# ARKENGARTHDALE C of E PRIMARY SCHOOL

Pupils at Arkengarthdale C of E Primary School have gained a place in the Guinness Book of Records by creating self portraits with a mixture of painting, drawing, collage and even some 3D models. The pupils were amongst 201,948 children & teenagers across the country who set a new world record for the most artists working on the same art installation by taking part in the Face Britain project organised by The Prince's Foundation for Children & the Arts, an educational charity founded by the Prince of Wales to enable young people to access and engage with professional arts. Along with other local schools from Barton, Brompton, Eppleby, Melsonby & Reeth the children displayed their art work at the Station in Richmond and uploaded the portraits onto the Face Britain gallery where they can be seen at www.facebritain.org.uk The pictures were then combined to form an image of the which was projected onto Buckingham Palace for three nights in April to coincide with her birthday and have been displayed on a network of digital advertising screens across the country. At the end of the year the entire collection of portraits will be handed over to The British Library to provide a permanent legacy and a vibrant snapshot of the 2012 generation of 4 to 16 year olds. ### **SHINGLES**

Recently we have seen quite a few cases of shingles at the practice as well as some

questions from people who have had contact with a shingles case, so I thought I would provide you with some general information about this condition.

Anyone who has had chickenpox is susceptible to shingles. When chickenpox resolves, the chickenpox virus (herpes varicella-zoster) hides itself away in the nervous system. Normally the immune system keeps the virus in check, but at some point in the future, the virus can be reactivated. This is thought to be due to problems with the immune system such as physical or emotional stress, or aging of the immune system. Shingles affects 3 in every 1000 people in the UK each year, although it is more common in the elderly (estimated 11 in every 1000 people over the age of 80 have shingles each year).

Shingles usually presents with a burning or tingling sensation over the area of skin affected. This is followed by a blistery rash, which can take two to four weeks to completely heal.

For most, shingles will settle completely. However, about 2 in 10 people will develop 'postherpetic neuralgia', which is severe pain in the affected area, which can last for several months. Shingles can also cause permanent facial weakness and hearing loss as well as eye damage. The elderly are more likely to experience long-term complications from shingles.

Shingles can be treated with an anti-viral medication. The medication will slow down the virus, and may reduce the chance of

developing complications as well as the severity of the complications if you are unfortunate enough to get them. The medication is usually offered to those over 50 as they are at the highest risk of getting complications and ideally should be started within 72 hours of the rash appearing. If you think you have shingles, it is important to seek help as soon as possible by contacting the practice. There is a risk that someone could catch chickenpox from a patient with shingles, and given that some of our patients are taking chemotherapy or are pregnant, please do not sit in open surgery! We will arrange to see you for an assessment.

A shingles vaccine has been available for a number of years in the USA (Zostavax). It has been found to reduce the chance of someone getting shingles and also reduce the risk of getting complications from shingles. The vaccine has recently become available in the UK and is given as a single injection to adults over 50 years of age. The vaccine is not available on the NHS, but we are able to offer this to our patients on a private basis (similar to travel jabs). The single-dose vaccine is not cheap (£175) but in the context of preventing shingles and complications may considered by patients worthwhile. For more information, please contact the practice.

### WINDOWS 8 - COMING FAST

I wrote a few months back about the new Windows 8 development. Despite my attempt to remain even handed in my comments quite a few people have commented to me that they read between the lines and yes I don't particularly like where windows is going.

The fact is that by the end of September/early October new computers will be shipping with Windows 8 installed and I would guess that by the end of October/early November upgrade packs and Windows 8 disks will be appearing the shops.

For better or for worse this is the way Microsoft is going. There are a number of things to be aware of:

1) New computers with Windows 8 installed are likely to be locked to using Windows 8. In the past if you bought a new computer and you didn't like the version of Windows that came with it you could probably remove it and install an earlier version. For example Windows Vista was such a flop that Microsoft actually provided free downgrades to XP for business customers. This sort of thing won't be possible - or may involve sending the computer to the manufacturer if you don't like Windows 8 as MS are insisting that the computers be locked down to prevent anything other than Windows 8 working. This will have a knock on effect for people like me who use tools to repair and support windows as we won't even be able to start a computer

from a CD anymore when windows has a XP installed) is not a trivial job, and you fault and won't start! This won't affect custom built computers - but the cost of Windows may increase on these systems as MS have hinted that they will no long supply the system builder copies of Windows and so a full priced retail copy will be required.

- 2) If you want to move your existing system to Windows 8 you will be able to do that fairly cheaply for the first few months. To try and get Windows 8 onto computers MS will be initially selling upgrades for Windows XP, Vista and 7 users for around £25 (or at least that is what they have said). Having said that, I can see no pressing need for Windows 7 users to even consider the upgrade.
- 3) Yes the Start menu has gone and been replaced by the Metro interface - and yes most people don't like it very much on laptops and desktop PCs - it isn't really designed for those devices. It is primarily designed for mobile devices such as phones and tablets, and is awkward to use with a mouse. Many people I meet in my day to day business don't like change - Windows 8 will be a big change and there will be a learning curve.
- 4) Once Windows 8 is released new computers with Windows 7 will start to become scarce (and my guess is prices will start to rise). Also Windows 7 DVDs will disappear from shops. Ιf you contemplating buying a new computer or upgrading your existing computer to Windows 7 to avoid Windows 8 I suggest you take the plunge sooner rather than later - preferably before the end of September. Please note upgrading older systems (especially if they have Windows

may need to upgrade the hardware too to get Windows 7 to work (you need a minimum of 1Gb of memory - but I recommend at least 2Gb if you don't want a frustratingly slow system).

Like it or not Windows 8 is coming and it is all about money - you have it, Microsoft want it. They hope to turn computers in time to pure Metro devices (the desktop is already called the legacy desktop and it is clear that MS ultimately want it gone). In Metro you can only by applications from the Microsoft store and this is the primary reason MS are doing this - they need your cash and they have seen Apple doing this successfully.

My personal recommendation is to upgrade to Windows 7 if you haven't already and if you plan to get a new computer get one with Windows 7 on it.

As for tablets and phones - the new Windows 8 devices look surprisingly nice to use. Microsoft are releasing their own tablets (Metro only initially) called surface which look like they will be very nice devices - nice enough to get Apple worried. 





Village Clock The clerk would get estimate for removing the chiming mechanism for inspection by the company which had repaired the clock. Footpaths The National Park ranger confirmed that the path through the old workhouse could be put on the definitive map. A sign was being prepared to direct visitors through to the centre of the village from Quaker Close. Dist Coun Bob Gale reported that the snicket between the sheltered accommodation and Langhorne Drive had been cleaned up by the district council and there was a possibility that tarmac would be laid along it. Healaugh Green The untaxed car now had a SORN notice. Some councillors suggested that it might actually be on the moor rather than the green and the owner would be approached before any further action was taken. Grass Cutting It had not been possible to cut the green as frequently as normal because of the amount of rainfall over recent weeks. The clerk would deal with some complaints from a Reeth resident regarding the cutting. Coun Kendall also suggested that the verges along the Arkengarthdale road could be cut by a contractor. Waste Bins The chairman was going to meet a representative from the district council to discuss the siting of some new bins which could be used for dog mess as well as ordinary waste. High Row The clerk would pursue a request for Highways to mark 'keep clear' signs on the cobbles above the Half Moon cellar as they had agreed to do several years ago. At the time, after discussions with the owner, the area had been marked off with tree stumps to allow

blocking larger vehicles. Because the 'keep clear' signs had not been marked out many drivers assumed there was no access and parked cars across the gaps, blocking the right of way. As well as potentially causing problems for emergency vehicles, this was also blocking access to the garages of residents of Hudson House. # NATIONAL PARK A STEP NEARER MORE AFFORDABLE HOMES

A new plan that will see more affordable housing being built in the Yorkshire Dales National Park came into force on June 26th. Members of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority voted to adopt a new housing development plan that should see more land being released over the next 10 years for homes for local people. It identifies 29 new sites for development ranging in size from two houses to up to 30 and potentially providing up to 236 new homes. Half would be affordable homes to rent or buy, probably through the involvement of a local housing association. The remainder would be open market housing with a legal agreement restricting their occupancy to people who need to live or work in the National Park, In January the document went before planning inspector David Vickery, who rejected four other small sites in the Upper Dales. Authority Members today repeated their disappointment that Mr Vickery had ignored their plea to reinstate those sites, but expressed their satisfaction with the rest of the Plan. Authority chairman Carl Lis said: "Our new housing policy remains, unashamedly, one of trying to support those who need to live or work in the National Park. As well as allocating new sites for housing, we have widened the definition of 'local need' so that local households are eliaible housing. We have also increased the number of settlements in the National Park where barns can be converted to houses, or where brownfield land can be developed for new housing, to meet local needs." "Our focus now will be to get on with working with landowners, house builders and parish councils to get new houses onto these sites." Peter Stockton, the YDNPA's Head of Sustainable Development, said: "The large gap between local incomes and house prices in the National Park prevents many local people from getting onto the housing ladder or renting more appropriate accommodation - so forcing them away or into longer commuting. "This plan releases new land for a mixture of future affordable and local market housing, which should help some of those people to stay in the area and should also help to sustain viable local communities and services, like local schools."







### A VIEW OF SWALEDALE

Swaledale has been a significant part of my life for well over the 40 years that Paul and myself have lived in Low Row, and where our family was brought up. Time spent as a child on holiday established my love for the Dale, and indeed brought Paul and me back to the area in 1971, when Paul was offered a job in Richmond. We were also lucky in that my mother, Joan, inherited property, not least some land, in the Dale which eventually passed to us. Joan's immediate ancestors had been Dales people and she was the eventual beneficiary of her grandparents'/ parents' small estate in Low Row. Paul and I have, of course, our typical family memories, including memories of Swaledale going back 4 decades when it was, as everywhere, noticeably different. Not quite the time when the sun always shone in summer and winters were always proper winters, but life seemed to be not quite so much taken on the run as it is now, and the Dale was not, then, bulging with cars and delivery vehicles. But our memories are of course surpassed by those of Joan. She, herself a Dales woman by birth, born in West Burton, is now a reasonably robust 97 year old. Her memories obviously go back a very long time somewhat although they are inevitably fragmented; nevertheless she will be now one of the few people remaining with memories of Swaledale, and to a lesser extent Wensleydale where more of her extended family lived, from the period a few years after WW1. She certainly tells anecdotes from that period. As a girl she was always, it seems, the most keen of her siblings to get up into the Dales, from her, then, family home in Darlington. The destination was Trellis Cottage, her grandfather's house that became a Douaill family holiday home after he died in 1925. Her memories are coloured of course by summertime; sunny hay times wielding a hay rake, and the farm horses, 'galloways', sturdily doing their bit, and not least the youths on their motorbikes. All her memories are illustrated by little black and white photos. largely but not exclusively in the garden at

Trellis Cottage; Joan with parents, siblings, aunts, uncles; Joan with university friends stretched out on the lawn during that relaxed period before there were any rumbles of WW2; then after WW2 Joan as photographer taking photos of us her family when my sister and I were very young and she and my father, Muir, or Sandy as he was often known, had a small architectural practice in Darlington. My father was also an amateur artist whose greatest output was during this period shortly after WW2. The volume of work from this time, 1946-1953, was huge, and it is only recently that I have become fully aware of the scope of his output and to what extent his watercolour painting had been stimulated by the wonderful environment οf Swaledale When downsized to sheltered accommodation 2 years ago we were able to take stock of the portfolio, or rather several portfolios, of his art and it was then that I decided to compile a book of his art as coloured by his life. His painting before this period, it seems, had been very limited in extent. He had done a lot of drawing, sketches and illustrations mainly but certainly not exclusively related to his employment as an architect, so the sudden increase in output of watercolours is noteworthy.



I have, in the process of compiling the book, come to the conclusion that it was those holidays in Swaledale, and to a lesser extent holidaying on the North Wales coast, that

prompted this volume of work, a trajectory that went from the delicate precise watercolours typical of his earlier painting output, to a near-abstract portrayal of the Dales landscape. The example here is a pen and ink sketch of Trellis Cottage plus the adjacent St Nicholas. It would I think have been difficult to do justice to one of the watercolours in the pages of the Reeth Gazette. However, views to and from the cottage were the subject of several watercolours one or 2 of which I have included in the book.

I don't think there will be anyone around any more who would remember my Dad out on the moors with his box of paints and watercolour pad - he would have been very discrete, but it was also a long time ago. However, I do think there might be people who would be interested in the work of an artist who, one could say, chose Swaledale first and foremost for his inspiration in those austere years following WW2, and Joan in particular would be very pleased if his work got greater recognition. # HELP SEARCH FOR THE ENTS OF THE YORKSHIRE DALES

Old trees in the Yorkshire Dales National Park have been put under the spotlight in a new conservation survey. More than 800 have now been recorded in a bid to identify the condition and location of these valuable trees in our landscape. Dales Volunteers and local groups have spent more than two years roaming the 680sg miles (1,088sg kms) of the National Park listing the old trees in one of three categories ancient, veteran or notable. The information they have gathered has been added to existing records to give a clearer picture of their numbers and distribution. And landowners and visitors are now being asked to join in the survey to ensure that none is missed out. Phill Hibbs, the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Trees and Woodland Officer, said: "So far, 833 have been logged and more are

being identified or recorded on a regular basis. The majority (51 per cent) are Oak trees, with Ash, Alder and Beech making up around 15 per cent each. "Some of them are very old indeed possibly over 800 years - and look just like the Ents in Lord of the Rings - gnarled and marked by time and the environment. "They all play a vital role in the ecology of the National Park and in helping to maintain the balance of nature by providing shelter and food for all sorts of native wildlife as well as a refuge for rare niche fungi and plants." The information gathered by the Dales Volunteers and by other organisations like Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Archaeological Group has been uploaded to a national database set up under the Woodland Trust's Ancient Tree Hunt project, which aims to record all the UK's ancient, veteran and notable trees. The project is a partnership between the Woodland Trust, the Ancient Tree Forum and the Tree Register of the British Isles. Andrew Colley, the YDNPA's Member Champion for the Natural Environment, said: "The UK has an estimated 80 per cent of all northern Europe's ancient trees. However, many of them are under threat from illegal felling. inappropriate management and development. For these reasons it's important that we work alongside the Woodland Trust's Ancient Tree Hunt to ensure the protection of these wonderful habitats and markers in time. "Without the help of the Dales Volunteers and local organisation this would be an almost impossible task so we would like to say a big 'thank you' to them - and appeal to landowners and visitors to help as well. "If a tree has that 'wow' factor then it's probably special - it could have local historical or cultural significance or be notable because it is rare or magnificent in stature. "So when you are out and about within the National Park and you spot what you consider to be an interesting old tree that has some unusual features, please take a note of its location, or perhaps a photo and get in touch with Phill, so that we can get it surveyed and added on to the data set."


