

June is action packed with events in the Museum, so get your diaries out! In June we restart our popular Conversations in Craft series, with Josie Kyme the stained glass artist on 5th June, followed by Philip Bastow on 19th June. Heather Ritchie on 10th July and Ray Davies on 24th July. These informal evenings, which begin at 7.30, are a chance to find out more about how some of our celebrated makers got involved with their craft, how their work has developed and their plans for the future. Our second book launch lecture is on Saturday 12 June 7.30 pm. Hovell, will talk on A Muddy History of Britain: A Local View. This will be a trip through time, opening our eyes to the evidence of the past all around us - what to look for and how to make sense of what we find. PRIMARY CARE MENTAL HEALTH WORKER

This month I'd like to bring to your attention the services of Janet

lengthy title is Mason whose rather Primary Care Mental Health Throughout our lives there are times when we struggle to deal with emotional issues, for all kinds of reasons. People who are experiencing a great deal of stress, either at home or work, or who are going through changes in their lives can sometimes find it difficult to cope. Some experience anxiety symptoms or occasional bouts depression. This can make life difficult. but there is no need to try and deal with these things alone. If you feel you need some help, the first thing to do is come and see one of the doctors or Kim our Nurse Practitioner. We can then discuss how we can help, and look at different treatment options with you, including seeing our Primary Mental Health Care Worker, Janet Mason. Janet specialises in helping people through difficult periods in their lives, and getting them back on track, and she runs a clinic here at the medical centre on alternate Fridays, and can usually see patients within a couple of weeks. Her therapies are non-drug based. The first appointment will assessment of your needs and based on that assessment, a decision will be made, in full consultation with the doctors, about the next step. You will either see Janet for make therapy, or she can recommendations to refer you on for alternative services more appropriate to your needs. As always, the service is

entirely confidential and you can be assured you are in safe hands. Janet is a highly skilled professional, and a trained specialist in Cognitive Behavioural Therapy. Cognitive Behavioural Therapy

Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) aims to help you to change the way that you think, feel and behave. It is used as a treatment for various mental health and physical problems.

'Cognitive' being how we think about things and process our thoughts. 'Behavioural' is how we transfer those thoughts into how we behave. For example, someone who has a fear of flying may think that every time the 'plane encounters turbulence, it is going to crash. The behaviours exhibited can manifest themselves in a range of ways. The sufferer may experience panic attacks or actually want to try and open the doors to get off the 'plane!

A Cognitive Behavioural therapist will help the patient to concentrate on the 'here and now' and get them to focus on the positive aspects of the experience to try and halt the negative behaviour process.

CBT has been shown to help people with various conditions - both mental and physical conditions, including:

- Certain anxiety disorders including phobias, panic attacks and panic disorder
 - Depression
- Eating disorders
- Obsessive-compulsive disorder
- Body/appearance aversion
- Anger
- Post-traumatic-stress disorder
- Sexual and relationship problems
- Habits such as facial tics
- Drug or alcohol abuse

- Some sleep problems
- Chronic fatigue syndrome / ME
- Chronic (persistent) pain

As a rule, the more specific the problem, the more likely CBT may help. This is because it is a practical therapy which focuses on particular problems and aims to overcome them. CBT is sometimes used alone, and sometimes used in addition to medication, depending on the type and severity of the condition being treated. CANCELLATION OF APPOINTMENTS

I've mentioned this before and although it is rare for people to miss appointments, we are experiencing late cancellations. Some appointments, particularly with Kim, our Advanced Nursing Practitioner, can be as long as 30 minutes, so as you can imagine, if someone cancels at the last minute or even an hour before, it is very difficult to re-book. I appreciate at times this can't be avoided, but a big PLEASE to ask you to give us as much notice as possible if you need to cancel.

New Sports Facilities for the Dales People in the remote dales of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale can look forward to enjoying some new and additional sports facilities in the near future. After years of hard work in overcoming various obstacles, club restructuring and ensuring that the project complies with the many and varied requirements of planning, government and sports bodies guidelines. Reeth District Community Sports extremely pleased to announce that the project has finally received the go ahead. Thanks to substantial grants from the Football Foundation and Sport England, and generous support from North Yorkshire County Council, Richmondshire District Council, Reeth Parish Council and the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust through its sustainable development fund, pledges have now been received to cover the full forecast costs. Equally importantly, the Club recognises the tremendous support and generosity of the local people in supporting various fund raising events. and to the many individuals who have made donations to the project. These efforts have raised over £35,000; proof if any were needed, of how much local people support the need for modern sports facilities. Steve Porter, Chairman of the Athletic Club, said, "This project started as a pipedream six years ago and is now finally becoming a reality. On behalf of R&DAC I would like to thank all members of the development committee for their outstanding resolve over the last six years but mainly I would like to thank the local community contribution" The project is one of the largest undertaken in this remote rural area with a total budget of over £600,000, and includes the supply of electricity to the sports field. The Football Foundation, a sports charity funded by the Premier League, the FA and Government, is the largest individual funder, having awarded the project a grant of £344,444. Thorogood, Chief Executive of the Football Foundation, said, "We warmly congratulate Reeth & District Community Sports Club and the North Riding County FA for their hard work and

dedication in securing this grant from the Football Foundation. The new facility will greatly improve sports provision for the community." Sport England has £151,892 of National Lottery funding into the project. Anne Boyd, Sport England's Regional Lead for Yorkshire, said, "If community sports clubs want to attract and retain participants, they need to be able to offer quality facilities for everyone. The improvements to Reeth and District Community Sports Club's facilities will be welcomed by regular users and those who are new to sport." The facilities include a brand new pavilion with modern changing rooms and showers to meet 21st century requirements, along with storage room for maintenance equipment. Improvements will also be made to the playing area and a floodlit multi use games area (MUGA) will provide opportunities for playing other sports, including tennis, netball, basketball, hockey, five a side football and bowls. The club is confident that these facilities will lead to greater active participation, in line with government stated targets, and will extend the sports range far beyond the established football and cricket. The extra range of sports is open to people of all ages and sporting abilities and will be open from 10am to 10pm, giving time for active sport without the need for travel to other locations which can often involve a return journey of over 50 miles. The project has the full support of local government at all levels, as well as councillors and the MP, the Rt Hon William Hague. Local schools and other organisations have also given their support. County Councillor for the Upper Dales John Blackie who has been closely involved with the project said, "This is absolutely brilliant news for Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. In a survey nearly every household in the 2 Dales very strongly backed the project and the local fund-raising has been fantastic. All credit to the key funding partners who have recognised that deeply rural communities deserve access locally to quality sport and recreational facilities. And we owe a big debt of gratitude

to the project team who have worked so tirelessly and tenaciously to net this wonderful result".

Preliminary construction is now underway and a 34 week implementation period is forecast. More details will be released as the project progresses. For further information contact Derek Pollard 01748 884728.





Lock up your children the government is out to get YOU!

A bit of a departure this month as I get slightly political! Did you know that as Gordon Brown was announcing the general election date a little known bill was being passed into law that could have huge consequences for any users of the internet and effectively turns the law "innocent until proven guilty" on its head? The Digital Economy Act 2010 was sponsored by Peter Mandelson and covers a range of issues relating to the internet but there are measures about copyright infringement that could affect almost anyone that has internet access. The new law allows copyright holders to inform internet service providers (such as BT, Orange, TalkTalk etc.) about download activity via your internet connection that infringes their copyright. Under normal circumstances you may get a letter from your ISP warning you that you have done something wrong and not to do it again but ultimately they can be told to withdraw internet services from you altogether. The important part of this is that at no point does anyone have to prove that you are responsible for the copyright infringement - it could be one of your children used the internet to download some music or video or it could even be a stranger sitting outside your house who hacked into your wireless connection. It is even possible for criminals to forge their own internet address so the download operations appear to come from your internet connection. If

guilty and if you want to challenge the action of your ISP then YOU have to prove that you did not download the offending item. One thing that is not clear is the responsibilities of public internet access points in private homes. BT Internet (and some other ISPs) now enables your router/ hub to allow anyone to access the internet wirelessly via your connection (look in your wireless connection settings for BT Fon). The idea is brilliant in a way - share your connection at home with the wider world and in exchange you can access the internet via anyone else on BT nationwide. There is even a website which shows where all the wireless hotspots are active. Useful if you are away from home, however presumably any illegal activity will still be flagged as coming from your internet connection and it is not clear if you will be held responsible. The result of all this is that everyone needs to be vigilant as to how their internet connection is being used within your family (and make sure your children are aware that if they use filesharing sites it could have serious repercussions). Also do make sure that if you have wireless internet you have your security set to the maximum setting with a password that is unquessable! The Dandelion Plot....

It was the American poet William Carlos Williams who declared that yellow was not a colour. To him it was summer. Closer to home Wordsworth described his host of famous daffodils as they bowed in the breeze as being not yellow, but golden. Had they been merely yellow then quite possibly both he and his poem would have slid quietly into obscurity. Primrose yellow conjures posies of delicate creamy hue. Forsythia, for a seemingly short season, screams vibrant yellow from barren branches before quietening to deep green for the summer months. Meanwhile, along busy roadsides, across rolling fields and through the paving slabs of patios, dandelions appear with a rich egg-yoke orangey yellow all of their own. Dandelions rarely produce the same pleasurable impact as maybe some other plants do. They tend not to be the plant that springs to mind. When one considers a meadow one almost instinctively fills it with the heads of dancing Oxeye daisies and bright red poppies, maybe adding an occasional splash of harebell blue for contrast. The dandelion in all honesty rarely gets a look in. It's the plant that appears in the weed-killer advert, the one that pops up in the middle of the manicured lawn and through the crack in the patio. To use modern marketing parlance Dandelions need a make-over. Like many I guess, I rarely think about dandelions. On summer days we consume refreshing glasses of Dandelion and Burdock failing somehow to make the connection between the drink and the plant, or plants for that matter. How the two came together to make something so quintessentially English is one of the mysteries of lazy-day summers and raises the question as to who it was who actually thought that the combination of the two would make the drink it does. Although dandelions seem to struggle to be appreciated, it is the plant that once it opens its head to the sun everyone recognizes. There is no mistaking a dandelion as its fleshy stalk rises from its rosette of deeply indented lion's teeth leaves, from which it derives in name from the French

dent de lion. As so often is the case with wildlife and plants the dandelion is also known by a number of other more localised names such as blow ball because of the parachute puff of seeds that carry on the wind or, as in France, where it is referred to pissenlit (which refers to its diuretic qualities!). Other names include Lion's tooth, swine snout, yellow cankerwort, wild endive, puff ball they all refer to Dandelion none of which really make much effort to romanitise the plant in its naming. Golden Shout could maybe be a contender if ever the opportunity arose, for despite the fact that it is regarded as an annoying weed the Dandelion has much to shout about for through its high nutritious content it has become a subject of great interest for researchers, scientists, and herbalists the world over. For those of a scientific or nutritious disposition the Dandelion turns out to be a veritable store of minerals containing the likes of iron, calcium, magnesium and potassium, before being topped up with a healthy shot of vitamins A.B.C and D in their various guises. It is said that by combining Dandelion juices with those of stinging nettles and watercress produces an extremely useful system cleansing de-tox drink, although the flavour may not necessarily be to everyone's taste. Dandelions are bitter and nettles earthy which leaves the peppery bite of watercress to provide the saving grace on the flavour front in this instance! The greenery of dandelion plant can, it is said, be used in a variety of palatable ways. The leaves, for example, cropped up in salads long before rocket was the pre-washed oxygenated leaf of choice. Another way is for a few bright yellow heads, picked in sunshine, to be infused in boiled water to brew up, what turns out to be, a really quite refreshing cup of tea. A way of drinking in the countryside so to speak. And for those more patient among us Dandelion wine has been the traditional country wine of choice for many a year. The roots on the other hand are bitter and therefore less palatable. Even so they are not without their benefits. CONTINUED ON PAGE 26

Country-lore suggests that when the root is consumed in sufficient quantities they contain properties, aphrodisiac confirming that it is the bitter pill that does you good. However when consideration is given to the somewhat diuretic qualities of the plant maybe smaller amounts of root, ground and infused in boiled water to make a steaming beverage resembling coffee would be a viable alternative, offering a maybe less confusing outcome to gentlemen of a certain age. there we have it the dandelion, a diuretic aphrodisiac packed with vitamins and minerals that for a short time colours our roadsides and fields and despite the efforts of the agrichemical manufacturers will undoubtedly still be the first to pop up through the patio next year.




