'Wheels 2 Work' is a moped leasing scheme aimed at helping people get over the initial problem of getting to work or training where no suitable alternative transport exists.

Conditions of eligibility for the scheme are:

Applicant must live in the Hambleton or Richmondshire Districts Applicant must be aged 16+

Require transport to enable them to travel to employment, training, education or job seeking.

The daily journey must be a practical distance for a moped

'Wheels 2 Work' launched May 2001 is a project of the Rural Transport Partnership















Successful candidates will receive a moped for six months after completing their Compulsory Basic Training (at no cost to the individual). Safety equipment will also be provided. Insurance, tax and servicing are covered. A contribution of £5.00 per week is required to cover general tyre

Like her contemporary Boudicca, she was a woman leader in a man's world who strove to protect her people from Roman invaders and the effects of internal discord.



## FIFTY YEARS OR MORE AND STILL COMING TO REETH

I first came to Reeth about 1959 as a member of the Calder Clarion Cycling Club, which was established in the 1890's. The Yorkshire division was comprised of many local clubs and our annual Whitsuntide Camp was to Reeth, also clubs from other areas attended. My first camp was in Alderson's field in a bow in the river, down through the Quaker fold off the lane to the old strip field system and the path down to the swing bridge. That field is gone, washed away by the river and the deep swimming pool over the far side is filled in. In the early days we cycled up from Wakefield, the tents and other gear we sent by rail to Darlington and delivered to the field by a local coach company. On one occasion they failed to deliver and six or eight of us slept in the hen hut with the unpredictable weather. There were often eighty to one hundred units filling the field. We had races and other competitions for the youngsters. Everyone took the Whitsuntide Walk up Fremington Edge, past the White House to the Green Dragon Pub at Hurst. We usually managed to drain his cellar before returning back to camp. The three pubs in Reeth ran out of beer one Sunday and we had to walk down to the Bridge Inn at Grinton for more. We hired the Village Hall for many years for a Saturday night dance and we had real music. I remember the Buck Hotel had no cellar or pumps, you could see the barrels on trestles in the back, the beer was decanted with jugs first, then into glasses. The two ladies that ran it did a 'midnight flit' to everyone's surprise. Every year

there is a compulsory cycle ride up to Tan Hill. Up the scenic way through Muker, and rocket ride through down Arkengarthdale back home. We have had a number of other sites including behind the Garage at Reeth Bridge, also at the back of the Bridge Inn, before we came to our present site in Mr. Brown's Park Field. We have now used this for over 25 years. We hired the Institute at Grinton for the Queen's Silver Jubilee celebrations and also for some of our own anniversary celebrations. Favourite walks include along the hillside or over Fremington Edge to Langthwaite then back along side the Arkle Beck. Or, by bus to Keld then follow the Coast to Coast back or form Grinton to Richmond via Hurst and Marske, a fish and chip lunch and then back to camp. Our children learned to recognise Orchids Ragged Robin, Allison, Campion and many more plants and different birds. They also learned the history of lead mining and the old farming practices and all about the even more ancient Maiden Castle. In the past it was always warm enough to swim in the river and float our dinghys over the sawmill dam up the Arkle Beck or in the confluence with the Swale. On a couple of occasions we have had to evacuate the field because cloud bursts up the valley had raised the river level to overflowing into the field. We have several sets of three generation families in our group now and are looking forward to the next fifty years of enjoying Swaledale.

Reeth Medical Centre has recently overhauled the way it monitors long-term conditions. Using national recommendations for good medical practice, we have set up a system for monitoring people

with conditions such as blood pressure, heart disease, diabetes and asthma. The check ups are designed to pick up problems early, perhaps before there are symptoms, so that preventative steps can be taken. For example, high blood pressure does not normally have symptoms, yet can increase the risk of heart attack and stroke. Monitoring and treating blood pressure can significantly reduce this risk. Some of the check-ups require a blood test. This is because some conditions, such as heart disease and high blood pressure can be associated with other problems such as diabetes and kidney disease. Again, there may be no symptoms in the early stages of disease, and these tests help us to detect if there are any early signs. Most of the blood tests are done as fasting samples - this is because eating/ drinking before can affect the results of the tests and give high sugar and cholesterol readings, so some of you will be asked to go without breakfast. Early appointments with Jane, our Practice Nurse, are recommended! The administration staff are working to keep the monitoring checks to a minimum - they are synchronising the checks for people with more than one long term condition so that our patients are inconvenienced as little as possible. To try and make life easier for our patients, we are reminding you by telephone when the checks are due, and if possible, arranging an appointment for you there and then, to save you having to call back later. If you would prefer a written reminder, please let us know. The nurse will be able to discuss the tests with you at the time. The results are normally reviewed by the doctors, who will contact you if there is any need to change your current treatment plan. If you do have any concerns or further questions, please speak to either Dr Anderson or myself. Doctors' Appointment Times Just a reminder, if you are still unsure, of the doctors' appointment times.

### THE ANTHONY NOLAN TRUST

27 years ago Kristeen and I went over to Leyburn and joined the Anthony Nolan register. This involved giving a blood sample and having our contact details put on their database. This week I got a letter from the trust telling me that as I had reached the age of 60 I could no longer remain on the register. In those 27 years I have twice had to give blood samples as I was a close match to someone needing a bone marrow transplant, but sadly I never had the chance to save someone's life. As people of my age leave the register it is vital that others take our place. Anyone between 18 and 40 would be most welcome and they particularly want young men - I think their blood stem cells are more successful in transplants. You have to give an initial blood sample (painless if you go to Jane at the Medical Centre), keep the trust updated with your health and contact details, and be prepared to undergo a minor medical procedure if you are found to be a match for a patient needing a bone marrow transplant. 


