formal e.g. a painted picture of a winter scene or Christmas Tree; cute e.g. a snow scene with cute little animals or Rudolf throwing throwing funny e.a. snowballs at Father Christmas., The first Christmas card was created and sent in 1843. A man named John Calcott Horsely printed the first Christmas card for Sir Henry Cole, the friend who had given him the idea. Sir Henry Cole, a wealthy British businessman, wanted a card he could proudly send to friends and professional acquaintances to wish them a "Merry Christmas." The card depicted a typical English family enjoying the holiday, and people performing acts of charity. An important part of Victorian Christmas spirit. A thousand copies of the card were printed and sold for one shilling. This is reportedly the first Christmas card to be







THE CHRISTMAS TREE

In 680 AD the Saxon Boniface was born in Crediton, Devon. Boniface grew up to popular Queen and the fashion took off. become a monk, missionary and finally a martyr but before fulfilling his final born. destiny Boniface travelled to Germany to spread the word o f Whilst in Germany, legend tells that Boniface used the triangular shape of the fir tree to demonstrate the holy trinity the Father, Son and Holy Spirit to the German people but first he had to overcome the local people's superstition. Until then the people had revered the oak. One story tells of how Boniface felled Thor's sacred Oak at Geismar, in front of hostile tribesmen by his own hand and it was here that he laid the foundation of a new church. The church grew to flourish and soon the local people began to worship the fir tree as God's own tree.

Jump forward 500 years or so to the twelfth century and records show the fir tree was now becoming more commonly used in worship. All across Central Europe people were hanging fir trees upside down as a symbol of Christianity at Christmas time but it was another few centuries before the first decorated tree was recorded at Riga in Latvia, in 1510.

The Christmas Tree in Enaland It was the Georgian Kings from Germany and German merchants who first brought the Christmas tree to England. However, the British people of the time were not overly keen on the German monarchy so the fashion never reached the common people. It was not until 1846 that the Christmas Tree took root in the nation's conscience. Queen Victoria and her German Prince, Albert, appeared in the Illustrated
