Let them eat cake! (or drink wine)

The advice on consumption of safe limits of alcohol

has long been the focus of government and NHS concern The effectiveness of the messages being promoted is still under review, but the reality is that 33,000 deaths each year are associated with alcohol misuse, mainly resulting from stroke, cancer, liver disease, accidental injury or suicide. Particularly worrying is a steady increase in deaths in the 27 to 30 year old age group. The current price tag to the NHS of treating patients with alcohol related illness is a massive £3 billion pounds a year. Whilst I've no wish to stop anyone from enjoying a drink, it does no harm to raise awareness about how much is too much. So here goes: In the UK we measure alcohol in units. A unit of alcohol is, more or less, the amount of alcohol that an average healthy adult can metabolize or 'burn up' in one hour, rather like the measurement of calories. Without getting into the science of how a 'unit' is measured, the simplest way is to identify how many units are in your favourite tipple. For example:

An average bottle of wine (750ml) at 13.5% of alcohol = 10 units

 Most pub measures, even if you ask for a small glass of wine, are around 250ml. That's nearly 3.5 units.

Drinking a couple of glasses of wine, therefore, means you've had 7 units. Given that the recommended safe alcohol limit for women is 14 units per week, two

glasses of wine, twice a week means you've reached that limit. The recommended limit for men is 21 units (sorry ladies, men can metabolize alcohol more effectively than women).

Beer drinkers fare slightly better.

- A pint of bitter is 2.8 units and a pint of lager 3, but of course, some ales have a higher alcohol content
- A single shot of spirits, e.g. gin or whiskey is 1 unit, and a bottle of the popular 'alcopops' is 1.4 units.

When drinking at home these measurements become more difficult to judge, and the temptation to have a quick 'top-up' can take you well over the recommended limit. Here are a few tips on how to keep track:

- Use a small glass
- Drink 'spritzers' (eg. add water or lemonade to have a drink that lasts longer)
- Have a glass of water before you pour your drink so you don't use your tipple to quench your thirst
- Alternate alcoholic drinks with a soft drink
- Invest in a small measuring cup to measure the amount you are pouring
- Resist the temptation to take a gulp and top it up!
- Don't save up your units to have a 'big night' - even more dangerous to the body!

Kim, our nurse practitioner, mentioned that her teenage daughter was horrified to find out how many calories there are in alcohol.

She believes that if more young people realised how many calories they are consuming, it would have a greater impact than talking about units all the time. In a Department of Health survey taken last year of 2,000 adults, four in 10 admitted they didn't know the facts about calories in alcohol. So here goes:

- 115 calories in a small glass of wine (175ml)
- 170 in a pint of beer
- 52 in a single measure of spirits
- Anywhere between 90 and 225 in alcopops!

The average wine drinker puts on half a stone of fat in a year due to the excess calories they consume. This is because the body converts the alcohol content to sugar. A woman who drinks 2 large glasses of wine a day is not only over her recommended daily limit for alcohol consumption, but also takes in nearly 20% percent of her daily calorie allowance, at approximately 370kcals in total. In other words, the equivalent of eating a large slice of cake or two bars of chocolate! Sobering news! I do hope this clarifies the sometimes confusing messages. If you are concerned about your drinking levels, or feel you'd like to cut down, do come and have a chat with either Kim, Adrian or me. We have lots of resources that can help start you off on the right track and provide the support you need to maintain a healthy balance. All the best







Making and Storing Backups - Revisited

I had an interesting phone call this month about an article I wrote a while ago recommending backing up computers to DVD. Unfortunately I was not here to take the call and so from the message I gather the gist was that DVDs only have a lifespan of about 5 vears and that it is safer to store backups on hard disks. There is probably an element of truth in both of these statements and certainly for convenience and speed external hard disks win every time but there are a few things to consider with backing up important information. If you backup data to DVDs (such as photos or important emails and documents) how long will the DVD last? There are a number of considerations: the quality of the disk, the quality of the DVD writer you are using and the way the DVD is stored and handled. In terms of quality I see many people using unbranded or cheap supermarket brands of blanks DVDs and CDs. For quickly sending family and friends a copy of family photos or home movies these are probably fine but I wouldn't personally trust them for long term storage. By definition unbranded or supermarket disks are likely to be mass produced as cheaply as possible which means quality control is unlikely to be top of the agenda. You can expect lots of dud disks either immediately or down the line. If you want DVDs and CDs to last it is better to purchase a respected make. No one knows how long DVDs and CDs will last in the real world simply because they haven't been around long enough but, for example. Verbatim estimate the lifespan of their blank media to be up to 100 years from their testing in different environments - even if this is out by a factor of 5 and you only get

20 years and in 20 years time who will be using DVDs anyway - new storage formats will have replaced DVDs long before that. The DVD writer/drive you use also plays its part and without doubt different makes of drive have better success with certain brands of disk. Personally I always use reputable manufacturers for the drives I use (Sony, Pioneer etc.) rather than generic cheap drives often supplied with cheaper computers. In these cases I have found Verbatim and TDK CDs and DVDs very good. Replacement drives are pretty cheap these days - eq. Pioneer drives sell for about £25 so there is no real excuse to stick with a cheap unbranded drive. Storage and handling are vitally important for CD and DVD media. Use either standard CD jewel cases or acid free plastic wallets specifically designed for the purpose and store the disks in a clean, cool, dark, dry environment. Only handle disks by the edge - never touch the data surface with fingers. Finally there is a difference between making regular backups (every day for business with critical data, regularly for home users) and archiving data for long term storage. Too many times I have seen important disks simply slung in a box or drawer without a case and covered in scratches and dirt - don't expect to be able to use them when you need them! If you are archiving data don't rely on a single copy on DVD for the next 20 years - perhaps copy the disk every few years or transfer a copy to new media as it emerges. On the subject of external hard disks - they are very convenient for speed but have some distinct disadvantages. Firstly most guaranteed for 3 years (and that doesn't cover data recovery if you need a warranty claim). I have seen a number of external USB drives fail within warranty much to the frustration of the owners. External drives

can easily be knocked or dropped and can also be damaged by electrical spikes through the mains. If you do use external drives for backup make sure that you have more than one drive and rotate them when making backups so you don't have 'all your eggs in one basket'. Finally my Dales Broadband Survey is up and running until the end of November - do please take part and pass the word to friends and families in the area. MUKER: The Story of a Yorkshire parish. By Edmund Cooper.

Edmund Cooper's book on the history of Muker was written during World War Two, the result of hours spent transcribing the parish records found in a vicarage trunk. Reprinted today it reminds us of a time when dramatic changes were about to occur in the upper dale. Over centuries the social life of the villagers had changed slowly. The inpact of the post war years altered their lives in a fundemental way. Mechanisation of farming and the coming of motor transport made farming far less intensive, that, with universal education opened opportunities for the young to find employment and further education outside the Dale. The coming of electricity in the 1950s completely transformed the lives of women. The Welfare State cushioned old age with universal pensions and medical care. Agricultural subsidies made for greater security in farming.

Few remain in the village today who remember those pre-war days. Today the roads are cluttered with parked cars. Many houses are now occupied incomers or are holiday cottages only temporarily occupied. Only one shop and one pub remain, and the travelling shops that used to serve the villages are gone, a run to the supermarkets replacing their once social contact with the outer world We no longer see the tough little dales ponies mowing and raking the fields, followed by whole families struggling to bring in the hay. It does well to remember those past days, perhaps with nostalgia, but hopefully changes have been for the better

The book, which will make an excellent Christmas present, is obtainable from Reeth Post Office, Muker Shop, the Fat Sheep, Swaledale Museum or the Red Lion Inn, Langthwaite.

Upper Dales Family History Group

The first speaker of the new season was Rev David Wiseman from Skipton with the story of two of his relatives who were transported to Australia in the middle of the 19th century. David's ancestor George Taylor was a tanner from Kettlewell who was left with ten children when his wife died in 1829. In search of work, George moved his family to Burnley which had grown from a small village to a town of over 20,000 in the space of 40 years on the back of the cotton industry. There they lived in very primitive conditions in the Hill Top area. Before long, two of the family had turned to crime rather than cotton spinning. In 1840 one of the elder sons, Richard, was found guilty, along with others of stealing goods in Bradford and was sentenced to be transported for 10 years. While he was being held in the hulks at Chatham, awaiting transportation, his younger brother Simon, was found guilty at Preston of burglary and received an identical sentence. Each unaware of the other's fate, the brothers undertook the four month long voyage to Australia where Richard was on the last ship to take convicts into Sydney, There he worked as a cook at the hospital. Simon however was taken to Van Dieman's Land where 1 in 3 of the population at the time were convicts. Both men married fellow prisoners and stayed in Australia after they completed their sentences.

Simon eventually learned that his brother was in Sydney and set off to find him, arriving after a long journey, only to find that Richard had recently died. The story of the brothers came to light only when David's grandfather died and a trunk was discovered containing the letters home from Richard & Simon, written for them by other convicts. When David began to write and speak about his discoveries, an article in the journal of the Lancashire Family History Society led to a similar report in an Australian journal, which found its way into a doctor's waiting room where it was read by the receptionist whose husband was a great great grandson of Richard Taylor. As a result of that series of coincidences David is now aware of around 300 relatives in New South Wales



PUNCHARD GILL TOLL HOUSE

An historic building in the Yorkshire Dales National Park has been given a new lease of life. The Punchard Gill toll house was built beside the Reeth to Tan Hill road in Arkengarthdale and was used to collect tolls from passing traffic after the road was turnpiked in 1770. But it has been used as an agricultural store for the last 100 years and was badly in need of major repair work, according to Robert White, Senior Historic Environment Officer at the Yorkshire. Dales National Authority (YDNPA). "Thirteen toll houses are recorded in the National Park but their road side positions make them very vulnerable and most have been demolished or converted almost beyond recognition," he said

"Despite this one being in agricultural use for over a century, it is a Grade 2 listed building and has been described as "a rare and relatively unaltered survival of the turnpike road era in Richmondshire".

"It was on our Buildings at Risk register because of its poor condition." Thanks to a partnership between the YDNPA, Natural England and the owner, it has now been given a new lease of life. The extensive involved re-roofing, underpinning and rebuilding of stonework, repointing and renewing external joinery and guttering. Dr Margaret Nieke, Natural England's Historic Adviser, said: "There is so much history linked to this building - it's fantastic to see it restored to its former It shows how Natural England's agri-environment schemes are helping to safeguard the historic environment in this much loved part of the Yorkshire Dales." The building's owner, Paul Harker, who lives

in Punchard House, Arkengarthdale, said: "The toll house was deteriorating rapidly but, with the help of the YDNPA and Natural England, a thorough renovation has taken place and the building has now been preserved for future generations." The Reeth-Tan Hill-Brough road was turnpiked in 1770 and was improved to cope with increasing traffic, particularly from the coal field at Tan Hill, and the need to make it easier to transport smelted lead from Swaledale. The building was sited at the edge the enclosed Arkengarthdale, just as the road opens out onto moorland, in order to make it difficult to avoid paying tolls. In 1841 it was occupied by David Raine, a toll gatherer, who was described as a roadmaker in 1851. In 1861 the census reveals that John Calvert was a cattle jobber as well as a toll bar keeper but in 1871 the head of the household was a coal merchant and in 1881 a coal miner. The building is not mentioned in the 1891 and 1901 census returns which suggests it was then uninhabited. Turnpike trusts were generally wound up in the second half of the 19th century and responsibility for the roads passed to the County Councils in 1888. 





Reeth Parish Council September 27 Memorial Plague Coun Kendall reported that the plague outside the Burgoyne Hotel to commemorate the building's use during WW2 as the Reeth Battle School would be completed soon, mShelter The police would be asked to deal with problems of antisocial behaviour in the shelter. Highways A number of items on the list discussed with the highways Department in 2009 had not yet been dealt with and would be followed up. Metcalfe's Farm A letter sent in August from a resident to Mr Butterworth about enforcement of plannina permission stipulations had received response. Councillors suggested that a second letter be sent and copied to other members as there seemed to be some problem of communication, with comments from the parish council not reaching the planning committee. Land at the rear of Metcalfe's Farm had now been resurveyed. Following a site meeting, the area of village green at the front of the property had been fenced recobbling although this had not yet been started. Competition Results had been received from this year's Best Kept Village Competition. The judges had been particularly impressed by the shelter & public buildings but felt that the village was let down by the amount of litter. Yorkshire Water technician from Yorkshire Water had inspected problem on the Arkengarthdale Road. He reported that there was no problem with the network but that the water was coming from a drainage culvert. Memorial Bench A request for a bench on the green in memory of the late Janet Hodgson was Arkle Beck The Area Ranger approved. reported that he had met the landowner to discuss flooding at Rawcroft with a view to getting the beck back on its original course. This would be a long term scheme & he proposed to install a series of board walks to cross the beck at intervals, keeping the path open. Broadband Service Notification was received of a district council review of broadband availability within the parish. Playground Repairs were being carried out to the aerial slide. Market The market manager, Colin Garner, attended the meeting to discuss a number of matters which had arisen in connection with the weekly market. A letter would be drafted making it clear that the manager was responsible for the organisation of the market and that stall holders should be covered by their own insurance. It was also noted that some market rubbish had been left by the public waste bins and that more needed to be done about cars which were left parked in the middle of the market area. The electricity supply to the stalls was discussed with traders proposing a more central supply point which would avoid the use of long cables and councillors suggesting the use of generators.
