THE SWALEDALE FESTIVAL

The Swaledale Festival has won a highly international award. At the inaugural Ability Media Awards the Festival won the category of 'Local Hero', beating off competition from all over the world to win with its production of Semmerwater. original play with music was described at the awards ceremony in London as "an uplifting and fascinating work which, performed to the highest standards, showed how inclusive and affirmative community productions can be". The awards are presented by Leonard Cheshire Disability and the winners chosen for their creative excellence and social relevance in other categories Winners Enalish included National Opera. Television, Frank Gardner OBE, Sir Anthony Sher, Sue Townsend, Jimmy McGovern, The Royal Shakespeare Company and Channel Four. Semmerwater was conceived Swaledale Festival's Artistic Director Malcolm Creese as a project that would celebrate a local legend and enable a large number of local adults and children to share a stage with top professional performers. Malcolm commissioned prize-winning local writer Ann Pilling, who was inspired by the Watson poem The Ballad Semmerwater, to write the script, and top musician David Gordon to compose the music. which contained mediaeval, renaissance and baroque styles, as well as elements of jazz and folk. David has previously visited the Festival with the gypsy tango band Zum and early music/jazz group Respectable Groove. Children from the Dales formed an important creative role 34 children and form Arkengathdale, Reeth and Gunnerside Schools were the Sheep Chorus whilst 36 children from Askrigg and Bainbridge Primary Schools formed a Fish Chorus. Other singers came from the Wensleydale Chorus and the

Swale Singers, and young actors came from the Youth Theatre of the Georgian Theatre Royal in Richmond. Even Grinton's vicar, Rev. Caroline Hewlett, had a part in the play. Music teacher Rosi Keatinge had coached the performers in singing, and drama director Amanda Heitler took charge of staging and props. Workshops and rehearsals went on for several months. The performance took place in St. Andrew's Church in Grinton on 5th June was conducted from the 2009 and harpsichord by David Gordon. Instrumental music was provided by London Concertante, one of the finest chamber ensembles in the country, and 17 local musicians. The cast of 98 singers, whose ages ranged from 4 to over 80, was headed by professional soloists Emily Smith and David Pisaro, joined in the leading roles by singers from local choirs and Richmond and Wensleydale Schools. "We wanted to include as many local people as we could, regardless of age or ability" said Malcolm Creese. "so we. decided commission a new work especially for the community here in Swaledale, Wensleydale and Arkengarthdale." "We want to thank everyone who spent so much time and effort in taking part", said John Sparke, Swaledale Festival Chairman. "It was a great thrill to see Semmerwater performed and it is wonderful that all those involved celebrate winning this prestigious award." At the awards ceremony at King's Place in London last November, the AMI Local Hero Award was collected by 14-year-old Amy Stockdale from Wensleydale School, and 15-year-old Ben Lacey - from Richmond School, both of whom are Youth Theatre members, along with Swaledale Festival Chairman John Sparke, Malcolm Creese, Ann Pilling, David Gordon, Rosi Keatinge, Amanda Heitler, and singer/ actor Emma Wardell. Fresh call for affordable housing sites A fresh call for possible sites on which to build affordable housing has gone out to landowners and organisations in four areas of the Yorkshire Dales National Park. Despite a good response generally to an appeal launched in January by Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA), there were few sites forward in the Hawes/Gayle, Grassington/ Threshfield, Sedbergh and Reeth areas, accordina to Peter Stockton. Authority's Strategic Planning Officer. "The bigger villages are the best places to put new housing in the National Park because they have the best range of services up and running and are a focus for local housing need," he said. "That means the existing services - and through them the local economy - will benefit, and they are nearby so people can walk to them rather than having to use vehicles - which saves them money and is more environmentally friendly. The appeal for sites throughout the National Park did result in a number being put forward in the four areas but some are very constrained and will not go through to the next round of selection.

Each site must be large enough to accommodate at least two homes and will have to meet a number of planning requirements. Yvonne Peacock, Chair of the YDNPA's Housing Working Group and Member Champion for Forward Planning, said: "We have launched this second appeal to see if there are any other locations that landowners could put forward in the four areas. "We want to be as certain as we can be that we have the best range of available sites - the best options - to look

at." Half of each site that is finally chosen will be used for affordable housing in perpetuity. The remainder will not have to be affordable, but will still be restricted to occupancy by people who need to live inside the National Park. Landowners have until Friday, December 11, to put forward sites within the four areas and details are available on the Authority's website at www.yorkshiredales.org.uk.

National Park to feature in Harry Potter Film

The beautiful scenery of the Yorkshire Dales National Park is set to be seen by millions of people all over the world - in the new Harry Potter film. Film crews were at Malham Cove and on Grassington Moor above the village of Grassington last week capturing some of the National Park's fantastic landscapes for Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, which is directed by David Yates and is due to be released in two parts in November next year and July The film footage and photographs will be used as background shots, which will then have characters superimposed on to them. Authority chairman Carl Lis said: "It's good to think that the iconic landscape of the Dales is going to be seen by a world-wide audience in the next Harry Potter film. "We get dozens of requests every year from film companies wanting to shoot in the National Park, which shows just how special an area it is." Sue Quinn, supervising location manager for the movie, said: "We have been doing a lot of filming in Scotland and we wanted somewhere different that had a certain isolation so we came to the Yorkshire Dales National Park. It's very beautiful here."




