REETH BONFIRE 2009

Open public bonfires are coming under increasing regulations, mainly from companies. insurance Last year the Fireworks Committee tried to have a bonfire made entirely of pallets so that its size could be regulated and it could be put out by the Fire Brigade at the end of the night. We simply failed as the fire did not burn as quickly as we had hoped and had to be left to die naturally. This year after much discussion with the Parish Council, there will be an open bonfire again but with the following restrictions: 1. No material is to be left on the Green until 1st November and the site will be closed when it is considered large enough. 2. An RDC skip will be on the Green on 31st October for any unsuitable material. 3. The bonfire HAS to be 25m away from the general public i.e. in the position it was in last year. 4. A list of' Yes please' and 'No Thank you' items will be displayed around the site. This committee and the Parish Council are trying desperately to maintain a tradition in Reeth which goes back generations. Your help and forbearance would be greatly appreciated. We hope that you will understand and embrace the new slogan 'Abuse it and you will lose it'

ARE YOU A CARER?
From time to time people come and see the doctors with their concerns about a loved one. As the conversation

develops, the doctors may discover that these people are devoting much of their time to being a carer for that loved one.

It led me to think that perhaps there are people within our community that don't fully appreciate what being a 'carer' involves, or indeed that they are caring for someone on a daily basis without seeing themselves in the role of a carer. For instance, if you are looking after your husband or wife, you may feel this comes under the "in sickness and in health" part of the marriage vows, without realising that you have services available to you, and, in many cases, even financial support.

Therefore, if you are looking after your wife or husband to the extent that they cannot manage without you being there, then you are a carer.

How Reeth Medical Centre can support you as a carer, and the person you care for.

Carers are people who, without payment, provide help and support to a family member, friend or neighbour who cannot manage on their own due to physical or mental illness, disability, substance misuse or frailty brought on by old age. Caring roles can include administering medication, lifting and handling, personal or emotional care.

If you are a carer, you might find it difficult to access our services without extra support. If you identify yourself

as a carer, our staff will try to offer you:

- Home visits and/or telephone appointments if caring responsibilities mean you cannot leave the person you care for at home or bring them with you to the surgery.
- Flexibility or priority on appointment times where possible.
- Support for the person you care for in the waiting room or private area if you need to bring them to the surgery but would like a consultation in private.
- Information about local carers support services which may be able to arrange transport and/or sitting services to help you leave home to attend surgery.
- An annual health check and 'flu jab.
- Information about your right to a Carers' Assessment of your own needs as a carer.
- Advice on safer lifting and other aspects of providing care such as medication, including medication trays.
- Discussing with you what you would like us to do in the event of you or the person you care for having a medical or other emergency.

In some cases caring roles are full time and very demanding. We would like to support you in your caring role where we can. We will avoid making assumptions about the amount of care you wish to take on. Caring should not be at the expense of your own health and wellbeing. Please let

us know how your caring role is affecting you and if you have any support needs.

We will try to help you by:

- Providing you with information about the condition and needs of the person you care for, such as the effects of medication, where that person gives consent.
- Always listening to and respecting the information you give us about your caring role and the needs of the person you care for.
- Providing you with general information about health conditions when you ask for it when we do not have consent from the person you care for to share their personal information.
- Please contact us if you have any queries about our support for carers - we're happy to help and treat the conversation in the strictest of confidence.

What is very important to remember is that you can't continue to care for someone if you yourself fall sick, so don't ignore your own well-being, and don't forget to come and be vaccinated for 'flu. There is also a dedicated Carers' Centre where you can get advice, including how you can access financial support. They can be contacted on 01609 780 872. Above all, do let us know if you are a carer, so we can be sure of giving you as much help and support as we can. Hope this helps, and do come and see us if you need to know more.

clinic on 9^{th} October. Over £430 was raised on the day and there are still donations coming in.





Firstly, I would like to say a big 'Thank you' to those local residents who took the time and trouble to notify members of

North Yorkshire Police, of what was thought to be a suspect vehicle and persons. With your help I managed to encounter the vehicle and persons, who were found to be legitimate. As mentioned previously any concerns over doorstep sellers can be brought to my attention at Hudson House by letter or face-to face or email tracielee.taylorpage@northyorkshire. pnn.police.uk and by calling in at Leyburn Police Station where information can be passed to myself. MUKER PARISH COUNCIL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 6th OCTOBER 2009

Declaration of Interest: A Councillor declared an interest the Housina in Minutes of Development Plan item. Previous Meeting: the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on the 18th August 2009, had been circulated and were approved as a correct record on the of Councillor Metcalfe seconded by Councillor Calvert. All were in favour. Matters Arising: The LINK report was read out to the council, the main issues of concern being the Dental provision and the paediatric care. The dental practice is to continue in Hawes and the paediatric service is to be resumed at the Friarage. An email received by the Clerk was read out to the Council regarding a seat near Crackpot. It was suggested that this was under the remit of Melbecks Parish Council. It was noted that unsafe seating has to be either fixed or removed under Health and Safety directives. Highways: The previous reply from Mr Woodford was read out to the Council. The Clerk was asked to write to Mr Woodford mentioning that Ivelets was still not in good order and concerns have been raised especially as winter approaches. Council raised the issue of parking in Gunnerside. It is becoming increasingly dangerous as it affects the public driving through the village, especially if the vehicle is of a larger make and is towing a trailer. Delivery wagons are also an issue, with many delivery vehicles refusing to drive through Gunnerside as it is so dangerous. This adds cost onto businesses if deliveries come via a longer route. The

Clerk was instructed to write to Melbecks Parish Council to ask if this item could be put onto their agenda and that Muker Parish Council offers its support in the progression οf this Richmondshire District Council: Council was made aware of the Area Partnerships meeting that took place on the 29th September. Councillor Blackie requested that the Parish Council become involved by sending a representative to the next meeting in order to have a say in where and how money is to be spent in the Dales. Councillor Blackie stated that the next meeting was likely to be sometime in January. The Council studied the planning application for the relocation of an existing aerial at Tan Hill Public House - it had no objections or comments. The Clerk was instructed to place the electors notice on the notice boards to encourage parishioners to register for their vote of they have not already done so. The Council is to be updated on a monthly basis via email. The Council had missed the date of the State of the District Debate as the information had come through in between meetings, they were informed that it had had a turn out of approximately 50 people and it concerned five areas and also covered awards. NYCC: The Clerk had received Parish planning - a guide to the support available from NYCC, as reference document, the Clerk would hold it for the Council. An email had been received asking for information regarding the parish plan. Because correspondence could not be verified as authentic the Council took the decision not to reply to the request.

Yorkshire Dales National Park: The Yorkshire Dales Housing development Plan Housing Working Group Call for Housing Sites progress report 2009 was studied by the Council. The withdrawal of the application for planning for listed building consent at Angram Farm, Angram was noted by the Council. It was also noted that the agents for the application had not responded to the Council's correspondence. Y.L.C.A.: The next Branch Meeting date was given to the Council. The Council was informed of the next waste Partnership conference to be held 06/11/09; unfortunately none of the Councillors could commit to attend The e-bulletin was made available to the Council. Looking at the schedule for the recent Reeth Show, we see it is filled with the varied list of prizes to be awarded for horses, sheep and vegetable produce. There are competitions for crafts, cakes, bread and jams, for children's drawings and photographs. But there are no longer categories which featured in the past. At the Reeth Fair and Cattle Show of 1848, held on the 3rd of November (which seems late!), as well as the usual agricultural exhibits and competitions there were two unusual items which seem to indicate an attempt to relieve the local ratepayers of a certain burden

- 1) There was a £2 prize offered for the working miner of good character who had brought up the greatest number of children to the age of 10 years (the age when they could start to work in the mines), without having had parochial assistance. There were no entrants.
- 2)A £1 prize was offered for a working miner who had brought up the greatest number of children to the age of 10 years without parochial assistance.(It seems that this could be awarded to someone of doubtful character).

That year there were 9 candidates and the





New Kid on the Moor

I was new to the moor and when I started I knew nothing. I didn't have a flag. I didn't know I needed one.

Grouse, to my way of thinking, were rather inelegant humorous birds, as they stamped and strutted, clucked and occasionally quacked their way across the moorland heather. However, I've seen them sit tight, protected by the cover of that heather, letting the beaters pass before taking flight. I've seen them fly up short of the butts and lift high over the heads of the beaters and I've seen them fly the gauntlet of the guns, just out of range, living to tell the tale. I've seen clouds below me, and china blue skies above. I've looked at eye level, into the colours of a rainbow and felt the sun on my back and the wind in my face. I've withstood buffeting by winds that seemed determined to lay me low and I've felt the warm westerly breeze that made the heather dance. I've listened to silence and heard, yes heard the single wing beat of a sparrow hawk taking flight in pursuit of it's quarry, and I've witnessed grouse taking to ground as buzzards circled overhead. I've seen fauna, new to me, fungi parading colours of reds and yellows, milky, lime green lichen with tiny bright scarlet flowers. A carpet of purple heather and every once in a while a sprig of lucky white. I've climbed hills, crossed becks, and jarred joints on hidden rocks. I've been tangled in bracken and in a moment, sunk knee deep into uninviting bog I've learnt not to step on lush green moss with star like fronds, for it's habitat is peat so soft that one simply sinks. I've learnt to cross marsh rushes by flattening the reeds to create a surface on which to stand. I have stood in rain, sunshine. hail and snow, and in winds blowing with the sole intension of ripping my beaters flag from my grip. I've seen heavy showers simply pass me by and experienced a number that did not. I've been surrounded by snow, glistening like

diamonds, revealing the previously unseen footprints of rabbit, stoat and fox. I've seen high and wild places with waterfalls, frozen by the severity of the overnight temperatures. I've stood on barren moorland, in swirling mists which together brought to mind grainy photographs taken of the Battlefield of the Somme. I've witnessed those who brought down three hundred brace in a day - and I've heard those with maybe less skill and expertise exclaim, with frustration, that 'They are flying too fast!' On more than one occasion I've felt around me the shower of falling shot and been relieved to hear the safety horn. I've been warm and often breathless but can recall times when I couldn't feel my fingers as I wrung water from my gloves. I've stood alone on a hillside and been part of a team but I've also seen beaters suddenly displaced by a swirl of twisting mist and witnessed others literally run out of energy as they crossed particularly punishing moorland I've learnt from hillfarmers, game-keepers, part and full time paramedics, ex-army, businessmen et al. I've heard jokes and stories and been part of the camaraderie. I've laughed and shared stories and been embarrassed at being so misplaced as to miss a drive. I've sat in rustic lunch huts before a blazing fire dining with students here to fund next year's college I've lost weight and gained or gap year. fitness and I have been so overtaken by sleep as to be rendered lousy company of an evening,And I gained all this and more because of a small brown bird with white stocking feet and red eyebrows.

And so now we'll leave them in peace to ride out the winter, to build their nests and to raise their brood, hoping that next year, once again they will proudly strut upon these moors attempting to outwit their pursuers and teaching the new kids on moor of things they did not know.


