<u>Hudson House</u> - future assured by National Park Authority decision

Members of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) today (March 29) abandoned plans to pull out of a contract that might have caused the closure of a Swaledale. community office in Authority currently rents space in Hudson House - the community office in Reeth - to run a National Park Centre (NPC) and Tourist Information Centre. The contract expires in January 2013 and the YDNPA proposed not to renew it as part of a drive to cut costs following a reduction in its grant from Government of nearly £1.9m (or 31 per cent) including inflation over the next four years. The move was one of a raft of cost-cutting proposals in a draft budget that was put out for public consultation. But Members today decided to ensure the future of the office by renewing the contract and continuing the Authority's presence there. The amount the Authority will spend on the NPC and TIC in Hudson House will be reduced from £28.000 to £20,000 and the money to continue operating from the building will be found by cuts to other budgets, Members decided. Carl Lis, the YDNPA's Chairman, said: "We have listened to the concerns of people living in Reeth and further afield who value the community office as an important facility in the town, and we have decided to try to find money from other projects so that we can renew the contract. "Although there are problems with the performance of the National Park Centre compared to our other NPCs, we have been told that our involvement in the whole Hudson House venture is critical to the long-term survival of this valuable community resource. "Obviously the decision will mean that we

by have to find savings elsewhere in our budgets, but Members decided it was a price worth paying." Stuart Parsons, the Authority's Member Champion Promoting Understanding, said: "We are only one of a number of organisations operating services within the building others include Richmondshire District Council, North Yorkshire County Council and the North Yorkshire Police Authority as well as a number of smaller organisations but our proposed withdrawal obviously caused a lot of concern over the future of the community office as a whole. "We asked people what they thought about our budget proposals and we have listened and acted on their responses. At a time when so many public services and facilities are under threat, it is important that we give as much support as possible to the communities within this beautiful National Park." Public consultation began on February 4 on the draft budget plans to cut 12 work programmes, introduce 34 job losses and to reorganise the Authority's structure to meet the demands of the reduced budget. The exercise generated 396 responses, 370 of which were from individuals and 26 from organisations. The topic that drew most comment overall was Hudson House. respondents were either opposed to the closure of the NPC services at Reeth and/ or concerned that the withdrawal of Authority funding for Hudson House could ultimately result in its closure and hence the loss of the wide range of services provided to the local community. New browser and other gripes ...

Over the past week, or two, Microsoft has been pushing the new version of Internet Explorer 9 onto computers via Windows Update. There are some gotchas with this release you should be aware of. Firstly this is the first version of Internet Explorer that will not appear on Windows XP as it is not compatible. This upgrade will only work on machines running Windows Vista or Windows 7. Over the last week I upgraded to Internet Explorer 9 and have had a number of problems. Firstly it seems incredibly slow on my machine. I presume my computer is powerful enough to run it properly - 6 core processor, 16Gb of memory and 64-bit Windows - but it runs really badly and is very 'flaky'. I have also had a number of customers with questions about problems on their computers the most important of which is a problem on Windows Vista machines. Vista replace Outlook Express with Windows Mail as the free email program in Windows. If you are still using Windows Mail (note this is not the same as Windows Live Mail - confusing isn't it?) then you should know that Windows Mail is not compatible with Internet Explorer 9 - most notably fonts get messed up and buttons disappear. If this is the case there are a couple of options to solve your problems: either upgrade Windows Mail to Windows Live Mail (you may already have this on your computer as Microsoft have a habit of sneaking Windows Live onto your machine when you aren't looking - otherwise check Windows Update manually) or uninstall Internet

http://windows.microsoft.com/en-US/ windows7/how-do-i-install-or-uninstallinternet-explorer-9) and go version 8. If you uninstall or haven't yet had IE 9 inflicted on you can avoid the experience by going to Windows Update (Click start, type Windows Update and click the link that appears at the top) and hide the update so that it doesn't get installed. Once all the bugs are ironed out and IE 9 works properly you can always go back and unhide it but I recommend, at least for the time being, that you don't bother with IE 9! Luckily I don't use Internet Explorer - I prefer Mozilla Firefox which has also started pushing an update from version 3 to 4. Should you update from version 3 to 4? On the whole I would say yes. If you have lots of extensions installed you may find some of them are not compatible yet with the new version and they will be disabled during the upgrade. If this causes a problem uninstall version 4 and reinstall version 3 and everything should work as before. I have found the move to Firefox 4 seem to work fine - although you may find the new look takes a bit of getting used to as you hunt for missing options - they are there ... treat it as a game to find them again! Finally one of the things that has put me off moving to Google Chrome was the extension I use in Firefox called AdBlock Plus. This brilliant extension displays all your websites with the adverts stripped out - no more flashing banners or popups trying to sell you things. Well the good news is that the good people from AdBlock plus have now released a version for Google Chrome - and it works well. If you use Chome trip over to www.adblockplus.org Explorer 9 (instructions at and install this free addon and make the

internet a more pleasant experience again. 624203. It also makes it a little safer because you don't get to see the annoying ads which infect many computers with nasties such as fake antivirus programs. That's all for this month. many GPs, Ι patients who are concerned about losing their memory. Most are in their 50s and

60s troubled by things like where they've put their car keys; going into another room and wondering why they've gone there or, having put something in a safe place, can't remember where the 'safe place' is! Often patients associate such lapses of memory as early warning signs of Alzheimer's disease. For some this may be the case, but for most, reassuringly, it's not. When one considers what our brain has to deal with, the complexity and scale of the tasks it has to tackle, what is surprising is not that our memory lets us down, but that it doesn't do so more often. Try and think of your memory just like the one in your computer. The more information you put into it, the more it has to deal with, and over time, the slower it runs. As well as all the other functions of the brain, like controlling the way our bodies operate, add three or four decades of memories and it is bound to take its time. Just think how much slower your computer is now, compared to when it was new. The most common causes of adult memory lapses are stress, a busy life, and poor sleep, and once the underlying cause has been sorted out, things usually return to normal. More memory-related problems sinister become more common with age, but they are the exception rather the rule. When children our brains information like a sponge, but from our late teens our brain cells start dying, so inevitably as we age we are going to lose some memory function. This doesn't mean,

AM I LOSING THE PLOT? person in 50 develops a form of dementia by their late 60s, increasing to 1 in 5 for those in their mid 80s, or, to put it another way, 98 per cent of us will reach the age of 70 without developing dementia and around 75 per cent of us never will. Doctors are increasingly keen to test people if they have concerns. research suggests that early diagnosis can help doctors prescribe medication and provide intervention that may slow the process of dementia. Whilst there is evidence to suggest that the risk of developing Alzheimer's is down to our inherited genes and beyond our control, this isn't necessarily always the case and many of us who have a parent grandparent with Alzheimer's will not acquire it. There are, however, things we can do to improve our lot in this area. The brain relies on good blood supply to keep it functioning effectively, so it's back to the healthy lifestyle advice again: good diet, stop smoking, more exercise and keeping an eye on your blood pressure, blood sugar and cholesterol. These remain the best overall defence against dementia - to keep your heart pumping the blood and oxygen to the brain. Like the rest of the body. exercising the brain will help to keep it Learning a new skill or healthy too. language, and regular social interaction is recommended. 



Playground Mr William Whitehead attended the meeting to discuss repairs to the playground. He had received quotes from Playdale and also carried out a close inspection of the equipment, drawing up a list of the work required based on the ROSPA report. Most of the work could be carried out by Mr Whitehead with the exception of the aerial slide. He would also follow up the possibility of loaning a steam cleaner from Richmondshire District Council to clean off the surface aloae. It was agreed to place a spare honesty box in the playground for donations towards its upkeep. Memorial Seat Coun Allinson had met Dr Corbett to discuss the seat on the green in memory of his late wife and the details had now been passed to the builders. Potholes Repair work to the potholes in Quaker Close had begun that day. Water Main The leaking water main in the Arkengarthdale Road had now been repaired. Healaugh Square Estimates were coming in for repairs to the cobbles in the square. Coun Kendall suggested that consideration should also be given to the price of tarmac for the area instead.

Tree Felling Permission was noted for the felling of one conifer at High Fremington. Metcalfes Farm Revised plans for the scheme, showing the altered position of one house, had been passed by the planning authority. Village Greens A number of mole hills needed to be dealt with on Healaugh green and round the bandstand before the grass could be mown. areen wardens would also inspect problem with the drain near the bandstand. Repairs were also required to slabs on the bandstand and an area of

loose cobbles on the High Row. Highways Department had placed white posts on the green near the Museum - this would be looked into as it was not known who had requested them. Parking Coun Kendall recommended that the local police should be asked to enforce parking restrictions near the corner of the Arkengarthdale road where the footway was frequently blocked causing pedestrians with pushchairs to walk in the road. It was hoped to resolve the problem without resorting to yellow lines. Mr Woodford from the Highways department would be invited to a site meeting to see the problem at first hand. Mill Hill Because the dustbin lorry was unable to turn at the bottom of Mill Hill due to a parked car and had to reverse up the hill, the driver had been instructed not to go down it. Textile theme at the Dales Countryside Museum

The rich textile heritage of the Yorkshire Dales National Park will be explored at the Dales Countryside Museum in Hawes this year. The Museum, which is

owned by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, will play host to a series of demonstrations and practical sessions designed to highlight the techniques and materials used to create essential and decorative textiles through the ages. Museum Manager Fiona Rosher "Knitting and textiles form a significant aspect of the cultural heritage of the Yorkshire Dales. The hand knittina industry was once an important part of the Dales' economy, second only to lead mining. "Men, women and children knitted stockings, caps and Guernsey jumpers. Some had to survive on the money this generated whereas others knitted to supplement income from other sources and to help support their families. Evenings were spent creating everyday necessities like quilts and rugs and other more decorative textile pieces to brighten the home. "The Dales Countryside Museum has a wonderful collection of knitting sticks, knitted gloves, rugs, quilts and crocheted pieces and, this year, these pieces have been the inspiration for our events programme. "We have put together a series of events based upon the traditional knitting and textile skills once used in everyday life and will show people how to take these and give them a modern twist. People will have the opportunity to visit Museum, explore the displayed collections, learn traditional skills and use


them to create their own contemporary pieces."The textiles events at the Museum Spinning demonstrations in Museum reception on 3 May, 7 June, 5 July, 2 August, 6 September and 4 October between 2pm and 4pm. 





Information about the firms. child labour and hand loom weavers' riots will also be included, so come along if you would like to hear a comprehensive account of this fascinating but neglected aspect of the history of the local area. After a career in vocational education and training Dr Ingle has followed an interest in textile history and published several books. He is currently secretary of the Upper Wharfedale National Trust Group and works with them as a dry stone waller. 
