

Lightening, Ink and Scams

The lightning storms a few weeks ago wreaked havoc with many desktop computers in the area. A few customers of mine had minor glitches and issues because the power went off but a number of people were less lucky and actually had their computers destroyed by power surges! There are a number of things you can do to protect your computer from lightning and power cuts. The simplest is to unplug them from the wall socket when they are not in use or during a storm and if you use a wired connection to the internet don't forget to unplug your hub/router too. For many this simple solution isn't ideal or desirable as they leave their computer and internet switched on all the time, even when they are out and about, and in these cases something more flexible is required. The commonest way to protect your computer from power fluctuations is to use a power strip with surge protection (usually a strip of 4, 6 or 8 mains sockets with extra protection). These can be purchased cheaply - and there is a reason they are so cheap. They may help with minor fluctuations in power levels but they don't protect you from power cuts or lightning at all. Additionally many of these power strips come with exaggerated warranty and insurance promises such as "if your computer is damaged we will pay up to £40,000 for a replacement" but in my experience these quarantees are not really worth the paper they are written on and you are extremely unlikely to get any compensation at all. The only solutions that truly guarantee against power failure and

lightning are Universal Power Supplies (UPS) which for full protection are extremely expensive (in the thousands, some five figures). There are some more budget models of UPS that will help a lot by providing a battery backup for your in the event that fluctuates outside normal range or goes off altogether. The UPS contains a heavy duty rechargeable battery automatically senses voltage fluctuations and switches to battery mode as required. They don't provide long term battery use but they work long enough to allow your computer to automatically turn itself off properly (using a program provided with the UPS) rather than just blackout or worse. They will protect you to a certain extent during lightning storms but the budget models won't protect against a direct strike. If you are interested in UPS check out devices www.apc.com provide some affordable UPS devices suitable for small office or home use.

Two final notes this week:

- 1. I have come across a number of inkjet printers recently that have been damaged by buying cheap ink. There are some compatible ink manufacturers that provide a good product but many times it is not worth the risk to your printer. Almost all manufacturers invalidate the warranty on your printer if you don't use their inks and it can be a costly mistake if you printer needs a new print-head as a result o saving a few pounds.
- 2.The telephone scams seem to be increasing I am now getting a steady stream of people asking for advice. The best advice is that unless you have called someone for help DO NOT let anyone

access your computer because they call you, even if they do say they are from Microsoft. If possible get some identifying details, make an accurate note of what they say and contact the police and/or trading standards.

IT'S 'FLU JAB TIME AGAIN!

It is hard to believe it's that time of year again when the bugs and bacteria start

to make us all suffer. For those who are eligible, the combined influenza vaccine will be available and we are holding our 'Flu Clinic on Thursday 13th October between 10.30 and 13.00.

Those who are in the eligible or 'at risk' groups can just turn up for their vaccine as before. Just to clarify, eligibility is defined by those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, and those who suffer from the following conditions:

Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)

Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure)

Chronic Kidney Disease

Chronic Liver Disease

Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease)

Diabetes

Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some, it can even be life-threatening. I can't recommend the 'flu vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible.

As before, we have chosen a charity to raise funds for, and this year it is **Herriot**Hospice Homecare. This charity helps people who are suffering from terminal illness to be cared for in their own home. We have already made a good start on images taken of our local lead mines.

TIME raising money through our book shelf which is currently groaning under the weight of all the books you have been kind enough to donate. I understand the collection boxes are filling up very nicely, so thank you all for your generosity so far. Herriot Hospice Homecare will provide other merchandise for us to sell at the 'Flu Clinic, and as usual, Christine will be running her popular tombola and raffle. 

Memories of a Bygone Age

Dear Sir, Before we left Reeth in 1986, I took down notes from, one of the Miss Wards who lived next to the Manse in Reeth. She was the last of the four and in one of our conversations she told me her weekly routine as a girl. That must have been very early in the twentieth Century. I

thought readers might be interested Here it is: Monday was washing day, Tuesday ironing; Wednesday cleaning bedrooms; Thursday baking; Friday cleaning through the house; Saturday a lot of callers, particularly at mealtimes. They came to pay their rates to her father who was an officer of the council. Sunday was Chapel, then Sunday School, then chapel again. At Whitsuntide there was the Sunday School Anniversary when we all had new clothes. The scholars walked round Reeth behind the band.

On Saturday nights we put the washing in to soak in Fell's Soap. We also did a white edge round the steps.

Josiah Nix was an evangelist. He retired and bought the cottage where he had lived. He lived at Reuben's Cottage. His daughter and step daughter had the Heather Café. It was fairly popular. Josiah was a fine set up man, not heavy, with a beard. He used to preach in the Chapel and once got the President of the Conference to come and preach. Grandad Thomas Ward had the Post Office. Grandma Ward came from Arken'dale. Thomas Ward was something to do with the mines. My father John Thomas Ward took over the Post Office. He always had a hot dinner to come home to, whatever else mother was doing. On baking day it was liver and onions. Mother had a big brown crock. She used to knead dough in it. I had to go with a 4 pint cab to Town End Farm for skim milk to mix the dough. Every week she made the same things in the same order: White Bread, Wheat Cake, Oven Bottom Cake, Tea Cakes, scones, Pastry and Cakes.

had hoped for a fine day on Sunday, 4th September and, after all the hard work, we were blessed with one of the nicest days in recent weeks. Everyone worked very hard to get the grounds and pavilion ready for the big day. Various sports had been arranged for the multi-use games area and all attracted much interest as did the junior football match later in the afternoon - against a team from Catterick Garrison - the result an honourable 2-2 second game was draw. afterwards and the penalty junior competition was won by Ben Metcalfe. It had been hoped to play the two football matches simultaneously, but such was the crowd on the day, that the second pitch ended us as an 'overflow' car park. The attendance took us all by surprise with estimates ranging from 400 to 500. Wonderful support, thank you. The official opening was performed by our Guest of Mr.R.W.Miller of Gunnerside Estate, who said how much he liked to see sport played in villages and how lucky he was to live in such a beautiful part of the country. He then cut the ribbon which was across the main entrance to the pavilion and declared the facilities 'open for use'. He was kept very busy during the day signing shirts and programmes and also kindly agreed to present trophies/awards later afternoon. I'm sure a lot of the signed shirts will not be washed. The only dampener on the day had been caused by the sudden death on the previous Sunday of 'Tan' Hutchinson, a member of the

committee and a stalwart of the Club for use. The MUGA can be booked through over 40 years. A tribute was paid to him by James Alderson, followed by a minute's silence impeccably observed. 


