

Crime in the Two Dales

During the month of July there was theft of diesel from a vehicle in the Marske area and in other parts of the Dale. Due

to the rise in fuel costs we rely on the community to keep a look out for people siphoning fuel from vehicles and domestic tanks. Please ensure tanks have adequate locks on and are checked regularly. Suspect males were seen on land around Marrick possibly poaching and we had an incident where a vehicle was stolen from Keld . All vehicles should be left secure and ignition keys removed. We have lots of people from outside the area at this time of year so there are more opportunities for incidents to occur. I would ask that members community also keep an eye out for any suspicious persons or vehicles sighted nearby Pay and Display machines, public telephone boxes and honesty boxes. NEW SERVICE LAUNCHED TO SUPPORT VULNERABLE PEOPLE LIVING IN OUR REMOTE COMMUNITIES

Isolation is often the biggest threat to the well being of older people and those with learning disabilities or mental health difficulties, in Richmondshire. The most vulnerable are those who have little or no family support, live alone, have no independent means of transport, or deteriorating health and sensory loss. One solution is a new Rural Support Service launched by the northern-based charity, Avalon. Trained Support Workers are available to give as much, or as little support as necessary to maintain your independence. People can use the service to enjoy supported leisure opportunities, shopping, public transport, visits to nearby attractions or to meet friends. Alternatively, if preferred, the Avalon Rural Support Service can help you to carry out domestic tasks, deal with written correspondence. understand and pay domestic bills. Avalon works closely with you to ensure vour individual needs are met. The service is flexible, and available at any time of the day or evening, at any time of the week. REETH SURGERY IMPORTANT PATIENT NOTICE

Reeth Surgery will be implementing an evening appointment system from the 1st October.

Evening surgery with the doctor will run from 4pm to 6pm on Monday, Wednesday and Friday with appointments at 10-minute intervals

Appointments can be booked in advance or on the day either by telephone (884396) or in person.

The morning surgeries will continue to be open access from 8:30am to 10am.

The reasons for this change are to make it easier for working people to see the doctor and also allow us to have later opening times during the week in the near future.

We will still have flexibility to deal with emergencies arising during the day.

Many of our patients have commented in our satisfaction surveys that they would prefer an appointment system, so that they do not have the unpredictability of access surgery and open potentially a long wait. Working patients are also keen to have longer surgery hours so that they can see the doctor after work. An appointment system in the evening would enable us to provide this service more easily. The doctor usually sees 12 patients during the evening clinic, so extending the new evening surgery times should ensure no reduction in service.

Vernacular buildings of the two dales

The Swaledale & Arkengarthdale Vernacular Buildings Study Group was formed a year or so ago with the help of the Friends of the Swaledale Museum and Don McLellan of the National Park. During that time we have learnt a lot about the architecture of 'ordinary' buildings in the area and their development. We are in the process of producing reports on two of the

houses which we have surveyed. To do this we undertake a detailed survey of the house and identify and record features of particular interest from large items such as roof timbers down to small features such as door hinges. We consider documentary evidence including deeds, tithe maps, census returns, land tax records etc and attempt to determine the history of the house and estimate when it was first constructed.

Recently we. obtained arants Richmondshire District Council and the Heritage Lottery Fund (Awards for All) to enable us to ensure that the historic vernacular buildings of Swaledale Arkengarthdale are surveyed recorded for posterity, and to raise awareness amongst both local people and visitors of this important aspect of our local heritage. We aim to produce one or booklets identifying the features of the development of vernacular buildings in this area. These will build upon previous publications by the Yorkshire Vernacular Buildings Study Group, for example, and complement the "Private Spaces Public Places" brochures produced by the Yorkshire Dales National Park.



Reeth Parish Council July 28

Refuse Collections Ongoing problems were still being experienced with bin collections. County Coun Blackie who was in attendance reported that he had called for a review of the situation as the policy was not being implemented as it had originally been intended. He asked anyone still experiencing problems to contact him. Coun Gardner said that it was still hoped to organise a meeting under the auspices of the Business Association, drawing attention to the need for flexibility to deal with a rural situation. The district council had responded to the parish council's comments on bins obstructing parish pavements and land representative had visited the parish to assess the situation. It was felt that he might have gained more insight into the problems had he informed the council of his proposed visit and come to the area on a refuse collection day. Postal Deliveries It was reported that a number of people in Arkengarthdale had received notification that post would no longer be delivered to their homes on health and safety grounds. Coun Blackie agreed to look into the situation. Signage Coun Blackie encouraged councillors to object to the lack of consultation over new road signs in the area which omitted local names and directed traffic instead to larger towns on the same route. Footpaths No reply had been received from Highways regarding responsibility for the footpath round the Buck corner and how to define the edge to prevent parking across it. It was noted that a number of paths in the parish were completely impassable and badly in need of cutting back. Greens Councillors felt that

the best solution to the path to the Congregational chapel was to tarmac it. The area near the Copper Kettle needed to be cleared of ragwort. Problems had occurred with strimming near the war memorial and it was agreed that some way should be found to warn drivers to move their cars beforehand. Maintenance work would be arranged for the seats around the parish. Some cobbling work was still to be finished on Healaugh green - it was confirmed that this would be done. Bonfire Night Following a Fireworks Committee meeting it was confirmed that the necessary insurance was in place to cover the event. However, the bonfire must be kept 25m from the public and would have to be much smaller. It was agreed that only wood would be allowed on the pile and building could only start a couple of days in advance of Bonfire Night. If this was not adhered to there was a risk of losing the altogether. bonfire Cycle Race Notification was received about a cycle race which would take place on Sunday, September 21, and which would involve closure of stretches of public highway at intervals during the day. Some concern was felt that this could cause disruption to traffic and could make emergency difficult. Fair Permission granted for the funfair to use the green as usual over the Bank Holiday weekend. Village Clock An inspection would arranged for the clock which was no longer keeping good time. Parish Clerk responses had been received as yet for the post of parish clerk. Next Meeting The next meeting is at 7pm on Monday, September 22 in the Memorial Hall.

MEETING: A Parish Council Meeting was held on the 14th July when all councillors were present. County Councillor John Blackie sent his apologies. The Chairman welcomed Mr. Philip Bastow, a Reeth Fire officer and two North Yorkshire Fire Officers, Mr Lund and Mr. Hankin.

FIRE PREVENTION: There was a detailed discussion on fire prevention and also on the subject of difficult access to certain parts of the Parish. The Fire officers have offered to have a letter hand delivered by Parish Councillors to every house in the dale to offer fire prevention advice and install smoke alarms. The subject of difficult access was discussed and this is being looked into.

AMBULANCE SERVICE: The Parish Council have been in contact with the Ambulance Service and have hopefully achieved a situation where they are aware that certain addresses have difficult access. This needs to be allowed for if they get a callout from such an address.

PARKING: There has been a problem with cars parking outside the Church restricting access along the road to Scar House, usually when a large number of people attend the Church for concerts and special functions. Hopefully this problem has been resolved.

REFUSE COLLECTION: The ongoing problem of refuse collection was again discussed and it was decided that RDC would be given a little more time to iron out problems.

WINTER MAINTENANCE: no official notification of any changes have been received but once again there is some

hope of a more favourable solution to the problems involved.

WHEELIE BINS

Ed.: A lot of anger has been generated through the introduction of the new waste collection system. We have received many calls and comments since the editorial on the subject in the July issue. Last month's letter generated even more communications and in view of the forthcoming Public Meeting I thought it only right that the received letters be printed. I start with a response from the national Parks to an enquiry by one of our readers.

WHEEL I thought you might be interested in seeing the response I received from the Parks Authority regarding complaints I made to their apparent lack of response over the introduction of Wheelie Bin collections in National Park by RDC. I did not necessarily intend it for inclusion in the Gazette but thought it might be of use to you as I know that there is a lot of ill feeling about this matter. **B Pearson** Reply as follows;

Thank you for your recent email on the above matter. You won't be surprised to hear it's not the first piece of correspondence we have received on the subject. In simple terms, the reason the Authority has not commented in public on the matter is twofold. First, we have not yet adopted a position on the issue (I'll return to this in a moment). Second, we have no powers or authority to 'force'

Richmondshire DC to chanae approach. The issue was raised at a meeting of the National Park Authority in May. Even at this very early juncture a number of problems were evident. Most difficulty that concerned the residents were facing in complying with the new system, but the impact of unsightly bins on the 'landscape' was also highlighted. Members resolved to keep a watching brief and re-visit the issue at our September meeting when, hopefully, the teething problems had died down. We still intend to do this and I have written to the Chief Executive αt Richmondshire DC highlight these problems and our proposed Our position can only be one of trying to influence what goes on at Richmondshire. This is a District Council They are the waste collection issue authority, and they have specific powers to direct people as to where to leave their waste for collection. These powers are section 46 contained in οf the Environmental Protection Act. Your point about bins being left out is an interesting one. As I understand it this is unlawful if they are left for more than 24 hours. which would put RDC in the unenviable position of not only introducing a 'difficult' system of waste collection, but also taking action (presumably because of complaints from other residents or possibly the National Park Authority) against those who did not replace their bins! As I'm sure you will appreciate, I'm really looking forward to consideration of this matter at our September meeting! Yours sincerely

letter in the August edition of the Reeth Gazette, which claims we have a 'not in my back yard' approach to this new waste collection system, I feel Ms Reynolds is completely missing the point. It is mainly due to the impracticalities, waste of resources and lack of communication from the Richmondshire District Council that some of us are so outraged. We all know we need to recycle and the majority of us do already hence the recycling points are nearly always full and we rarely had a full 'normal' sized bin come the day of collection before this new system, let alone a full great big grey wheelie bin with this new one. It's easy to recycle less for those that can't be bothered to separate their waste with all that space in the grey bin for rubbish. When we first moved to Thwaite in May last vear we asked Richmondshire District Council for one of these recycling boxes, it never came. We ended up buying a plastic storage box from Leyburn market instead and took it to Muker or Keld when it became full. No problem whatsoever. latest 'wheelie bin' article in the Darlington and Stockton Times, Friday 15th August 2008; 'aggressive abuse' over new system", I cannot believe Sean Little is still patting themselves on the back by quoting us recycling figures and targets. This is not numbers game. companies treated their customers this or not.

Dear Editor, In reply to Janet Reynolds but to pay our council tax - which is currently being wasted on unnecessary bins and wagons. When will the council realise that one size does not fit all? What may work in a town does not work in the remote areas of the Dales. We are the ones that live here, surely we would be able to advise best on what will and will not work?! The fact the council did not inform us or even seek opinions from residents before forcing this scheme upon us just defies belief. Considering the Richmondshire District Council were one of the last to review their waste collection system to meet recycling targets; you would have thought they would have learnt from the mistakes and successes of other councils before copying them all to the letter. In the afore-mentioned news item. Mr Sean Little quotes that "only £45.45 out of our annual council tax goes on waste collections". This I find very hard to believe considering earlier this month the BBC News website featured an article "Police to put lid on bin thefts" (4th August 2008) which stated each bin Having read the theft costs taxpayers £35. Well we've been given two of these bins (so that must be £70), which we don't even need "Bin men face as, firstly, we don't even have a garden, so there's no need for a garden waste bin. We are not alone in this, and the council could have saved themselves a lot of money if they'd asked residents If private whether they required these green bins Secondly, we already had a way they would have gone into liquidation smaller less conspicuous black plastic by now. Why is it that we, the consumers dustbin which was perfectly adequate are ignored? Because we have no choice and easy to hide from the road. We

two huge bins, a box and a bag - plus our original bin, which in light of the new system forced upon us should have been taken away and disposed of by the council. So, we are now a village of bins - old and new. The pretty village of Thwaite, like many others in these areas is just full of huge lumps of plastic, with no 'gardens' or 'driveways' to hide them in. Not only that, but of course we have new bigger wagons (How much did these cost?) which cannot reach anywhere other than houses on 'main roads'. Consequently, some residents have to wheel bins a mile or so through countless farm gates and over cattle grids to their nearest collection point. The costs must also increase with this new system as additional collections are introduced. The council now sends a wagon every Tuesday for 'commercial' waste, and one on a Friday for alternative household and recyclable collections. 'Commercial waste' bins in Thwaite are for the occupants of the holiday cottages, that is to say they contain your normal everyday household waste that you or I would produce - but is not recycled. Out of 32 houses in Thwaite. only nine are permanently occupied with a Friday collection. That's a lot of household waste, collected on a different day that is not recycled at all. This to me seems to be totting up to a bit more than £45.45. In addition to the new system, we have the 'recycling points' in Muker and Keld left from the old system - are these still going to remain? Regardless, there must be costs for the upkeep and disposal from those too. We were used to and happy to take our recyclables there as and when

barely have room for a plant pot let alone they piled up at home. Surely it would have been cheaper and easier to add a couple more bins for 'non recyclable household waste' at these areas and then we just take all our rubbish to these places, one collection from a single point in each village. Simple. No bins littered outside every single household, lining the idyllic roads of the dales. My husband and I recently went to France whereby they do just that. They have 'waste disposal points' where local residents take all their waste. they have different coloured bags for different recyclables to corresponding bins. Although this may be difficult for those who are elderly or do not have their own transport to take their refuse, there may well be a solution to that problem if we all communicated and shared thoughts and ideas properly. I'm surprised the Yorkshire Dales National Parks have not had something to say about all these bins scattered amongst wheelie 'picturesque' Dales. Surely we need planning permission for these permanent obtrusive objects? One of our local residents had the National Parks authority contact them to request they remove piles of firewood from the front of their house. It's strange therefore that they've not been asked to move their two council imposed wheelie bins too - although where exactly they'd put them instead I do not know. By liaising with the local communities and the National Parks; surely the council would get a more positive and favourable result that would prove to be more cost effective and hit their all important 'targets'. The East Riding of Yorkshire Council is a brilliant example of this, with good communication

At last count it was well over 500 - and that's only a handful who have actually made the time to send in a complaint, there are an awful lot more of us in uproar but just do not have the time or the energy to bother why? Has Sean Little been to 'Litherskew' where residents have a 3 mile round trip to take their bins for collection. What about up Skeugh Head Lane, Angram in Swaledale? Or the road to Ramps Holme Farm from Gunnerside? Probably not - due to 'health and safety' reasons. The next set of gale force winds we get, no doubt we will have these wheelie bins and boxes blowing off the hills and rolling down into the river Swale. Good riddance I say, I hope they find themselves piled up outside the council offices. The whole system for the upper Dales is absolutely balmy. Only someone sat behind a desk in a town office would impose such a system. It's the same old story from any form of council or government: "We know best". Like hell you dol Emily Abbey

Dear Sir I have read Janet Reynolds article re wheelibins. If she is a member

of the Friends of the Earth, then it puts me off having anything to do with them. She is missing the whole point. Most of us have nothing against recycling, we know it has to be done. In fact Janet has been doing it for over 20 years she tells us, presumably WITHOUT a wheeliebin.

She tells us to put the bins out on collection day and "then hide them away". must be. fortunate and somewhere to hide them. She only has to look at the many villages in the Dales to realise that there are a lot of cottages without a back entrance and a very small front garden. Do these people bring the bin through the house or leave them in the front garden? We are fortunate to live in a conservation area, and to conserve the beauty of the National Park. Dear Sir.

I wish to respond to the letter from Janet Reynolds in the August edition of The Gazette. Janet seems to have completely missed the point that was being made in the June editorial. The main argument that most people in the dales have with R.D.C's newly imposed waste and recycling scheme, is not with the recycling element of the policy, they are aggrieved at the unfair reduction in the household waste collection service. Is she aware that many people in outlying areas have lost their collection service altogether, and are expected to take their household waste to the nearest waste collection depots i.e. Levburn or Richmond? These people pay their council taxes just the same as other residents of the dale, but are expected to accept a reduction in services, while paying for the privilege.

As for R.D.C's attitude to genuine concerns aired by residents, it has been a public relations disaster, and to quote a well used local expression, "that one of the only good services provided by R.D.C. was our bin collections", and now even that has gone.

I take the point that we need to reduce landfill, but however much we recycle there will always be some household rubbish to be removed from our homes and surely our local council have a statutory obligation to its residents to do just that. I have had discussions with members of R.D.C and officers of the Waste and Street Scene Dept., about why some residents can no longer expect to have refuse collected from their

homes, the reply is that it is too costly. These costs should have been factored into the scheme from the beginning, providing a fair system for all the residents of Richmondshire. Instead we are left with a policy which could be seen as discriminatory.


