Where am I?

Press Release for a Fire Safety Project based in the Upper Dales in Richmondshire.

A recent fire in a Northumberland holiday home resulted in the death of two guests staying there. The family had only recently arrived there when the fire occurred during there stay. They dialled 999 and knew the name of the holiday home they were staying in but they didn't know the full address which caused a delay for the emergency services in locating the holiday cottage. To stop a repeat of the situation happening in Richmondshire Ian Canavan, a local resident in the village of Bainbridge has looked at a project that started as a result of the fire in Northumberland. The idea is a simple sticker with the full address of the holiday cottage is printed on it and provided free of charge to the responsible person for the holiday cottage to display in a prominent location so the quest can read it off to the 999 operator. Since the start of the year Ian has worked with many different partnerships through his local Parish Council to get the stickers printed with the address for each holiday cottage displayed. Ian has recruited a team of volunteers throughout the Upper Dales area to distribute these stickers to all registered holiday cottages in the area. has worked closely with North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service to ensure that the design and information on the sticker gives the address and an Ordnance Survey Map grid reference ensuring that the Fire Service have all the information needed to pinpoint where they are. Crew Manager James Titchener from North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service

highlighted the effort by Ian "This is a great example of how a local community can work with the Fire Service and other local organisations to tackle issues that can have a real impact on the safety of local residents and tourists in the area. Ian approached us with the idea for the stickers and asked what information we would need to identify someone's location in the fastest possible time in case of an emergency, by working closely with Ian we provided him with the information he needed to include on the stickers and advice on where they should be placed"

The stickers will be delivered between now and June 2011 to holiday cottages in the Upper Dales area in Richmondshire. If anyone would like anymore information on the project with a view to setting up something similar in there own area they can contact Ian Canavan on 01969 650582. Helpers need Help too ...

Slightly different column this month ...

In my alter-ego as Dales Computer Services I have the privilege of visiting lots of homes and offices in the area to resolve problems. Recently there has been another widespread spate of infections with the old familiar fake antivirus problems but there is a new twist to this issue which everyone should be aware of. The fake antivirus scam (and other nasties contracted form the internet) now seem to be attacking the core system files of Windows and these are a bit trickier to repair.

Windows (XP, Vista and 7) has an inbuilt checking system to ensure that the core files are valid and haven't been altered from when Microsoft supplied them. You can verify that your core files are consistent with a small built in tool called SFC. To use this tool in Vista and 7 click on Start and type CMD (don't worry Windows knows where you are going to type!). You should see CMD listed at the top of the left column - right click on it and select "Run as administrator" a warning will pop up but allow the program to run. (On Windows XP it is slightly different - just press and hold the Windows key - the flag at the bottom right of the keyboard and press R). In the window that opens on all systems type SFC /SCANNOW (note there is a space after SFC) and press Enter on the keyboard. SFC now scans all of your files and checks they authentic and haven't been modified by something nasty.

Hopefully you will get a message saying help me if you call me out) by having your

everything is OK but if not the best thing to do is to backup any important data (documents, pictures etc.) and then reinstall Windows either from a know good backup copy or from the original disks that came with the system.

This is where things get tricky and you can help yourself a lot ...

If your computer came with a set of disks (probably quite old now) then find them and keep them somewhere safe. If you have bought a computer in the last 2 or 3 years you probably didn't get any disks and this is where things are difficult. When you first switched on your computer it installed everything automatically - and probably prompted you to make recovery disks for emergency use. The trouble is I estimate that about 99% of people ignore the instruction and when things go wrong they have no disks or have lost them. Be aware that without recovery disks it will not always be possible to recover your computer - especially if the hard disk becomes faulty. If you haven't made these recovery disks follow the instructions that came with your computer and make them now (you will need to buy some blank DVDs). Some manufacturers are helpful and you can purchase recovery disks from them but many will not help and the only way to recover your system would be to buy a new copy of Windows 7 (currently the list price is £149.99 for Home Premium edition) and if your computer didn't originally have Windows 7 installed you may need to upgrade hardware too.

Be warned - recovering your system back to the way it was supplied to you without the manufacturers recovery disks is not a trivial undertaking. So help yourself (and help me if you call me out) by having your your recovery disks to hand as well as any other programs that are important to you (such as the original Microsoft Office disks) in case of emergency.

CARING FOR YOUR EARS

The ears are delicate special sense organs. We want to help you look after yours.

Ear Nose and Throat (ENT) specialists have shown that the wax (cerumen) produced by the skin of the ears has antibacterial properties and infection. The ears are designed to self clean by the skin growing in an outward direction bringing the wax with it. Using cotton buds thwarts this mechanism causing wax impaction (blockage of the ear

INTRODUCING OUR NEW by wax). Some groups of people such as the elderly, those with particularly hairy ears, or those that wear hearing aids can get a build up of wax which can lead to a number of symptoms, most notably hearing loss. There are a number of methods for dealing with ear wax. Some can be done at home. whilst others must be done by trained medical or nursing staff.

SELF HELP

A number of different drops can be bought to soften wax and promote the natural clearing of wax from the ears. This process can take a long time but is relatively safe. Drops can be used to avoid the need for ear syringing or to make it easier and safer to have ear syringing. A recent review of the major trials into ear drops showed that the use of drops is helpful but did not show which was best. We recommend either olive oil used for 14-28 days or sodium bicarbonate ear drops (available on prescription) used for 14 days. Other products such as ear candles have been shown not to work and can be harmful

HOW TO USE EAR DROPS

(Having someone else administer the ear drops may make it easier)

Wash your hands.

Warm the drops to body temperature by holding the container in your hands.

Tilt the affected ear up or lie on your side. Pull the ear upward and backwards.

Put the drops in your ear.

Gently massage the small skin flap (tragus) over the ear to help the drops reach the ear canal.

Keep the ear in this position for a few minutes.

EAR SYRINGING

Ear syringing should be recommended by a Doctor or Nurse who has looked inside the ears to determine whether it is safe to perform syringing. Cases where it is unsafe to syringe the ears include; perforation (past or present) of the ear drum, ear infection, presence of a grommet, history of ear surgery, young children, and when there is no wax to syringe. Even if there are no pre-existing reasons why syringing should not be done it does carry some risks. A UK study into the safety of ear syringing showed that problems with ear syringing were reported in the following proportion of patients;

Failure of wax removal (29%), Ear infection (17%), Perforation of the ear drum (15%), Damage to the ear canal (11%)

We aim to reduce the incidence of these complications by promoting the use of ear drops and ensuring ear syringing is deemed medically essential before we attempt it.





SWALEDALE FESTIVAL STARTS ON SAT. 28th JUNE.

Reeth Parish Council

Metcalfe's Farm In spite of a previous report to the contrary, the revised plans had not yet been passed by the planning authority. Councillors supported a request by neighbours for a site visit by the Planning to see the impact of development on their property, particularly the way the height of the new house could overshadow existing homes. Another letter to the planning department, copied to the parish council, pointed out that conditions attached to the original planning permission regarding parking, turning & site access had not been adhered to. Playground Coun Gardner confirmed that Mr Whitehead could carry out the repair work required, other than that to the aerial slide. It was agreed that the latter would be repaired now and reviewed in 6 months time to see if it had a viable future. It was noted that problems & damage were being caused by older youths using the area. Parking The status of the roadside around the Buck Corner was still uncertain. However, regardless of whether it was pavement or highway, it was agreed that it was still an offence to park so close to a junction and that this should be better enforced. Shelter The police had now spoken to the youths playing football in the shelter and suggested they move to the playing field. Speed Matrix Speed limit enforcement measures had been put in place near the school and local children were being involved in producing road safety leaflets and posters. Road Closures Notification was received that a minimum 10 weeks notice was now required for rolling road closures parades. Market Councillors considered an application for another greengrocer's stall. Coun Gardner pointed out that there was already competition for trade with the permanent businesses around the village and

it was agreed that support should be given to those stall holders who came to the market all year round. Remembrance Sunday The new order of service, which had been distributed for consideration at the previous meeting, was approved. Healaugh Square Estimates had been received and considered for the repairs to cobbles in the square. Coun Gardner would project manage and oversee the work. Reeth Green Coun Kendall drew attention to the amount of grass and weeds growing under tables and up house frontages along the High Row & pointed out that when permission was given to put tables outside businesses, this was conditional upon the area beneath being kept clean and tidy. The clerk would approach business owners to remind them of their responsibilities. Baker would be asked to attend to the area around the bandstand which was becoming overgrown and open up the gulley and drain there. National Park The council would send a letter objecting to the likely level of local representation in the proposed extended area of the National Park. Litter Bins Coun Allinson reported that the litter bin on the edge of the green opposite High Row was too small for the position and overflowed too He proposed that it should be quickly. swapped for one of the double ones near the shelter. Cattle Grid Complaints had been received about the new cattle grid on the Arkengarthdale road which had been set higher than the road surface. Next Meeting The next meeting will be the AGM at 7pm on Monday, May 9, in the Memorial Hall. This replaces the meeting originally planned for May 23 and has been brought forward because of the council elections on May 5.

WESLEY'S CHAIR COMES HOME TO THE DALE.

The Spensley family from Blades, just above Low Row were some of the earliest supporters of John Wesley in Swaledale. With other local mining families they formed a Methodist Society there and created a meeting place in the 1750s. In 1761 Wesley made the first of his five visits to preach there, always staying with the family of William Spensley who, according to H. Speight's Romantic Richmondshire, had "...fitted up a cottage here adjoining his house for divine worship." A tangible reminder of those visits has now come home to Swaledale in the form of a chair said to have been commissioned by the Spensley family especially for Wesley's use. The ash chair dates to the mid 18th century and is of a type known as a gentleman's reading chair, with arms to support the elbows. The panelled seat would originally have had a thin horsehair cushion known as a 'swab' possibly covered in leather and would have been slightly higher. Many years of standing on a stone-flagged floor, which would have been regularly washed but not completely dried, have gradually rotted away the feet and about two inches have been cut off the legs. In the 1970s the chair was given to Mrs Margaret Batty, wife of the then Methodist minister by descendants of the Spensley family and has been in her home in Edinburgh ever since.

Having had the chair professionally restored Mrs Batty has kindly donated it to the Swaledale Museum in Reeth, just a few miles down the road from its original home at Low Row. The Museum would love

The Festival of Britain 1951 and its Design Legacy

The Festival of Britain was described as a riot of 'fun, fantasy and colour'. Sally Hoban looks at how and why the Festival had a huge impact on people's perception of design - including graphics, textiles, ceramics and industrial design - and on design itself. Plea to dog owners during birds' breeding season.

Walkers exploring the Yorkshire Dales National Park are being urged to think about ground nesting birds over the next few months. As the birds start to incubate eggs and raise their young, dog owners are asked to keep their pets on a lead to reduce the chances of disturbing them. And to help visitors get to know the types of birds they may see, the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) has produced a free, pocket-sized leaflet showing the main five species, along with descriptions of their appearances, their calls and their favourite habitats. The Authority's Ranger Services Manager, Alan Hulme, said the opening up of huge areas of the National Park under the Countryside and Rights of Way Act in 2005 meant that people no longer had to stay on paths and could walk on open countryside. "This has meant that parts of the National Park that were previously no-go areas for visitors including some used by ground nesting birds - are now seeing more humans," he said. "We are trying to highlight the fact that these breeding areas are vulnerable to disruption by passing walkers and their dogs. It is for this reason that access may be restricted to only using rights of way on some of the moorland areas of the National Park. "Disturbance can mean that adult birds flee the nest. leaving eggs to get cold or, later, leaving newly-born hatchlings exposed to the elements and to predators. Malcolm Petyt, YDNPA's the Member Champion for Recreation Management, said: "The message is that dogs and birds don't mix and we hope the leaflet will help people to identify the birds and the places they are likely to be as they raise their chicks over the next few months."

Called 'Ground Nesting Birds - the Big Five in the Yorkshire Dales National Park', the leaflet gives details about skylarks, lapwings, red grouse, oystercatchers and curlews, as well as advice on ways of minimising contact with them. It is available at National Park Centres and Park Information Points.
