Residents of Healaugh past and present gathered on the 12th February to celebrate the 100th birthday of Miss Rae Scott whose associations with the village go back half her lifetime. Rae was born in Hebburn on February 5, 1911, and attended Newcastle Church High School where she went back to teach geography after graduating from Cambridge. One of her fondest memories is of the wartime evacuation of the school to Alnwick where they were given the run of the castle, courtesy of the then Duchess of Northumberland! After the war she became Deputy Head at Darlington High School, now Hummersknott School, remaining there after it became a comprehensive to see the last intake of the High School girls through to the end of the sixth form. When an old friend retired and came to live with her they bought the house in Healaugh to use at school holidays and weekends. Until she was 97 Rae regularly drove herself to Swaledale from her home in Darlington where she still lives independently. # Computer Corner

No excuses to use the same password everywhere

A common complaint from customers is that they can't remember lots of passwords and so they just use the same one everywhere. This is a really bad idea as someone only needs to pinch your email address and password from one website and they can guess you might use the same details on shopping sites etc...

A long time ago I mentioned using RoboForm for generating difficult to guess passwords and remembering them for you. Recently Roboform changed its licensing policy so that you have to pay for an annual subscription and their software has become less reliable because of bugs. Luckily there is another program which can do the job (and in my opinion better than RoboForm). The program is call LastPass and even better it is free. It works like this: Go to www.lastpass.com and download the installation program to your computer. Double click on the file to install it. During installation it will ask for a number of pieces of information to make your passwords secure but to understand what is going on you need to understand a little of the mechanics of how it works (yes I know some eyes have glazed over but I will try to keep it simple). During installation you are asked to set up an encryption code and also an online account (which is free). Everytime you save a new password when you fill in a form on a webpage it is stroed on your computer. The encryption key you chose during setup is used to encrypt all of your data with military grade encryption and the encrypted data is store on the server at LastPass in the account you set up there. No one at LastPass can decode your encrypted data so it is important you keep a copy of your encryption code and account details. Once set up a new button appears in your browser (looks like a red star near the top right corner of the window) and whenever you have to fill in a form on a webpage or choose a new email you can use

LastPass to record that information. It will even make up new, hard to crack passwords for you on your behalf and remember them so you don't have to. The advantage of all this is that you can choose a new difficult password everytime you need to (so no using the same password more than once) and LastPass not only remembers the password but will fill in the login page next time you visit that website automatically. Your online account means that if you are at somebody's house and need to remember a password you can log in to your online account and look up a password. LastPass works with most common browsers on Windows (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Google Chrome, Safari and Opera) and also works with common browsers for people using Macs and Linux machines. If you pay a subscription (£1 per month) you also have access to lots of other features including using LastPass on mobile phones (such as iPhones and Blackberrys) as well as the ability to install all of you passwords onto a USB stick and use it in any computer without having to install any software. You can even use LastPass to remember passwords for security conscious applications on your computer (such as book keeping and accounts software that require you to log in). LastPass is a brilliant idea and works really well - why not give it a go. Middleham and Dales Local History Group Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> April 2pm Middleham Key Centre

The third John Rettie Memorial Lecture Fields, cow pastures and commons: environmental management in the Pennine Dales 1400-1750 Dr Angus Winchester

John Rettie, a renowned international journalist, humanitarian and dalesman, was chairman of this group until his death in January 2009. This third lecture to honour his memory will be given by Dr Angus Winchester, senior lecturer in history at the University of Lancaster and author of The harvest of the hills: rural life in northern England and the Scottish borders 1400-1700. Before enclosure in the 18th and 19th centuries much land in the Pennine dales was shared and used jointly, for at least part of the year. Open fields in the dale bottoms were enclosed comparatively early but shared grazings in cow pastures on the lower fellsides and common waste on the higher remained communal resources - and in some cases remain so today. How did communities manage these shared resources in the past? Using the local rules and byelaws made by manor courts and by informal meetings of commoners, this talk ask how successful Pennine communities were in devising sustainable systems of communal land management. Dr Winchester has spent many years engaged in research on upland landscapes and the environment in the north of England during early modern times and is an acknowledged expert in the field of agricultural history. Middleham and Dales Local History Group is therefore delighted that he has agreed to give this memorial lecture on what promises to be a fascinating subject of great local interest. Annual membership of the group is £10 and visitors are welcome to attend individual meetings for a fee of £3. Changes to the NHS You may well have seen coverage in the press about GPs taking over the running of the NHS in the near

future, so I thought I would provide you with a bit more information about this.

The plans from the government are still quite fluid at the moment, but in our area (Hambleton and Richmond), the practices will appoint a committee of doctors and managers who will sort out the buying in of the various services we need, such as hospital appointments, X-rays etc. Each practice will have a vote when decisions need to be made, but the day to day will be conducted by committee. The hope is that local services will be tailored to the local population and that competition between people provide services to the NHS will raise quality standards and reduce cost.

I try to stay out of politics wherever possible, but my personal feeling is that healthcare is not the type of commodity that can easily be bought and sold, in that a lot of the aspects of quality (such as continuity of care) cannot be easily measured and therefore given a price. Scotland and Wales have got rid of the 'market' within the NHS and this has led to better working between GP practices and hospitals, which benefits patients. For some reason, the NHS in England is moving in an altogether opposite direction and inviting different companies to bid for contracts to provide different services which may lead to a fragmentation of care breakdown and in continuity and communication. There are currently between GPs the ongoing talks and government about this issue.

Day to day, things should look no different at Reeth Medical Centre. Although our overall allocation of money has fallen year on year in real terms, we continue to keep our costs within budget, for example using generic medicines wherever possible to keep within our annual £250k prescribing budget.

There are tough times ahead for the NHS and there may be further restrictions in what GPs can and can't refer for treatment, but we will try to use our vote to make sure we can get the best possible outcome for our patients.

I hope this helps to clarify things.







#### HUDSON HOUSE

Dales' councillors made impassioned pleas at the YDNP Authority meeting February 3 that funding to Hudson House in Reeth should not be cut in 2013. This was but one of the recommendations made in the proposed budget following the major reduction in the Defra grant to the YDNP A for the next financial year. David Butterworth, the YDNP A chief executive. reminded members that in the next four years the Authority could expect a £2 million reduction in its budget. "A third of our budget is disappearing, "he said. And so the members were presented with a budget in which it was proposed to cut 11 programmes, cut back heavily on its funding to the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust and to make savings in other areas. those proposed o f savings was to stop funding Hudson House the YDNP A's present lease contract ended in 2013. "I suspect that recommendation would been 2011 if we had not been contractually obliaed." said the. Executive. David Butterworth. Yorks County Coun John Blackie led the opposition to that proposal backed up by Grinton Parish Coun Harold Brown. Coun Blackie. represents the Upper Dales, argued that the funding to Hudson House could be reduced by £7,000 to £20,000 a year the money coming with YDNPA's community understanding budget which runs t o around £600,000. "In my view there is sufficient within Community Understanding to rearrange some of the staffing Hudson House. resources.

and our continued presence there, does a tο promote community engagement within Swaledale Arkengarthdale at a time when the looking government İS for community engagement." Both he South Lakeland Dt Coun Kevin Lancaster reminded members that when the YDNP A sold the its building Reeth it had been with understanding that the Authority would continue to have a presence in that town so as to provide a service to Arkengarthdale. Swaledale and Lancaster said: "I think it is absolutely headed for this to be contemplating pulling out of places Reeth. - 1 believe fundamentally part of what the present government is wanting to with the Big Society - Hudson House is, in ways, many а pre-exemplar Society." In a the Bia passionate statement Parish Coun Brown pointed out that Hudson House was the shop window for the YDNP A in Reeth and the two northern Dales. "If we pull out of Reeth the National Park will be criticised as it was in the past. We are feeling very disappointed about this news." Dent Parish Coun Graham Dalton and Richmondshire Dt. Raymond Alderson supported the proposal to continue funding Hudson House. Others, however, felt that the proposed budget should go into the consultation period unchanged. They hoped the consultation that durina period more information might become available which would help members make the right decisions when the budget was discussed again in March, before being

ratified. The Chief Executive, David Butteworth, agreed with that. He said: "When we were looking at the budget as a we. looked at the whole essential provision within the National Park. We compared Reeth to the four other visitor centres we have got - Hawes. Grassington Aysgarth Falls, Malham. There is no comparison - it gets half the number of visitors and it cannot compete in retail activity." He added that unlike the other four it had not been listed recently among the top in the visitor centres York and Humber region. He added that the YDNP A was just one of the partners in the community office at Hudson House with Richmondshire District Council having the main responsibility for it. Coun Blackie responded: "I am disappointed with what Butterworth to say. This is a front line service. It's at the heart of the local community." He added that it did not get as many visitors as the other centres because not as many people visited Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. His proposal to continue supporting Hudson House was defeated. So now the communities of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale must make their voices heard during the consultation period.

Later, when introducing the Save Hudson Campaign House Coun Blackie stated: "The likelihood that the withdrawal of the **YDNP** result in the complete collapse of Hudson qo down incredibly badly with local people, and set back the reputation of the Authority where it was in the 1990s. Then after a number οf adverse planning decisions the YDNP A was regarded with hostility outright amidst communities in the Two Dales, and its local people have verv memories. "Its lead involvement in Hudson house has since led to the Authority being gradually accepted in these communities, this decision. but perverse confirmed in March, will take it straight back to the bad old days."

From Councillor Blackie Sadly the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) reverted to type at its meeting last Thursday (Feb. and made а preliminary decision to withdraw completely their and all its fundina presence Hudson House in Reeth, the local Tourist Information Centre, the Community Office for Swaledale and Arkengarthdale (the Two Dales), and One Stop shop for a number of other organisations, that has been open since 2003. This was despite my proposal, made at the meeting, and very strongly supported by Cllr. Harold Brown and Cllr. Raymond Alderson, both from Swaledale. that the YDNPA should maintain its service at Hudson House beyond 2013, at a reduced level of staffing contribution towards total running costs of the Community enterprise. David Butterworth. Executive of the YDNPA, led by suggesting that if he had his way, withdrawal would take place in April 2011 but there was an agreement in place for the 2 years. Members of the Authority, taking up his lead, voted my proposal down by 11 votes to 7, with a number of abstentions. In doing this, the YDNPA have

complete closure, as its staffing and financial contribution was an essential piece of the jigsaw of funding that keeps the Community enterprise going day to day. It is also seen as the lead Authority for Hudson House, and by voting with its feet to abandon ship, it is very likely that other public service organisations based at the Centre, all strapped for cash in this Age of Austerity, will do likewise. As 3 former Directors of Hudson House, who all had to resign very recently so that we were free to fight the proposal at the YDNPA, we made it crystal clear at the meeting that the prospect of complete closure was on the cards and the blame would lie fairly and squarely at the Authority's door, but our warnings went unheeded. It is incredibly disappointing. I proposed that £20,000 should be ring fenced for continuing the YDNPA presence at Hudson House in the future, just 3% out of a budget line of £600,000 for the Dales Information Centres. The £20.000. down by 26% from the £27,000 of previous years, represents a miserly 0.47% of the total funding of £4.5 million the YDNPA are granted by DEFRA. Obviously the message loud and clear is that the YDNPA cares not a jot for the best interests and well being the communities Swaledale of and Arkengarthdale, а hugely important constituent population of the Yorkshire Dales National Park. Its commitment despite the cut in its DEFRA funding to "maintaining front line services, including the visibility of these services", are patently just weasel-words, and will have a very hollow ring to them, from the fell-

very probably condemned Hudson House to tops and in the valley bottoms of The Two Dales, to its local communities. It is also a bizarre position to take Governance Review by DEFRA aimed at increasing the engagement and involvement of all National Park Authorities with their local communities. The YDNPA officially responded very positively to this Review in early February with a commitment to try much harder in the future. Oh dear !! Hudson House was established in the old Barclays Bank in Reeth in 2003, and is flagship considered а Community enterprise initiative, and a Beacon lead for deeply rural communities throughout the country. The various services it offers are of vast importance to local people, local businesses and visitors to Swaledale and Arkengarthdale, and are considered to be invaluable in an area where acute access to services because of its remoteness will always be a barrier to progress. likelihood that the withdrawal of the YDNPA will result in the complete collapse of Hudson House will go down incredibly badly with local people, and set back the reputation of the Authority to where it was in the 1990s. Then after a number of adverse planning decisions the YDNPA was regarded with outright hostility amidst the communities in the Two Dales, and its local people have very long memories. lead involvement in Hudson House has since led to the Authority being gradually accepted in these communities, but this perverse decision, if confirmed in March, will take it straight back to the bad old days. This is especially so as there was a commitment made by the YDNPA Swaledale and Arkengarthdale to maintain its presence when it sold off its old TIC

building facing Reeth Village Green, and became the lead player for what was then the fledgling the Hudson House project. Repudiating this commitment for 0.47% of its total funding is almost unbelievable and frankly nothing less than a dereliction of its duty to engage with local communities throughout the National Park. What can be done ??

The Campaign to "SAVE HUDSON HOUSE" starts today because whilst the writing for its future might appear to be on the Wall, a very loud and very clear barrage of support from the Two Dales Communities (and beyond) for the YDNPA continuing beyond 2013 could win the day. Authority has launched a consultation on its Budget and future direction, and the result of this consultation will be taken into account when the final decisions are made at its meeting in March. Members of the Authority who abstained said they wanted to hear from the Two Dales communities (and beyond) before making up their mind, and with the vote so very close last Thursday, there is every possibility that a resounding hue and cry to "SAVE HUDSON HOUSE"

be triumphant. After I pointed out to the YDNPA that in parts of Upper Swaledale and Arkengarthdale there is no terrestrial TV, no radio reception, no mobile reception, no decent telephone system, no e-mail, no broadband, and no World-Wide-Web, it has agreed to accept any form of consultation response, rather than just an on-line submission. So you can go on-line at www.yorkshiredales.org.uk or use the online surveys in hard copy that are now in National Park centres, including Hudson House. You do not have to plough through

all the questions on the on-line survey, just simply fill in one of the free-form boxes towards the end of the survey saying how much you value the services at Hudson House, and that includes those provided there by the YDNPA. Or you can simply e -mail or post in a letter with a couple of lines indicating your very strong support for Hudson House. If you are e-mailing, corinne.hirst@yorkshiredales.org.uk, and by post send it to Corinne Hirst, at the YDNPA, Yoredale, Bainbridge, Leyburn DL8 3EL. You must get your response in by Thursday, 10th March, by 10.00 am !! Hudson House is far too valuable to the communities in the Two Dales to lose, and if it closes, it will never open again. I urge all those who will be worse off should it close down, and those who have sympathy for its plight, and the plight of the communities it serves, to tell the YDNPA just how important Hudson House is, how valuable i t is. and demand the Authority to continue its presence and funding beyond 2013. 





MELBECKS PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 21st December 2010, had been circulated but because the meeting had not been quorate, the minutes were read through diligently at this meeting, any actions or decisions from the last meeting were discussed and approved. Only then were the minutes approved, agreed and signed. MATTERS ARISING: The Clerk was instructed to find out where exactly the Endurance Rally is to go through Melbecks Parish. The proposed access Forum of the National Park is to be disbanded in order to economize, as part of Government cut backs. HIGHWAYS: The street lighting fault has not yet been reported to the relevant body as the clerk was awaiting feedback from the local SPCO. The clerk was instructed to write to highways regarding the streetlight. RICHMONDSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL: The Richmondshire Small Parish Insurance Scheme costs £142.01 and has been deducted from the April precept. The local council policy schedule was made available to the Council. The Street Naming and Numbering Shared services were deemed not relevant to Melbecks Parish.. Information regarding the Big Lunch -Sunday 5th June 2011 was discussed, but deemed not relevant. NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL: Consultation on Library Proposals - hours are to reduced, volunteers are to be sought and the removal of 10 mobile libraries, although not the super mobile, is proposed. The Council will await further decisions. The Planning Committee Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February was noted, although

there is nothing concerning Melbecks Parish on the agenda. Sustainable Energy Production Consultation Draft was made available to the Parish Council. OTHER CORRESPONDENCE/ AOB: An application for the position of parish clerk had been received. This was read by the Council which agreed not to discuss the application and leave it in abeyance until any other applications had been received interviews had been arranged. The clerk was instructed to invite any applicants for interviews before the next meeting. The Council was informed that it is CENSUS year and that Census Day is on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2011. North Yorkshire LINK was made available to the Council, after some discussion it was decided that the Council did not wish to receive anv information by email. Country AIR was made available to the Council.. reported that a street light in Gunnerside is on permanently and that another street light in Low Row is not working. The Parish Clerk was instructed to inform the relevant DATE AND TIME OF NEXT MEETING: The next Annual Parish Meeting will be held in Gunnerside Village Hall on 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2011. Proceeded by the Parish Council Meeting and preceded by any interviews for the position of Parish Clerk.

Last month we received several
reports of suspect vehicles in
the areas of Marske,
Arkengarthdale and in

Fremington a person was found asking for scrap metal. A vehicle was stolen from Reeth and found abandoned off the Arkengarthdale road. There was also an incident involving theft of Red diesel taken from storage container Arkengarthdale. Several Traps have been removed from the moor in Gunnerside over a period of time .A report in the area of Ellerton Abbey brought to our attention two males who were attempting to sell items at the door such as straps and gloves. In neighbouring areas there have been incidents of trailer thefts and further guad bikes have been stolen. We would urge everyone to ensure vehicles are left secure at all times even if you are just popping indoors for a brief time. Further checks will be taking throughout the Dales, please drive with care and consideration for other road users. It is often very difficult to see cyclists on the roads and walkers in particular may be forced out into the road as there is often no pavement and very little grass verge to stand on. Any vehicles that are found to he parked inappropriately could result in a fixed penalty. Pavements should be unobstructed for the use of pedestrians. It is advisable to park fully on the road where permitted as opposed to partially on the road and pavement which can result in wing mirrors being damaged because drivers fail to stop behind a parked vehicle and attempt instead to squeeze by when

meeting oncoming traffic when there is insufficient room. As usual "Surgery" times and dates are sighted at the front of Hudson House in Reeth on a poster, the purpose of which is to give members of the public the opportunity to voice any issues or concerns or queries they may have and done in a confidential manner. If the times are not convenient please feel free to pop into Hudson House and enquire with the front office staff as to whether or not I am available and I will be happy to assist. # Message from the SWALEDALE MUSEUM in Reeth

Don't forget Friends of the Museum lectures are now at Fremington Sunday School. On March 9th at 2pm Chloe Parker, will talk on 'Through the Dark Ages on a Hogback'. Hogbacks are stone carved A nglo-Scandinavian sculptures from 10th-12th century England and Scotland. Their function İS generally accepted as grave markers. There are particular concentrations o f hogbacks in Yorkshire and Cumbria, the former being their likely area of origin. Our 13th April talk reverts to our summer timetable. starting at 7.30 pm with Mark Whyman, writer and photographer from Richmond whose talk is entitled 'From Domesday Book to Organic Veg, the Story of Richmond Market'. On 11th May at 7.30pm David Johnson, author & Chairman of the Ingleborough Archaeology Group will be looking at 'Lime Burning & the Land'. We are delighted to have received some very unusual objects on loan for our Needlework Accessories exhibition: 35 silver pins, a thimble, a pair of scissors and a scrap of brass that were found hidden under the window sills and around doorways of a house in Healaugh. According to the Deliberately Concealed Garments project that began in 1998 at the Textile Conservation Centre in Winchester, they may have been concealed as a protective device to ward off evil or used as countermagic to deflect a curse or other negative circumstance, such as illness or economic blight considered to be the consequence of malevolent spirits or witches. They may also have been viewed as 'lucky things', perhaps heirlooms from an ancestor or

from another person considered to be spiritually powerful and so they were perceived as lucky for the household. Or did builders constructing or altering the building or the householders themselves just want to leave their 'mark'? Debate still continues about concealed objects and folk magic. There is very little extant documentary material that describes concealment practices most likely because it may have been believed that speaking about the concealment may have reduced it's 'effect'. Do you know of any other such finds? We would love to know! We are delighted that our vintage haberdashery shop has been coming in handy. Emma Carter, who makes historic costumes, who has just moved into the Dales Centre in Silver Street, Reeth needed some lace and buttons for an Edwardian dress she is making. We were glad to oblige. Geoff Turner who specialises in World War I reenactment desperately need some 'mangle buttons', that is washable linen covered ones, for his period underwear! We sold them to him on the condition that he and partner show how to make US 'huswifes' for our Needlework Exhibition! We also have plans for an historical underwear event, we are in consultation with the Artyfacts ... watch this space for developments!
