

'SEE THE NURSE FOR A BLOOD TEST, PLEASE'

People come and see the doctors for a myriad of

reasons, and we do our best to establish what is wrong and put it right as quickly as possible. Sometimes, the only way to find out if our diagnosis is correct is to ask patients to have a blood test. But what do we do with your precious blood once we have extracted it, and what can it tell us? Blood carries oxygen to all the vital organs to ensure they function effectively. When you feel poorly, however, a blood test can tell us if something isn't quite right. When we take blood from you, depending on what the doctors think might be amiss, we test your blood for different things.

You might be asked to have a **fasting** blood test.

We request a fasting blood test from you for many reasons. One of them is hypertension (high blood pressure) to check that the heart isn't working too hard to pump blood around the body.

When you book your blood test with the nurse, you will be given a small leaflet advising you on how to prepare for a fasting blood test. You need to go without food and drink from 10 pm the night before your test and not eat again until we have taken your blood sample. You may have sips of water, but nothing else. No fruit juice (this contains sugar). If you need to take medication, please do so, but only with water.

We may want to test your **cholesterol** level, and we will ask you to have a fasting blood test for this too. With increasing years, the arteries (big veins) that carry

blood to the heart and other vital organs can become 'furred up', for want of a better expression. This means that the heart can struggle to pump blood effectively. This can be an inherited condition, or it can be caused by poor diet and being overweight.

Blood tests will help us to confirm other things, but not all of them require you to go without food and drink, eg: thyroid function; blood cell count; kidney and liver function; diabetes; blood clotting; hormone levels, to name but a few. This is the reason why, when we have taken your blood, you may see it being deposited in different colour bottles. These bottles tell the laboratory what we are looking for, and how they need to process the samples to give us the information we need.

When we ask you to have a blood test, we may also ask you to bring a urine sample. This is important when we're testing for kidney disease, diabetes and hypertension, as these all affect kidney function, so don't forget to ask for your sample bottle. As always, please ask if you need to know more. All the best - Mike Brookes and the Team



New year - new artists at National Park Authority offices



Tangents from the Geology of Swaledale It's curious how reading one thing calls other matters to mind, and how from one starting point a number of different digressions may burst forth. So it wouldn't be too surprising when looking at an article on Swaledale and finding mention of the moon that the mind is drawn to Wallace and Gromit and the exclamation "Everybody knows the moon's made of Cheese". However, worthy as such subjects are (at least, in the eyes of those young at heart) the scientific leaning of the original article provided another path to follow. But one of controversy.

Based on the most generally accepted models for cosmology, the moon is much the same age as the Earth. These models require it to be something around four and a half billion years old. Mankind with ingenuity remarkable has postulated various means of attempting to validate such claims and with the advent of putting a man on the moon, other things have been including too, reflectors there specifically for the purpose of measuring the actual distance from the Earth. So accurate a measurement is possible that these data show us that the moon is receding from the Earth at 4.4cm (+/-0.6cm) per year. So if it is on a spiral course getting further and further away we can extrapolate back; but how far? As far as we wish, but not further than the Roche limit. The Roche limit is the point at which the gravitational force due to the larger mass (the Earth) will overcome the internal gravitational force holdina together the smaller mass (the moon) and break the smaller into fragment like Saturn's rings. For the Earth and the moon with diamond, being pure Carbon, it was

the Roche limit is at 5% of the present distance to the moon. When we start the spiral here (since we cannot start it closer to the Earth) we get an upper limit to the age of the moon at 1.8 billion years.

The most significant impact the moon has on the Earth is the generation of the tides. This also has an impact on the above calculation. The moving of all this water creates frictional losses, and as the initial article had said, it was spinning faster than now: but the conservation laws won't take this lying down - the consequence is that the moon is speeding up and is being made to fly away from us faster. Allowing for this reduces the upper limit for the age of the moon (and by inference, the Earth too) down to no more than 1.3 billion years.

Now here's the next connection. When we think of the Carboniferous period we think of course of Carbon. Carbon exists in three stable allotropes: Buckminsterfullerenes (identified for the first time in 1985), Graphite (found in the Lake District and other places) and Diamond. Diamonds are not associated with the Carboniferous period at all, conventional understanding puts them at 1.3 billion years old. thereabouts That's the link The Carboniferous is meant to be about 300 million years ago, so these aren't the same. However there is another link, one that is remarkable to consider

Can we corroborate the dating of the diamonds? Investigation by radiometric methods has been applied with astonishing results. Geologists don't normally think to use Radio-Carbon dating based on the decay of the radioactive isotope 14C, but

worth a go. The results from the So if you feel that there's not enough time laboratories that made the measurements on various Namibian diamonds came out with various figures roughly in the range 25 thousand years to 60 thousand years. This is a far cry from the expected result of over 100 thousand years (at which point the laboratories cannot reliably detect the ¹⁴C as there are too few to measure; when alive plants and animals have about one ¹⁴C atom per million million other Carbon atoms, the laboratories can detect roughly one per ten thousand million million carbon atoms, and given that the half-life is 5730 years, that gives us the maximum age that can be determined this way). These data show us that there was at least ten times the required amount to make this measurement. Not only is this rather at odds with the expected 1.3 billion years, it tells us something else too - this Carbon was once part of some photosynthesising plant. Carbon-14 is created in the upper atmosphere from Nitrogen-14, and would have to be taken out of the atmosphere as Carbon dioxide and turned into the sugars and starches of the plant before it could be buried and ultimately find itself in a Kimberlite deposit having been turned into diamond by a combination of heat and pressure. This has consequences too, it therefore drags the reckoning of all ages younger than this point much closer to the present in accordance with the geological law of Superposition. This covers all the geological periods from the Cambrian up to the present (these are the ones holding the main fossil record of this planet) and also a fair amount of what went before that.

for everything, spare a thought for the discoveries of our scientists and the conundrums they face.

All this considered; geology, rocks, time and so forth, for me it calls to mind music and to be specific the old hymn of Augustus Montague Toplady: "Rock of Ages". Though meant in a different way, it is appropriate for the one that the Bible describes as the Creator. It's fascinating how real science brings results that leaves no time for evolution in myriads of different ways. Amazing when we think of the huge amount of evidence surrounding us and inviting us to come and investigate and decide the issues in the light of the knowledae and data rather than hypothesis.


