<u>PLEA TO LEAVE THE DALES RUBBISH FREE</u> Visitors to the Yorkshire Dales National Park over this coming extended Bank Holiday weekend are being asked to do

their bit to help look after the fragile landscape - by taking all their rubbish home. Every year, thoughtless litterbugs dump bottles, used barbeques, packaging and a whole range of other rubbish - creating an eyesore for other visitors and potentially fatal dangers for wildlife. Alan Hulme, the Authority's Head of Ranger Services, said: "The majority of visitors appreciate and understand the need to look after this beautiful but very sensitive landscape, "But there are always a few lazy, uncaring people who leave their mess behind for someone else to clear up. "Not only do they spoil it for other people, but their litter could also be a death trap for wildlife. Animals can easily get their heads or bodies stuck in discarded jars and cans and six-pack plastic loops. That can lead to a slow, painful death." Every year, the National Park Rangers and Dales Volunteers remove hundreds of bags of litter - most of it from popular tourist attraction "We would also ask visitors to report anyone they see leaving rubbish behind to any of our Rangers." The National Park Authority has teamed up with Craven District Council to launch a pilot scheme in the Lower Wharfedale area to tackle some of the anti-social behaviour that impacts on both locals and visitors to the area. Two Authority Rangers have the power to issue fixed penalty notices to people who leave litter behind and to dog owners who fail to clean up after their pets. "Another annual problem that we are expecting to be on the increase in this royal diamond jubilee year is the releasing of Chinese lanterns," Alan said. "They can lead to all sorts of

problems from being mistaken for distress signals that generate a response from rescue organisations, to causing deaths among livestock that eat the metal parts "And in dry conditions, there is also the risk that they could start fires when they land"

TREASURE TROVE OF ROYAL MEMORIALS

As Royalty lovers up and down the country prepare to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, visitors to can take a peek at some of the regal connections found in the Yorkshire Dales National Park, Robert White, the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Senior Historic Environment Officer, said: "There is a long tradition of marking special events and people with features and structures that now form part of our cultural heritage - and there are plenty of examples here in the Yorkshire Dales landscape. extreme might be the Cavendish memorial at Bolton Abbey, the grade 2 listed fountain commemorating Lord Frederick Cavendish, the second son of the 7th Duke of Devonshire, who was murdered in Dublin in 1882. The elaborate nature of this fountain contrasts with simple group of memorials, apparently connected Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee at Oughtershaw. These include a simple stone slab carved with a cross and VR 1887 and a couple of circular stone troughs. "The Queen's Gardens at Sedbergh, presented to the town of Sedbergh by Mrs Upton-Cottrell-Dormer Inamire Hall in 1906 to commemorate the reign of Queen Victoria. The gardens, designed by Thomas Mawson, were added to the national Register of Historic Parks and Gardens in 2012. "And Victoria's

Diamond Jubilee was also marked by the erection of maypoles in several villages in Craven. "In Aysgarth, the Coronation of George V and Elizabeth 2 Silver Jubilee are both marked by plaques on the village green. Elsewhere, such events were often marked by commemorative trees." National Park also contains memorials marking other significant events, ranging from a stone pillar on the village green at Linton that commemorates it winning first prize as the loveliest village in the north in 1949, to a memorial recording slaughter of stock during the 2001 Foot and Mouth Outbreak, a poignant reminder of the impact this event had upon the farming community of the Yorkshire Dales. "The Yorkshire Dales is like an Aladdin's cave." Robert said. "Hidden within the National Park are lots of physical links to national as well as local history. Our longrunning Feature of the Season project is helping us record these historic features and increase our understanding of them." Roger Bingham, the Authority's Member Champion for Conservation of Cultural Heritage. said: "The smaller village reminders of royal events, like inscribed seats, church plaques, playing fields the trees planted and commemorate the 1953 Coronation - which are now as high as our church towers convey and record part of our social history as well as loyalty to our country, Queen and her sovereign predecessors." The range of monuments in the National Park is the subject of an article on the National Park Authority's www.yorkshiredales.org.uk/ website at memorials while the history of landscape is laid out on the Authority's

ELECTRONIC ACCESS TO THE PRACTICE

You may have seen media coverage recently about the

Health Secretary's proposals for improved access to practices via the internet, the so -called 'doc com' scheme. By 2015, his vision is for patients to be able to book appointments, order repeat prescriptions and see their medical records on-line. At Reeth we are delighted to say that the online prescription service and appointment booking has been available for sometime and seems to be ever more popular.

We are also dealing with an increasing number of e-mail queries as well; these may be questions to the admin team about appointments or holiday vaccinations, comments about our service to the Managing Partner or may be follow up questions for the doctors about test results or treatment F-mail correspondence is very welcome as it saves time for patients and allows us to free up to face appointments. correspondence should be addressed to: info@gp-b82622.nhs.uk and will then be forwarded to the most suitable person to deal with your message. It is important to note that this service is NOT encrypted and therefore the security of the message would be the same as that of ordinary domestic e-mail. There may be a delay in replying to your message so PLEASE DO NOT USE THIS FOR URGENT MESSAGES either!

Work is ongoing with our clinical software provider to hopefully allow patients free access to their records in the future. We would certainly encourage people who

would like to see their records to do so. Patients can already have copies of their notes on request by writing to the Managing Partner. Unfortunately as most of the notes pre-2007 are on paper, there is an administrative fee for copying the records.

A PLEA FOR APPOINTMENTS

In 2008 we introduced the evening appointment system in response to feedback from patients who worked or had school-age children. Prior to this, all the GP clinics were open, first come, first served sessions. The vast majority of patients urged us to keep the open morning surgeries, as they felt this was important to be able just to come and see the doctor without the hassle of trying to get through on the telephone at 8 o'clock. The open surgery helps us to meet national GP access targets also.

Lately we have had increasing numbers of evening appointments cancelled at the last minute or not attended. This is frustrating for us as we often have to squeeze extra emergency patients into the booked list, because the lists are full, only to see patients not turn up. Each missed appointment costs the NHS at least £18. Appointments can be booked or cancelled on line or by telephone - please give as much notice as possible so that the appointment can be offered to someone else. In this age of austerity, we all have a duty to make sure that we use our limited resources in a responsible way.

REETH PARISH COUNCIL AND AGM MAY 28

Election of Officers Chairman - Coun Martin Bearpark, Vice Chairman Coun James Kendall, Green Wardens Couns David Allinson & Graham Frankland, Memorial Hall Representative Coun Raymond Rutter, Market Representative Coun Bearpark.

Accounts The council's accounts for the year ending March 2012 were approved.

Friarage Hospital Thanks were passed on from Coun John Blackie for the parish council's help in contributing to the success of the public rally in support of services at the hospital.

Village Clock The clock mechanism had now been replaced and the clock was working again. The company who carried out the repairs would be invited to examine the chimes when they were next in the area.

Rights of Way Although the parish council was not the enforcing authority for rights of way, the National Park could take no action on the path through the old workhouse as it had been missed off the definitive map. It was agreed that the council should follow this up as many people still remembered the path before walls and gates were erected across it.

Highways Coun Kendall asked if it would be possible to widen the road near the Burgoyne where the green was damaged by the bin lorry. Coun Bearpark reminded the council that Highways had promised several years ago to mark the land outside the Half Moon as a right of way. This had never been done and was contributing to the problems with parked cars blocking access near Hudson House. It was

important to keep this access open. Coun Allinson reported that there was damage to coping stones on Reeth Bridge from a high vehicle and that other bridge repairs were still outstanding.

Diamond Jubilee

Permission was given for part of the green to be cordoned off for a picnic and children's sports. As it was proving difficult to obtain names and addresses of children eligible to receive commemorative mugs these would be distributed on the green during the picnic.

Village Green Councillors agreed that in future the Swaledale Festival would be asked to pay for use of the green for events.

Picnic Tables Coun Allinson reported that the owners of the Black Bull had replaced their outside tables and offered one of the old ones for use in the parish.

COOKIES WITHOUT MILK!

I get a lot of questions about cookies - no not the American biscuits - and there seems to be a lot of confusion about what they are, what they are for and do you need to worry. Unfortunately the whole business is shrouded in confusion and is helped by security software scanning your computer and telling you it found hundreds or thousands of cookies on your system as a security issue and then proceeds to delete them. First what are cookies? They are tiny files stored on your computer when you visit websites and without them many websites do not function correctly. Some people assume cookies are a bad idea and turn them off in their browser (or are sometimes advised to turn them off by friends). This restricts websites from storing these little files and consequently people wonder why their favourite websites no longer work the way they should What do cookies do? There are two main cookie types that are used by almost every website: session and persistent. Session cookies allow websites to maintain information relevant to what you are doing on the website during that visit. When you close the windows the cookie should be deleted. A typical example of this is if you visit a shop online and add things to the shopping cart - the cookie stores a session number identifying your shopping cart so that the web server sending you the webpages can keep track or what you put in the shopping cart. A lot of online shops

forget what is in the cart as soon as you close the window - they are using session cookies. Persistent cookies allow websites to remember you or settings you chose every time you visit that website. An example of a persistent cookie is used on BBCwebsite. Ιf vou www.bbc.co.uk without a persistent cookie you will see news and weather for London. If you click on London and tell the website where you live it will give local news and weather instead. This is not stored as a location but rather it is stored as a reference number in the cookie so that next time you visit the BBC the website looks at the cookie, sees the reference number and checks your location from that number. Lots of websites (including shops like Amazon) use persistent cookies to remember you every time you visit the website - that way they can give you a personalised experience of their website. Where things can get tricky is that some website display information (especially pictures and videos) which are obtained directly from other website. For example if you see a YouTube video on Facebook coming is actually youtube.com - consequently you may get a facebook cookie on your system but because you are looking at YouTube content you will also get a cookie from YouTube. If you are logged in to both sites it is possible that your interests could be obvious to both websites (ie. Facebook may be able to work out which videos you watch and YouTube may be able to tell you have a Facebook account). Some websites deliberately place cookies from all sorts of and this means potentially a security issue meani9ng your

browsing habits and preferences can be shared. Your personal information should not be disclosed through this process but marketing companies have agreements with many websites for collecting anonymous data. browsina Browsing reputable websites not should cause problems. This is another example of where you need to be careful where you visit and which websites you trust with personal information. There is nothing to stop a website where you register from logging and tracking. sharing information you provide on their website with other people and companies. Having said that the same thing happens in the non-internet world (eq. The electoral roll is available for sale to companies and consequently your information is available to anyone who wants to buy it - hence the amount of junk that comes through the letter box!). All in all cookies make the internet a much more useful place. Regular deletion of cookies is not really necessary and security software only flags up loads of cookies because it makes them LOOK as though they are doing something useful. 





COUNTY COUNCIL TO CARRY OUT ESSENTIAL BRIDGE REPAIRS

North Yorkshire County Council is to carry out substantial repairs to Park Bridge which takes Stonesdale Lane over the River Swale near Keld.

Park Bridge comprises a single span masonry arch and concrete structure and although currently it can carry unrestricted traffic safely, the edges of bridge, which are built reinforced concrete and support the bridge parapet fencing, are in poor condition and need extensive repairs.

New concrete beams will be constructed following removal of the old deteriorated concrete and new steel parapets will also erected. In addition the road surfacing over the bridge will be repaired and replaced.

The work, which will begin on July 2^{nd} , is expected to last for 12 weeks - it has been necessary to phase the works so that only one side of the bridge is replaced at a time to cause minimum disruption.

The road will generally remain open to traffic throughout, however vehicles will be controlled by traffic lights. On occasion, short duration closures (expected to be up to 30 minutes) will be required for some activities. Advance signing will be erected to inform people of the works and people may wish to avoid the site and delays altogether by using the diversion route during the works.

Heavy goods vehicles and buses will take alternative routes as the physical restriction at the site to guard the edges of the bridge during the works, will

prevent large vehicles passing over the bridge.

The road will be closed for a maximum of two days towards the end of the contract for resurfacing works. Following liaison with the parish and district councils, this is planned to be on a Wednesday and a Thursday to minimise disruption to local activities. Signing will be in place to divert traffic via Tan Hill.

Access across the bridge for pedestrians will be maintained at all times.

County Councillor Gareth Dadd, North Yorkshire's Executive Member for Highways said: "These are essential repairs to keep the bridge in top working order in order to cope long term with the demands of modern traffic. We apologise for any inconvenience but our contractors will be doing everything possible to keep disruption to a minimum."


