Willing and able?

It is a sad fact that around 70% of the UK population have not made a Will - is that surprising?

Well it should be when it is considered the problems and heartache that dying without a Will can cause to your family and friends.

In addition to the time and often additional costs involved in sorting out an estate where there is no Will, your estate probably does not go to the person or persons you would wish. Some of the problems which arise are:-

- If you do not have a Will all of your estate does not automatically pass to your surviving spouse
- Whether you like it or not, part of your estate might be held in trust for many years

Making a Will can help also to reduce

Some people feel that to save costs they will make a Will using a will kit or prepare a Will online. This is the way to make money for solicitors. 85% of these Wills have been found to be in someway defective!

You might think that it is better spending a fairly modest amount of money having your Will made properly, to do what you intend, to protect your family or those people or organisations you care about

It is always sensible to use your family solicitor or a solicitor recommended to you who is experienced in the making of Wills and the administration of estates. They will either know your circumstances or spend time to find out about you, and this allows them to do what is vital, understanding your wishes and advising you as to the best way to achieve your aims.

Conditions of eligibility for the scheme are:

Applicant must live in the Hambleton or Richmondshire Districts Applicant must be aged 16+

Require transport to enable them to travel to employment, training, education or job seeking.

The daily journey must be a practical distance for a moped

Successful candidates will receive a moped for six months after completing their Compulsory Basic Training (at no cost to the individual). Safety equipment will also be provided. Insurance, tax and servicing are covered. A contribution of £5.00 per week is required to cover general tyre wear etc.



Crime in the Two Dales

Three honesty boxes located around the Green at Reeth were broken into on several different occasions, any

persons acting suspiciously near to the collection boxes should be reported immediately on 0845-60-60-247. A diesel generator and five galvanised steel troughs with fittings were removed from a farm building at Swale Hall in Harkerside. This month has seen an increase in the reporting of loose cattle on the roads. Fences and gates (of which should be closed) are the farmers responsibility to maintain and this in turn should avoid any possible accidents/incidents with moving highway. Watching vehicles on the fireworks is good fun and popular. But fireworks are explosives and burn at high temperatures, so they need careful handling and storage. Only buy fireworks marked BS 7114. It is against the law to possess fireworks in public if you're under 18, throw or set them off in the street and they should not be sold to anyone under 18 yrs of age. Figures have shown that more children than adults get hurt by fireworks, over half the injuries that occur are suffered by children. Did you know that sparklers get five times hotter than cooking oil? They should never be given to a child under five. Members of the public can buy and set off most fireworks that come under the Categories 1-3. Information on the packet will advise you of the suitability of where the fireworks can be set off. Please keep your pets indoors. Once again I would like to thank you all for the reporting of incidents/accidents and

SPORTS PROJECT LAUNCHED IN THE DALES

Young people will be the focus of a brand new project being launched by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) this year. Called 'Go Dales!', it is aimed at introducing eight to 25-year-olds from the Keighley, Bradford, Craven and Richmond areas to the National Park and to the huge range of adventure activities they can take part in in its beautiful landscape. Kath Needham has been appointed to the three-year, Sport England-funded post of Go Dales Project Officer and will be based at the YDNPA's offices in Grassington. "The whole idea is to get young people interested in some of the different activities on offer in the National Park by offering taster sessions in a whole range of sports including rock climbing, sailing and walking," she said. "We also want to introduce them to existing clubs that take part in the individual sports so we can overcome common hurdles like "I don't know anyone in the group" or "I don't know how to get there". "Hopefully, by doing this, we will help them to develop enthusiasm for a new pastime and a deep appreciation of the National Park and everything it has to offer." Kath is eager to make contact with individuals or people who work in the community who think they may have a group that might be interested in trying different activities. "I'm excited to be working with such a wide variety of young people - and being in a position to open doors of opportunity for

people is wonderful," she said. David Gent, Regional Director of Sport England Yorkshire, said, "Go Dales is a fantastic project that we're delighted to be able to support. "The idea is that, by giving young people lots of chances and a great experience, they will want to keep coming back to the National Park to take part in sport and outdoor activities regularly." 



A Parish Coiuncil meeting was held on the 13th October 2008. Problems are still arising with parking in the village restricting access to Storthwaite. 



Marrick Parish Council Meeting 25 September 2008.

In the absence of the Chair, Councillor Hodgson welcomed County Councillor John Blackie to the meeting. Councillor Blackie gave an update on health issues. There would be no withdrawal of 11 p.m. - 8a.m. doctor service, at present based at Catterick Garrison, though there was a suggestion this could be resited at the Friary, Richmond. Regarding concerns on a possible reduction in services at the Friarage Hospital, Northallerton, Councillor Blackie reassured the meeting that the excellent maternity services would continue. The importance of retaining a 24 hour Accident and Emergency service there was stressed. Dental services were also highlighted and there were concerns regarding pharmacy services and how these could impact on local surgeries.

Waste Collection Numerous complaints received by the Parish Council, regarding the alternate weekly waste collection, led to a lengthy debate. Councillor Wilhelmy stressed the importance of receiving a service that met the needs of the area. Councillor Blackie remarked on the abundance of complaints received throughout the dale. The recent meeting at Reeth to discuss the matter, had been attended by approximately 70 people, and had shown the depth of feeling on the subject. It was agreed to inform Richmondshire District Council of the complaints, and of the need to improve customer relations.

<u>Street Lights in Marrick</u> A letter had been received from a resident regarding the provision of additional street lighting at the west end of the village. However the matter could not be pursued at

present, as there was no funding available. Highways would be reminded of the need for repairs to road edges and overhanging branches. Potholes and water on the roads would also be reported.

Review of Financial Regulations It was agreed to postpone the triennial review of the Parish Council's Financial Regulations until the next meeting, when all Councillors could be present.

<u>Planning Matters</u> Permission had been granted for the erection of a conservatory at The Old School, Hurst. <u>Audit</u> The External Auditor had been highly satisfied, following the spot check, which had involved a thorough examination of the Parish Council's affairs.

<u>Police</u> The Chief Constable of North Yorkshire Police would be present at Richmondshire West Area Meeting on 26 November. It was agreed to ask for an increase in police patrols in the area and that police presence be visible.

<u>Elections</u> European Parliamentary elections would take place on Thursday, 4 June 2009. Elections for County Councillors would also take place in 2009.

<u>Date of next meeting</u> 27 November 2008 at 7.30p.m.at Marrick Institute.

Lifespan - up to 5 years Size - 80-85mm (head and body), 56-68mm (tail) and 15-30g Identification - orange/brown fur on the upper-parts and yellow/white fur underneath with a white throat. The only British mammal of this size with a thick, bushy tail. Habitat - deciduous and coppiced woodland, scrub and hedgerows. Diet - seeds, flowers, fruit and insects. Before hibernation nuts are an important food source. Behaviour - dormice spend the day sleeping in nests made from grass, moss, leaves and shredded honeysuckle bark. The nests are typically about 15cm in diameter and woven to entirely surround the animal. Little is known about their social organisation, but it is thought that they sometimes live in pairs. Dormice are nocturnal and hibernate from October to If food is short or weather prevents them foraging they are able to save energy by lowering their body temperature and becoming torpid. They can spend up to three quarters of their lives asleep. They are good climbers, and spend most of their time in the tree canopy. Breeding - they normally rear one or two litters a year, typically of four The young remain with their mother for 6-8 weeks before becoming independent. Conservation status -British native, the dormouse has become extinct in up to 7 English counties (about half its former range) in the past 100 years. It is absent from the north, except for small populations in Cumbria and Northumberland, and although dormice are still widespread from Kent to Devon, their distribution is patchy. Even in good

habitats, numbers are low. The main reason for its increasing rarity is habitat loss due to the decline in hazel coppicing. Where woodland has become fragmented, populations become isolated and can't move to new habitat. Even gaps in woodland of as little as 100m can prevent the species spreading out. The reintroduction Freeholders' Wood is managed as a traditional coppice woodland by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority. The dormice released here were bred in captivity by the Common Dormouse Captive Breeders Group and given a full bill of health before release by Paignton and Staff from the People's London Zoos. Trust for Endangered Species and Paignton Zoo then placed the dormice in mesh cages attached to hazel trees within the wood. They were fed in the cages by staff and volunteers from the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority. After ten days, openings were made in the mesh to allow them to explore while still being provided with food if they needed it. Extra feeding stopped in mid September leaving the dormice wild and free to roam through the woodland. To see if the reintroduction had been successful 195 nestboxes were checked in September. Despite the very wet summer 58 dormice were found in the boxes with large numbers of well grown youngsters.

The dormouse Species Recovery Project is funded and monitored by Natural England and the People's Trust for Endangered Species.





WENSLEYDALE DECORATIVE AND FINE ARTS SOCIETY

EVERY PICTURE TELLS A STORY The Victorians had a voracious appetite for stories, their era was probably one of the greatest story-telling periods in our history. They liked nothing better than a good read, whether in printed or pictorial form. Narrative paintings which mirrored the ups and downs of their everyday life had as much appeal as the novels of Dickens and Thackeray. In Once Upon a Time - Victorian Narrative Painting Lizzie Darbyshire explores the fascinating tales painted by artists such as Frith, Holman Hunt, Millais and Tissot. YORE MILL'S POWERFUL PROJECT

Aysgarth's Yore Mill was built at the end of the 18th century as a cotton mill. It later became a woollen mill, spinning yarn for the hand-knitters. It burnt down in 1853 but was re-built the following year and went on to supply over 7,000 jerseys to Italy for Garibaldi's army of 'red shirts'. It was later developed into a grain mill. On Wednesday 5th November, at the Bellerby Study Group, Ann Kiely will bring us right up-to-date with the *Hydro Power Project at Yore Mill, Aysgarth.*

water turbines were supplied to the mill by Gilbert Gilkes Gordon of Kendal in 1937 and 1941. This was necessary to power the grain mill's machinery following a 'dry period' for the mill when the water-wheel was removed. The grain mill closed in 1963, the turbines ceased to function and the mill became a store for a private collection of Victorian horse-drawn vehicles which later developed into the Yorkshire Carriage Museum. In 1993 David and Ann Kiely became interested in refurbishing the water turbines but the cost was prohibitive. With assistance from volunteers from the Prince's Darlington College and Grosmont School some civil works were undertaken in 1997 which started the restoration project, but financial restraints brought this to a halt. In 2002 a small grant from DEFRA kickstarted the next stage of the project and a Government scheme to encourage green energy production made it financially viable to move the scheme forward. On 28h August 2008 Yore Mill started to generate electricity. Ann will describe the hoops that she and David have had to jump through to achieve this and the enthusiasm which started them on their journey. Later in November Helen Bainbridge talks on Swaledale and Arkengarthdale in Poetry and Prose on Wednesday 12th; Wednesday 19th John Heselgrave recounts Some Adventures in Stone, and the work of **Artists of the Lakes and Dales** is described by Peter Webber on Wednesday 26th.
