

could be avoided by reducing speed and good use of side mirrors and the regular checking of your rear view mirror. At this time of year there are more cyclists on the roads, who would be well advised to wear bright clothing not only at night but during the day, it appears that cyclists have taken to favouring the colour black which makes it difficult for motorists to see them well in advance. Failing to wear a helmet is not advised, particularly as there are lots of sheep wandering on the roads and this could force a cyclist to stop suddenly or swerve and as a result be thrown off. Horses and riders should be passed by with caution and slowly as well as given a wide berth and motorists should continue for a fair distance afterwards as well, as the noise of a revving engine can scare the horses. With regard to vehicles I would like to remind you all to check your tax discs to ensure they are up to date, the D.V.L.A will be informed if any such offences are found to be committed With the addition of more vehicles on the roads we should all take our time particularly on familiar routes where it is very easy to become complacent, spending just a few moments longer to check roads and the traffic around us will help to avoid accidents and collisions to both vehicles and other people. Fire alert in Yorkshire Dales

Visitors to the Yorkshire Dales National Park over the Bank Holiday weekend are being asked to be particularly vigilant to reduce the risk of moorland and grassland fires. The warm, dry weather during May, coupled with low rainfall, means that. increasingly, conditions on the moors are becoming drier, according to Alan Hulme, Services Manager Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA). With the warm weather set to continue over the holiday weekend, the risk of a fire is becoming a concern. Fire risk warning notices are being put up around the National Park today (Friday) and, if the Met Office announces a rise in its Fire Severity Index for the Yorkshire Dales to 'Exceptional' - its highest rating - over the weekend, it will automatically trigger closure of Open Access land within the National Park, although all public footpaths and bridleways will remain fully open. Alan said: "What this would mean is that walkers would be asked to use only public rights of way and would not be able to roam wherever they want to in parts of the National Park identified on maps as being Open Access land." He said that, in these dry conditions, moorland fires could spread very quickly and could be devastating to the landscape and its wildlife, especially, at this time of year, to ground nesting birds.

"We obviously want people to come and enjoy the Yorkshire Dales over the Bank Holiday weekend, but we would urge them to do what they can to help us prevent a fire from breaking out," he said. "Visitors should avoid lighting fires on or near the

moorland and should not cigarettes, matches or glass bottles. "If they see a fire, they should report it quickly to the fire service so that they can take appropriate action." Jonathan Foster, station manager for North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service said: "It's extremely important that visitors to the countryside take special care to prevent fire. attend a number of serious fires on moorland every year, and most of these can be prevented. Moor fires are difficult to put out and can sometimes burn for "This is a huge drain on our resources and causes untold damage to the countryside." To help prevent visitors are reminded:

- Do not light any fires or barbecues on or near the moorland area.
- Put out smoking materials carefully and take all litter, especially glass containers, home with you.
- If you come across a fire dial 999 and inform the fire service immediately.

It's a Doc's Life A column with a medical slant

Recently people have been asking me a lot of questions, well actually it is the same question, "When are you leaving?" (from the expectant tone of their voices I think they are hoping I will say tomorrow ©).

When I took over the job here in 1988 I was appointed by the Health Authority and until recently, if I left, I would have had to hand the practice back to them to advertise for, and appoint, my successor. This would have given the villages and the patients little choice of who would be their doctor (though you didn't have much choice when they chose me did you?) When I have spoken to representatives of the health authority about their future plans for this surgery their reply, post-Shipman, was that they don't like single-handed practices, indeed would query the motives of any doctor wanting to practise alone and that they intended to make this a branch surgery of one of the larger, local surgeries. This flies in the face of all the evidence that shows that patients prefer smaller practices and the continuity of care that they provide. My view was that the people of Reeth and surrounding area deserved better than having just an anonymous face from another surgery turning up in the morning, leaving again in the evening and with no real commitment to the community.

A recent change in the GP contract has meant that single-handed GPs can now take on a partner with a view to eventual succession. Yet despite this I was worried

that the modern generation of young GP's would not want to take on the daunting task of putting down roots in an isolated rural practice, stay here for 20 years or so to pay off their mortgage; so I was not sure if I would ever find a successor to replace me here. As you know John Minns retired last year and we appointed Dr. Michael Brookes as Associate here. Mike was interested in taking over the practice, as he has been living in the dale for a while and having left the army he was looking to settle in a civilian practice. Realising that such an opportunity was unlikely ever to happen again Mike and I have gone in to partnership with a view to him becoming the GP here in October 2008. People have also asked me if I am retiring, I must look older than I am because at 55 I am a bit too young to draw my pension. I shall be looking for alternative employment after the end of September.

Oddly enough, at the end of September it will be exactly 21 years to the day since I first opened the surgery on the edge of the village green and waited nervously for someone to turn up. During that time I have come to know you all very well and you to know me. Being human and thus fallible I have made some mistakes but I have always tried my best and I have to say that some of you have presented me with some real challenges. I have had a wealth experience from practising here and I like to think that I am a much better GP now than when I arrived in 1988. I know that Mike Brookes is a caring, competent GP committed to the practice, I know he will do a good job as my successor and if you treat him as you have treated me then he will have a great time. Maybe someone can persuade him to write a column for the Gazette ③. I wish you all well.

MARRICK PARTSH COUNCIL REPORT Councillor Barrie Braithwaite was elected Chair and Councillor Mark Hodgson was elected Vice Chair at the Annual Meeting of the Council on 22 May 2008. Due to forthcoming retirement the position of Clerk/Responsible Financial Officer to the Council would be advertised. Mr David Trusson would continue as Internal Auditor. A review of the Audit Plan governing the internal audit procedures of the Council and the effectiveness of internal audit was carried out. It was agreed these adequately met the needs of the Council. Following a review, it was concluded the risks associated with the Parish Council's activities had been correctly evaluated and existing controls were adequate.

Internal Auditor Audit. The had examined the accounts on 25 April 2008. He confirmed they were correct. Copies of his report were given to Members of the Council. The End of Year Summary of Accounts was presented by the Responsible Financial Officer. The Annual Return was completed. Marrick had been chosen as part of a 5% spot check sample and additional information was to be provided to the External Auditor.

Possible difficulties with lane end collections were raised, particularly in adverse weather conditions. Nana Shirls, Heart and Soul of any party

Shirley Clarkson better known to her family as Nana Shirls, has died after a two year battle against cancer.

Born at Gunnerside she was one of four daughters of Norman and Nora Rutter, then living at The Nook, Gunnerside. Shirley first went to Gunnerside Primary School then after passing her Eleven Plus, moved onto Richmond High School for Girls, where she represented them in both Athletics and Hockey. The only time Shirley did not live in Swaledale was when she went to work in Barclays Bank in Darlington, staying for three years.

In 1972 she returned to Swaledale to be a full time Farmers Wife when she married Robert Clarkson who had just taken over the tenancy of Low Whita Farm, Low Row.

In 1974 Stephen their eldest son was born, followed two years later by their twins Louise and Stuart.

Shirley soon got the boys interested in football and sport, and from the age of six would take them all over Swaledale and Wensleydale to play junior football, it was at this time when she became a passionate supporter of Liverpool Football Club. When in her thirties, Shirley and the other local ladies formed Reeth Ladies Hockey team, which she enjoyed for many years, playing hockey once again.

Over the last eight years Shirley has spent a great amount of her time helping Louise to bring up her own two boys, Ben and James, something that gave her great pleasure and pride.

Shirley became ill in 2006 and was

diagnosed with Cancer in March 2007. After two major operations and twelve sessions of chemotherapy, she battled bravely but to no avail. Loosing her fight for life on 6th May.

All through her illness never once did Shirley complain or be full of self pity, telling her family they must get on with their lives and not to grieve once she had gone.

Shirley spent the last two and a half weeks of her life in the Friary Hospital, Richmond, where she was cared for with great sympathy and dedication. She died peacefully without pain with her close family close by her side.

Always organized, three weeks before Shirley died she made her own funeral arrangements which we carried out on the 10th May at Gunnerside Methodist Chapel, the place where she had previously been Christened, Married and taken her own Children to he Christened. Over 550 people representing three generations gathered to say farewell to Shirley a fitting testament to her popularity near and far.

Shirley chose to be carried on her final journey by Robert her husband, two Sons Stephen and Stuart, Philip Metcalfe (Son in Law), David Alderson (Nephew) and (Neighbour). Norman Sunter Main mourners following the coffin were Louise Metcalfe (Daughter), Julie-Ann Teasdale (niece). Norman Rutter (father), Wendy and Maurice Garbutt, Linda and Maurice Hall, Moira Game and Paul Errington, (Sisters and Brother-inlaws). Christine Clarkson (Daughter-in-

Law), Annette Clarkson (God Daughter). Christine and John Hird, Rebecca, Richard and James Keyes, Rachel & Jim Goldie and James Cardus (Nieces and Nephews - in-Law)

Muker Silver band was on hand to accompany the congregation and the Liverpool anthem (You'll Never Walk Alone) was played as Shirley left the Chapel.

Shirley had chosen four organisations to benefit from any donations collected, The Friary Hospital, Richmond, the Richmond Community District Nurses, the Macmillan Nurses and the Mowbray Suite at the Friarage Hospital, Northallerlon. A combined total of £2650 has been raised by donations and sponsorship money raised by Stuart her son, running the London Marathon.

Arkengarthdale has had for many years a friendly, convenient and efficient weekly waste collection system together with excellent and well used recycling centres in Langthwaite and Reeth. The refuse sacks were placed in logical positions near our properties and taken promptly on the collection day by a small wagon that was able to negotiate our sometimes difficult terrain. This rubbish was only conspicuous for a very short period of time, could be weighted down with a large stone so as not to blow away in our sometimes extremely windy environment It is now being replaced by a complex four container system, open to the vagaries of our climate, for roadside collection which in some instances is a haIf a mile away from the property.

It is about time the council had a flexible approach to waste collection and recycling and not trying to impose system that might work well in an urban environment to those of us in who live in

Occasionally I am thrilled to see a bird I had not known - - the Ring Ouzel up the end of Gunnerside with its characteristic song was one I heard for the first time a few years ago, but this year we did not have the energy to go far enough to find it. We are glad there are still Dippers on the Arkle, but we missed the landlord of the Red Lion when we went in for a drink and a snack. The way in which the history of the area has shaped the contours of the hills is quite fascinating and we are grateful to those who have written about the mines and the rushes You and the members of the Gazette Management Team work hard to keep publishing and we are grateful far all of your efforts. I would love to do a study of the names of the people of the Dale. They seem to tell their own tale. The couple we cottage from this year rented our indicates that they are local people, but I suppose your name must speak of an early wave of immigration into the Dale from across the sea. I am enclosing a list of the birds I identified this year. I missed some I had seen in earlier years, but that is probably because we did not walk so far. I E. Gregson looked up the Internet for the birds of

Swaledale and find that my records would probably not be accepted. In order to have an observation accepted, the observer has to be validated! I am sure of those that I saw and would be happy if you wished to publish it. I would also be interested to read of other observations that might be sent in by resident bird watchers. I was a wartime baby so I was brought up to be aware of the need to salvage paper and cardboard. My father had a compost heap so I have always believed that to be an essential part of the garden. When bottlebanks were introduced and then can banks, I was delighted and even more so when it became possible to recycle plastic bottles. What I find hard to comprehend is that some people just chuck everything into the bin and so I can't help feeling pleased that we are now being compelled to sort out our rubbish. If we use empty packaging to wrap the smelly stuff, it can be easily wait a fortnight to be collected and the bins will only be on show one day every 2 weeks. What's more, since we live in an area which is not yet smokeless, we can always burn our rubbish on the bonfire.

DOUBLE DELIGHT AT HATCH OF FALCONS

A pair of peregrine falcons is raising two chicks at the popular Malham Cove beauty spot in the Yorkshire Dales National Park. the RSPB and Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (LDNPAYDNPA) said today. The nesting falcons - dubbed the fastest animals on earth - have been crowd-pullers for the past few years as they play out their daily lives against the awesome backdrop of the Cove. Each year thousands of people come to Malham to watch the peregrines through powerful telescopes at a special peregrine watch viewpoint set up by the RSPB and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA). Visitors who are already enjoying watching the spectacular flying displays of the adult birds will now have double the delight as the chicks grow up eventually take their maiden flight. A new website created by the Authority and the RSPR www.yorkshiredales.org.uk/ peregrines is packed with stunning images, facts about the project and information about the peregrines and all the other birdlife likely to be seen in the Malham area. There is also an on-line peregrine blog that is updated every week with the latest feathered goings on. Ian Court, the YDNPA's species Species Officer, said: "We are delighted that there are two peregrine chicks in the nest on Malham Cove. Peregrine Watch is proving popular with visitors and there is lots of interest in the nesting peregrines." Matthew Capper of the RSPB added: "As they get older the youngsters will start venturing out of the nest and learning to fly so there will be plenty of opportunities for people to see them. It's a special treat to watch these

fantastic birds performing in such a spectacular and awe-inspiring setting." The Perearine Watch watch site will be manned from 10,30am until 4,30pm until 27 July and again from 23 to 31 August. The project is part of the RSPB's Aren't Birds Brilliant! programme of events, which make rare and spectacular birds accessible for everyone to see. As well as the peregrines, visitors to Malham can expect to see green woodpeckers, little owls, redstarts and cliff-nesting house martins. More information about the project is also available at www.rspb.org.uk/brilliant. The RSPB has launched a new campaign calling for an end to the illegal killing of birds of prey and asking members of the public to support their work to protect birds of prey. For more information click on www.rspb.org.uk/birdsofprey

PEREGRINE FALCON FACT FILE

The peregrine is the largest of British breeding falcon. It is 38-48 cm long, and its wingspan is 95-110 cm. The female is considerably larger than the male. The upper parts are dark blue-grey, and the under parts are pale with fine, dark bars. The head has a black 'hood' with black moustachelike markings on the face. Juvenile birds are browner and heavily streaked below. Peregrines typically pair for several years and may live up to 10 years old - the oldest on record was 15 years and 6 months old Both adult birds tend the young, which take their first flight after 5 or 6 weeks. Peregrines feed on medium sized birds, which they catch in high-speed aerial stoops - although more often than not they fail to make a kill. Peregrine numbers crashed in the 1960s due to the impact of pesticides. Peregrines have now

increased in numbers, to about 1,300 breeding pairs in the UK. In 2007, six pairs of peregrines nested successfully in the Yorkshire Dales National Park.






