Hello again! Thanks for reading.

Thank you also for the comments regarding the Gazette becoming a company limited by guarantee. It is good to know that so many of you are interested in the future security of the Gazette.

Do you ever feel sometimes that you are just aetting old? I do and I am sure many often feel the same. You just feel you can't be bothered or just feel indifferent to what is going on, or worse, you don't feel 'up to date' or with it and then something happens and you are confronted with a situation you just find unbelievable. When that happens I feel very irritable and sometimes even angry. There is a piece of music from a suite by Holst called the 'March of the Angry Young Men', but what I saw the other day made me so mad that 'Angry Old Men' would have been more appropriate. Anyway what was it that made me see 'red' as it were? Well, there were two things. The other day when I was coming home from the 'print room' after doing a job, I saw something that at first did not register even though it looked totally incongruous, until there at the bottom of Peat Gate I was confronted by the invasion force. At least that is what it looked like to me! Was it an invasion force from Outer Space - like the Day of the Triffids - no it was an invasion from RDC it had become the "Day of the Wheelie Bins". There they were, just delivered, a row of incredibly neat, clean, brand spanking new "Wheelie Bins" all set out like soldiers. I couldn't believe it, what a sight. The parish council AGM was followed by the annual parish meeting and the existing officers were re-elected to their posts. Highways The cattle grid on the moor road had been repaired and cleared of silt. Highways would inspect it again during the course of the summer. Neddy House

A letter had been sent in support of the owner of the property who had been Richmondshire by Council's Building Authority that the front wall of the property was unsafe and should However the National Park he rebuilt Planning Department were of the opinion that it should be restored rather than rebuilt as it was of national importance. County Coun John Blackie who was in attendance for part of the meeting asked the council to consider sending a further letter of support of the owner taking the advice of the Building Authority in order to make the property safe and restore the building to use. It was agreed to do so on the understanding that the rebuilding would use the original materials and no change would be made to the appearance of the front wall. Trees The chairman confirmed that he had given permission to NEDL to cut back tree branches which were interfering with overhead electricity cables, and that the work had been carried out. Planning Officer Details received of the new National Park Planning Officer and revised surgery times. officer will be available in Hudson House every Thursday from 2-4pm. Peoples' Services North Yorkshire County Council had requested input into their Plan for children's and young people's services. Councillors would comment

withdrawal of free school transport for sixth form pupils, which was out of step with the Plan's intention of encouraging every child to make the most of their educational potential. Accounts The parish council accounts were distributed and accepted. Clock Face An appeal was being organised for the restoration of the clock face on Grinton church and the parish council was invited to contribute. majority of the councillors present were not in favour of this, however Coun Blackie offered a contribution of £500 from his community fund. Drainage A blocked drain causing flooding on the road near Mudd House would be reported. Porter reported that the state of the road between Spring End and Crackpot was so bad that residents were organising a petition to draw attention to the problem. Coun Blackie asked for it to be copied to him when complete and offered to attend a site visit with the Highways Department when arranged. Winter Maintenance

Coun Blackie reported on the very well attended meeting earlier in the year to discuss proposed changes to the winter maintenance programme in the upper dales. All those present had made the point that present levels of gritting and ploughing should be at least maintained in the interests of public safety. The scrutiny committee had now met and no changes were proposed to the priority of routes in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale, although there had been a small change to roads near the Bellerby crossroads which had been downgraded to Priority 2 which could be dangerous as it was on the route for many people to the out of hours GP the service. There was also still some concern

regarding the way in which the need for gritting would be assessed and there had further action over the been no possibility of raising the road through Arkengarthdale to Priority 1. Crime PSO Taylor-Page in attendance at the meeting reported on recent crime in the area which had included vehicle thefts and the removal of a number of catalytic converters from a local garage forecourt. Industrial Units Enquiries had been made regarding non-craft based use of a unit at Hill Close Richmondshire District Council had replied that due to strict constraints imposed by the body which had originally granted funding for the units, only arts and crafts businesses were eligible to occupy them. However, there were a number of privately owned units in the same development which under miaht come the Highways The restrictions. leakina manhole near the Buck Hotel would be inspected and appropriate action taken once ownership had been established.
