

The Gazette Management Team have debated long and hard what the next steps in the evolution of the Gazette should be. After much debate and sole searching it was decided at the last meeting that the present loose group of volunteers should be formalised into a "proper" company.

The Gazette has therefore become a Not for Profit Company Limited by Guarantee to be known as The Reeth & District Gazette I td

The main difference is that the Gazette will now be governed by Company Law; all other operations will stay the same. That is all the management team positions will still be held by volunteers, printed by volunteers and be for the benefit of Reeth and District residents volunteer will be paid! We hope that by taking this step we will help to secure the future of the Gazette. We can only produce every month through the willingness of the volunteer team loyal support of and the advertisers. But the cost of printing is steadily rising and new equipment is prohibitively expensive for small volunteer organisations (for example the average cost of a new printer is with the Parish Choir and local £5000 and a new collator booklet musicians - 11.15am. maker is somewhere in the region of £15,000). We have managed very well, and will continue to do so for sometime on good quality second hand machinery, but when the time comes to replace that may not be available. So, in order to qualify for any future funding/grants which may be available to purchase and update equipment as is necessary, we needed to formalised into some sort of "proper" organisation. Becoming a Not for Profit Company Limited by Guarantee was the best and only way forward.

The Gazette has also decide to increase its prices for advertising. The price we charge ahs been retained at 2005 levels for two years, but the cost of consumables has increased sharply. We will publish next month the new charges. In the meantime the treasurer will supply any charging information required by advertisers. We hope you understand the necessity to have a charge increase. We sincerely thank our readers and loyal advertisers for their support. GML



#### Crime in the two Dales

your attention bring to Traffic Offences, the first being Failure to Stop to

exchange details when vehicles have hit stationery vehicles, two incidents of which have occurred this month alone in both Arkengarthdale and Reeth, to not make good the damage caused to vehicles can only lead to a feeling of mistrust within such a small community.

The second offence being, driving whilst Over the Prescribed Limit, drink driving could be a contributing factor to the increase in incidents where individuals are failing to stop at road traffic collisions. Police presence has increased within the Dales and vehicle stop checks for breath tests carried out are more frequent. Consider the consequences of failing a breath test, to name a few, an increase in insurance costs . loss of licence, loss of job or at worst, loss of life.

We have had a huge increase in the reporting of suspicious /suspect vehicles or events and we would like to offer a big Thank You to the people in the community who have reported such incidents, this has been of great benefit to the police. One such event was the report of a suspect van selling power tools. The vehicle was stopped and checks carried out, the vehicle was legitimate and the occupants had a peddler's licence. The early report and stop check of the vehicle, enabled the police to give suitable advice as other sightings were reported and so this helped

keep officers free to deal with other incidents

This month I would like to I would like to emphasize that reporting none emergency incidents must be done via the Police no. 0845 60 60 24 7 and information passed to the operator, who will allocate an officer from the Safer Neighbourhood Patrol based at Leyburn. Please do not wait for the local Swaledale/Arkenaarthdale officer come on duty to pass on any information or you can ask for Leyburn Police Station and leave a message as it could be several days before the officer receives the message. There is also a telephone outside Leyburn Police Station that can be used.

### WENSLEYDALE DECORATIVE AND FINE ARTS SOCIETY British Architecture Now

Architectural projects which have caught the public's imagination will be discussed in a Wensleydale Decorative and Fine Arts Society lecture by Anthea Streeter on Tuesday 13 May at 8.00pm at the Middleham Key Centre. These will include the Future Systems Media Centre at Lord's Cricket Ground; the controversial Scottish parliament building; the pleasing classical work of Robert Adam Architects and many of the buildings which have won or been short-listed for the annual RIBA Stirling prize. She will also discuss the importance of Archigram's imaginative, though mainly unbuilt, designs from the 1960s which were internationally acclaimed at the time and have had a key influence on the British Architecture we see today. #### Conservation experts visit Yorkshire Dales

A group of international conservation experts will be visiting the Yorkshire Dales National Park next week during a fact-finding visit to Representatives the UK. from International Union for Conservation of Nature will have the chance to see Malham Cove and learn about the work of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) on Tuesday and Wednesday. They will meet YDNPA chairman Carl Lis. Chief Executive David Butterworth and several officers and Rangers as well as David Sharrod, Director of the Authority's sister organisation the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust. Jon Avison, YDNPA Head of Park Management, said: "National Parks throughout the world vary from uninhabited wildernesses - for example in certain areas of Europe and the

USA - to places where people live, work and enjoy themselves. Management and protection of such diverse areas present different challenges to those who look after them. "The group will be looking at the lessons that can be learned from the interaction of nature conservation and human activity in the UK national parks, which are living and working landscapes. "In return, we hope we will get some feedback from them so that we can benefit from their international expertise." The trip was organised by Natural England and is being hosted by the North York Moors National Park Authority. The group will visit a number of national parks and other areas throughout the UK before returning to the North York Moors for a special conservation conference on 1 May in Scarborough.







#### MARRICK PARISH COUNCIL

The Annual Report of Business conducted by the Parish Council for the financial year 2007 - 8 was presented by the Chair, Councillor Barrie Braithwaite, at the Annual Parish Meeting held on March 20th 2008.

Police Community Support Officer Tracie Taylor - Page was welcomed to the Parish Council meeting which followed, by Councillor Braithwaite. She explained her role, dealing with local issues in 24 villages. She hoped to visit each house in the parish. Praising the work of Daleswatch and neighbourhood watch schemes, she stated that the police appreciated resident's help and sought to encourage it.

The chair queried whether the success of Daleswatch had resulted in less police presence in the area.

Councillor Wilhelmy pointed out difficulties with the Ringmaster system, these were to be ironed out.

Concluding the Community Support Officer stressed the importance of ensuring vehicles and property were locked when unattended and that everyone should be vigilant.

North Yorkshire County Council Winter Maintenance Scrutiny Task Group was carrying out a detailed review of the service.

The Parish Council would stress again the importance of winter maintenance in the parish.

Although it was felt conditions were worsened by frozen water on the road,

Highways had stated they were unable to authorise extensive ditch cleaning, roadside ditches being the landowners responsibility. Work would however be carried out on the Hurst road to try and remove some of the water.

Concern had been expressed about Ellerholme Lane.

**Police Community Support Officer** More information would be obtained Tracie Taylor - Page was welcomed to before the matter was discussed at the the Parish Council meeting which next meeting.

**Tenders** were agreed for the grazing of the parish land.

Richmondshire District Council was looking to undertake and audit of publicly owned land in Richmondshire to explore whether it could be better used or managed.

The Rights of Way Improvement Plan had been formally adopted by North Yorkshire County Council.

The Financial Officer reported tax bills for 2008/9 revealed a 4.3% increase overall. A Band D property eas now £1436.51. However Marrick Council precept share showed a decrease of 3.3%.

Telephone Kiosks. Following a query regarding the telephone kiosks in Marrick and Hurst, it was confirmed the cashboxes had been removed by BT. It was still possible to make Emergency 999 calls or to contact the operator.

Date of next meeting is 22nd May at Marrick Institute following the Annual Parish Council Meeting at 7pm.





### <u>Climate change edition of National Park</u> newspaper

Climate change and its impact on the Yorkshire Dales are the main themes of the latest edition of the newspaper for National Park residents. With everyone facing the prospect of drier, hotter summers, wetter winters, rising sea levels and an increased risk of flooding, there is an even greater urgency to find ways to potentially mitigate its devastating effects. The front page of Dales spring 2008 - which is produced by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) paints a scenario of what the National Park could look like in high summer in 2080 if climate change goes on unchecked. There will be huge pressure on land for housing, different animals and plant life are likely to appear, rivers may dry up, requiring water boreholes and there will be more planted woodland and a greater reliance on renewable energy. The stark picture is also being put across in a new series of displays at the YDNPA's newly-refurbished Grassington National Park Centre. Some articles in the newspaper cover different aspects of the threat to the environment like a chilling warning from Adrian Phillips, Vice President of the Council for National Parks - while others explain ways to lessen its effects, like a list of practical top tips from the Energy Efficiency Advice Centre in York on reducing carbon emissions at The YDNPA's Chief Executive, David Butterworth, said: "Climate change is the story of the moment for everyone and this edition of Dales focuses on the implications for the National Park and all who live, work and relax in it. "We have all got to take seriously the threat to the

environment and - as individuals and as organisations - we have to do all we can to protect the fragile landscape of this beautiful National Park." "Dales 2008 contains ideas and suggestions that everyone can take on board to help reduce this impact, ranging from renewable energy to composting." Editor Sarah Nicholson said: "This edition has been a collaboration with a number of people from different organisations and it also contains studies explaining case how businesses, groups and individuals have developed eco-friendly ideas - from a community's decision to produce bio-diesel to a farmer's 'green' electricity. "We explain how the National Park Authority is putting its own house in order by producing an action plan to reduce its environmental footprint and to achieve its carbon neutral commitment by 2012."
