

On the morning of 27th December at approximately 5.45 am we discovered a chimney fire at our home in Fremington. Not knowing what to do and being concerned not to over-react, I called Fire service HQ at Northallerton for advice. I was informed that the fire engine would be with us in less than 10 minutes. It was, manned entirely by part-timers all of whom live/work in Swaledale. They were efficient, courteous and helpful explaining every step of the way. They were at pains not to make a mess, even taking their shoes off at the door! The fire was put out, the loft checked and they did not leave until satisfied that all was safe. My husband and I do not know how to thank them other than through your pages. We have lots of unsung heroes (and heroines) in the Dales who give extra time to helping others, the mountain rescue team springs to mind. Some are volunteers, some part timers but they all deserve our thanks and support. I hope you will be able to print this as our thanks to the Reeth and District Fire Service. Ann Pope Having lived in Darlington all my life we take health care for granted in that the doctors, walk in health centres and hospitals are only 10 minutes away. I often talked with my wife Pam about what kind of service we would have if we lived in Swaledale as we have always loved the area having spent my childhood in Langthwaite. Little did I realise that on the 4^{th} December following a heart attack I would find out. My attack came without any warning and I

have my wife to thank for calling the emergency services the first to arrive was Dr Bond and two members of his staff and undoubtedly their swift arrival and professionalism played a large part in my subsequent survival. Also quick to respond was a Paramedic followed by a ambulance from Northallerton and for over two hours they all played an important part in stabilising my condition including making the decision to call for the Cumbrian air ambulance to fly me to James Cook Hospital Middlesbrough. After the procedure to insert stents in an artery I was visited by a Dr Wright and my first words were to thank him for saving my life to which he replied that the people I should thank are Dr Bond and all the professional caring people who assisted him that morning, I am well on the road to full recovery and will always be grateful to all concerned including the nursing staff at James Cook and the Rehabilitation nurses under Barbara Conway at Darlington. Every aspect of my care has been carried out by dedicated professional caring people and this year our nominated charity on the caravan park will be for the air ambulance. We will soon be back in wonderful Reeth where we have found the people very friendly and I would like to say thank you to all those who have been so kind since our arrival in April 2007 in particular Kirn. Richard all the staff and customers in the Black Bull see you all soon.







Living with a Listed Building

Owners of traditional buildings Yorkshire Dales National Park will have a chance to get maintenance tips and information from the experts at a special, free seminar being staged in March. The day, being organised by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA), covers a range of subjects and is intended to give owners a deeper knowledge of how to look after traditional Topics will include: damp; timber buildings. decay; the way individual buildings develop over time; employing an architect and running a building contract; sharing a house with bats and wild birds and thethe importance of lime. Don McLellan, the YDNPA's Assistant Building Conservation Officer. said: "Traditional buildings are different because they were not built using modern principles and they do not work in the conventional way. "Although most of them have functioned perfectly well for several hundred years, we do need to think about maintenance in a different way and the seminar will offer owners the opportunity to learn more about the way traditional houses were built and about how they should be managed. "At the YDNPA we are regularly in contact with owners of historic buildings, particularly those that are listed. recognise the need to offer more information about the potential impacts that building work could have on the structure and appearance of their homes." The event on 8 March - called Living with a Listed Building - will be held in the Octagon Room at Grassington Town Hall. 

TELEPHONE: TONY 01969 640678 Cash for new idea More groups and organisations in and around the Yorkshire Dales National Park will be able to get financial help to launch projects thanks to a Government pot of cash, Rural Affairs Minister Jonathan Shaw has announced that f.200 000 Sustainable a Development Fund (SDF), which is grant-aided by the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs through the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA), has been given the go ahead for each of the next three years. The fund is managed on the Authority's behalf by the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust (YDMT). Organisations individuals and businesses in and around the National Park are being given the chance to apply for cash grants for projects this vear. The SDF - now in its sixth year of operation - aims to support new business ideas. community schemes or environmental projects that demonstrate new ways of living and working in the Dales and that benefit the National Park and its communities. To date nearly £1million has been awarded to 96 projects, large and small. In turn the funding has attracted about £2.5 million of match funding to the area from a wide range of statutory, voluntary and charitable funding sources. Moya Turrell, the Authority's Sustainable Development Officer, said: "This is another chance for local businesses, groups and individuals to turn an innovative good idea into a reality. "We are especially interested in projects that test new ideas and promote best practice and that involve young people or encourage links between people from different backgrounds. "We will also consider schemes from outside the National Park as long as they show a clear benefit to the area. The SDF can also support projects and ideas that struggle to find funding elsewhere. like staff costs and equipment." Isobel Hall, the YDMT's SDF Manager, said: "We welcome the fact that the money has been allocated for a three-year period instead of 12 months at a time. It means that we have peace of mind for that period, knowing there will be cash available to help new projects to get off the ground." Among the

projects that the SDF part funded is a threevear scheme to assess brown trout stocks throughout the tributaries of the upper sections of the River Ure where populations seem to have been severely reduced over the last few decades. The Yorkshire Dales Rivers Trust and Durham University project involves computer modelling of land use to assess areas of risk that may be delivering pollutants to the river, modelling of altered water flows and direct water quality measurements. Another project called www.GreenBeams.com - aims to supply locally-sourced hardwood timber beams and for restoration/renovation work buildings of architectural importance/listed buildings. The www.greenbeams.com brokering service connects buvers with promoting and generating the use of local sustainable timber alternatives to steel and concrete Set up by Structural and Civil Consultants Ltd of Northallerton, the project aims to foster the development of a new rural industry by adding value to local hardwood timber that has not previously been able to reach the construction market. It is the intention for GreenBeams.com to become an nonprofit making company that would reinvest any profits into fighting global warming. Other SDFprojects climate funded include workshops held at the YDNPA-owned Dales Countryside Museum in Hawes for about 80 youngsters from primary schools in Upper Wensleydale. The events helped to raise their awareness of climate change and to inspire them to take part and introduce energy-saving activities in their home and school. And the SDF has helped 69 local businesses in the National Park to get advice on how to reduce their environmental impact. Laura Backhouse. the Environmental Co-ordinator for the York and North Yorkshire Business Environment Forum. has helped businesses identify environmental issues including waste, energy, water pollution and legislation to reduce their environmental impact. THE PICTURE HOUSE, LEYBURN

Hands up all in favour! Who would like to see a community-owned and run enterprise in a local building with 173 comfortable seats. cosy and warm in winter, with a purpose built auditorium with proscenium arch stage, with disabled access to the fover and auditorium and two wheelchair bays, gallery space, a bright, modern café and wine bar in the basement with seating for 100 where you can meet with friends for a cozy chat or hold a private function or business event, and a varied entertainment programme changes every week. Getting us out of our houses. Bringing our community together. All within a few miles of every village in Reeth and District. And watch for details of the launch of a Loyalty Card for a free visit. Hands down. Yes, of course, I'm talking about the newly opened community Picture House in Leyburn, previously the Elite Cinema run by Geoff and Jude Simpson. So what's the principal difference between the Elite and the Picture House? The Elite was a private business, the Picture House is strictly a community venture and a registered charity. In November 2007, after months of research and planning, Leyburn Arts Centre Ltd, trading as The Picture House, negotiated a long-term lease to keep the cinema going and extend the venue into the broader areas of visual and performing arts. The Picture House was able to secure the building lease thanks to several generous donations and loans. I'm one of six volunteer directors and along with literally dozens of local volunteers, together we plan, manage, staff and run the cinema, freely giving our time, as all charity workers do, but the overheads of running the Picture House are substantial. Our estimated overall costs in this first year are £34,026 rising to £44,971

therefore, for donations and sponsorship to supplement ticket revenue and help keep the cinema going. Cheques are payable to Leyburn Arts Centre Ltd and can be Gift Aided. You must pay an amount of income tax or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax the Picture House reclaims on your donations in the tax year (currently 28p for each £1 given). We must walk before we run. Once we're bedded down, we intend to host live performance events including theatre, poetry, dance and music. As part of our commitment to the community we'll offer space in the building at low rates to local groups and charities during the day. As well as serving our community, we'll provide another attraction for visitors. Throughout the year a steady flow of families, walkers and retired visitors stay in the campsites, holiday cottages and B&Bs. We're currently seeking funding for our web site. Our window to the Dales and beyond. Patrons and volunteers will leave messages for one another. We hope to take ticket bookings online, have profiles of volunteers (we have close on two hundred) and appeals for others to join them. A Warmest Thanks Board for donations and sponsors. The cinema will largely depend on ticket sales for income but we also need additional funding for a sign for the Picture House on the front of the building, essential in identifying the change. not-for-profit voluntary organisation, we need support and funding from local businesses and organisations, and local people across the Dale to ensure the project's ongoing survival. If you're organising a fund-raising event during this year would you consider donating Gift-Aid funds to The Picture House? Without community support, we all know what will happen... 




