From Riches to Rags: the Huguenot Silk Weavers of Spitalfields Welcomed at first with open arms, and bringing luxury skills, the Huguenots' fortunes fluctuated wildly. Sue Jackson talks about their early 18th century houses, one of which can still be visited today, and how these houses were decorated and occupied. discusses the fashionable patterned silk dresses, and who designed and made them. And finally she describes how the trade died out, with some weavers literally dying in poverty at their looms. THE DIGITAL TV SWITCHOVER

The old analogue TV system will be turned off in September, and depending on how you receive your TV signal you may need to re-tune your equipment. If you have Sky or the Freesat satellite system then you will not be affected, but if you have Freeview (via either a set top box or built into your TV set) you will need to retune the Freeview receiver on 12th September (when the BBC2 signal will be turned off) and again on 26th September (when all the other analogue TV channels will be turned off). If you do not currently have any digital TV channels, then you will need to upgrade your equipment by either buying a set top box or a satellite receiver system. or take out a contract with Sky. You may also need to upgrade your aerial, or install a satellite dish. If you have more than one TV in your home, you will need to check each one individually to see if it will need retuning or upgrading.

Detailed information and advice will be available at two drop-in sessions on Tuesday 8th May. The first session will be in Reeth Memorial Hall from 9:30 am to 1:00 pm, and then the second session will be in Gunnerside Village Hall from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Information will also be available via the Two Dales Lunch Clubs (with help on a one to one basis if needed). Initial briefings on the digital switchover will take place at the lunches on:

Thursday 7th June at Low Row Village Institute,

Wednesday 13th June at Reeth Memorial Hall,

Monday 25th June at Langthwaite Methodist Chapel Hall, and Thursday 28th June at Muker Public Hall

You will probably have seen adverts for the BBC's Switchover Help Scheme for anyone over 75 or eligible disabled. If you are eligible, you should have received an information pack, and you are entitled to help with switching your TV to digital. You can call free for more information on 0800 40 85 900. If you can't get to any of the sessions that are being organised in the 2 Dales then other sessions are available in Wensleydale on 1st May (at West Burton and Redmire) and on 31st May (at Hawes and Bainbridge). ASPIRIN - THE NEW (OLD) WONDER DRUG?

The medical journal 'The Lancet' has recently

published results of research that aspirin can be used in both the prevention and cure of some cancers.

The fact that one of the most influential medical journals has published these results indicates that the research must be quite convincing.

Aspirin (or acetylsalicylic acid) has been used for many years as a painkiller. It has an anti-inflammatory action, and it is also prescribed for people with known or suspected heart disease. The low dose of 75 mgs helps to thin the blood and stop the clotting that can precipitate a heart attack or stroke.

The new research suggests that this 'thinning' effect prevents the blood platelets from adhering themselves to cancer cells, suggesting that they 'slip off' the cells, thereby inhibiting them from being carried around the body.

If this is the case, and the research seems to support that it is, then it is a major breakthrough in cancer prevention/cure.

However, I would not recommend just buying aspirin over the counter and popping a pill a day, in an effort to combat the Big 'C'. The benefits of aspirin for otherwise healthy people are unclear. More research is ongoing to decide exactly who would be most likely to benefit (it looks like people in middle age, rather than the elderly). Any regularly administered medication requires a discussion with your doctor, as you may have a pre-existing condition where taking

aspirin (or something else) could be harmful.

There is also the risk that taking aspirin can cause internal bleeding, although this is rare, and because it is an anti-inflammatory drug, taking other medication with it like ibuprofen, may prove a dangerous combination.

Of course, neither is it a substitute for adopting a healthy lifestyle. The same old stuff still applies! Eating a well-balanced diet including lots of fruit and vegetables and taking a moderate amount of exercise, is still the best way of keeping the body operating at its optimum potential.

Time will tell if aspirin is going to prove to be the new wonder drug, but it does seem that mother was right all along, and sending you off to bed with a hot drink and an aspirin when you had a cold was not a bad remedy after all.



Windows 8 - A first look

Yes you read that right! It seems only yesterday that Microsoft brought out Windows 7 and not that much longer ago Windows Vista. Many people are still using Windows XP (and I still occasionally come across Windows 98!) which most people are happy with but the truth is that Windows XP has only a limited lifespan and support will cease in the not too distant future. That means that no more updates will be including critical provided security updates. Sooner or later users will need to move away from Windows XP and, whilst Windows Vista was almost universally hated, Windows 7 is proving a worthy successor and has a lot of nice features built on a familiar user experience. Windows 8 has been hitting the press as Microsoft have released a public preview which you can download and try (more about that later). If you haven't seen it yet you are in for a shock! When you switch on you are confronted with a full scree photograph (and nothing else) - you drag that out of the way to get to a login screen (which is now linked to a Hotmail or live.com account) and once you have filled in your password you are taken to the new Metro interface. Metro has been designed to work across a range of devices - in particular mobile phones, tablets, laptops and desktop computers. If you have a touch screen you can work with your fingers otherwise you use a mouse or touchpad to make selections. The Metro screen consists of a screen full of brightly coloured tiles - each representing some sort of application (app) and including an

app store from Microsoft. The app store is where you go to buy new programs (or currently download freebies) - and this will be the ONLY place you can buy apps for Metro. Microsoft have taken a leaf out of Apple's book and want to control everything you buy (and mostly what and how you do it) - and this is the primary reason for Windows 8 - Microsoft want to make a lot of money by locking you into their app store. If you want to use Internet Explorer to surf the web or check your email you do it from Metro by just tapping the app. All apps run at full screen (no windows) and strangely there aren't save or close buttons etc. Just press the Windows key (to the left of the space bar) to return to Metro. There is an app called Desktop which changes to a more familiar Windows 7 style desktop but the big surprise is there is no Start button to bring up the usual menu! Press the Windows button and you are back at Metro. I will write a bit more about this in coming months as Windows 8 develops and I will keep my personal opinions to myself for the time being so that you can have a play without too to preconceptions. If you want to have a play with Windows 8 be careful not to upgrade your current version of windows to the customer preview version (there is no going back). A better way to do it is to set up a virtual computer on your computer (this is like another computer running in a windows on your desktop). If you want clear how to do this instructions completely free) the following webpage has a very clear set of instructions (probably worth printing out) with all the links you need and picture by

A STITCH IN TIME

A volunteer with a passion for heritage is putting her creativity to good use in Wensleydale. Sue Stokes is a volunteer wood worker at the historic visitor attraction Gayle Mill. She is also a volunteer at Bolton Castle and founding member of the Friends of Bolton Castle. She is currently working on a project to recreate examples of the type of tapestries Mary Queen of Scots would have made during her imprisonment in the Dale. Sue has combined her skills to make the wooden frame for her latest tapestry at Gayle Mill. The embroidery itself interest in birds of prey. Once the tapestry is mounted the frame will no longer be visible but Sue has included a time capsule of information explaining where the frame came from "If ever the tapestry is dismantled the story of where it came from will be preserved. The frame has been branded with the Gayle Mill logo and a written description attached to its back. I have also hidden my initials and date (SAS 2012) on the edge of the embroidery" explains Sue. Sue's tapestry will be displayed alongside 3 others of her creation in the Bed Chamber where Mary Queen of Scots slept during here time at the Castle in 1568/9. Sue is looking forward to continuing to work on the series. With 3 more in the pipe line she has her work cut out, each one taking about a year to make! "Sue's tapestries really add

to the sense of history in Mary Queen of Scots bedchamber. Visitors can imagine Mary spending long hours sitting over her embroidery while she waited for Elizabeth to decide her fate. Mary stayed at the Castle for six months from July 1568 until January 1569 and although she was treated as a royal quest and given plenty of freedom it must have been an anxious time for her as it was during this time that an enquiry was carried out into her husband's murder. Each of the tapestries displayed in the room has an information sheet explaining the image depicted and the background behind it. They really add depicts a Gleade (a Kite) reflecting Mary's to the colour and interpretation of the room. We are very grateful to Sue for the many many hours of work she has put into creating these beautiful pieces for us." Katie Boggis, General Manager, Bolton Castle. Much of the work taking place to preserve the heritage of the Dales has fallen to the hands of volunteers over recent years. Their passion and dedication keeps these gems of our history open and available to the public. REPAIRS TO WINTER FLOOD DAMAGE

Farmers and landowners in Swaledale have teamed up with the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) to carry repairs to stretches of footpaths affected by last December's Heavy rain and snow melt saw rivers bursting their banks in several areas, causing widespread damage to sections of the 2,100kms-plus network of public rights of way in the National Park. Ian Broadwith, the Authority's Access Ranger for Swaledale and Arkengarthdale, said: "The December floods devastated Swaledale and badly affected sections of footpaths. "The National Park Authority is the delegated highway authority for public rights of way and has responsibilities for the surface condition of footpaths so, where public rights of way are damaged, we are able through our rights of way budget to offer help and advice on restoration. "Working hand in hand with farmers and landowners we can hopefully bring these paths back into use for the summer season. "There is a very short window of opportunity to carry out this work as these riverside fields are hav meadows and will be closed off to us from early May until the crop is harvested, so we must press on with the repairs at every chance." Walkers on the popular Coast to Coast route through Swaledale will soon be able to travel more easily following repairs to a flood-damaged section of path. A temporary closure order was placed on the path from Isles Bridge to Feetham Wood after the flood bank was washed away in several places. Work to repair the footpath will soon be complete and the closure will be lifted by YDNPA staff.

Michael Briggs, the YDNPA's Area Ranger Swaledale and Arkengarthdale said: "This route is popular with locals and Coast to Coast walkers alike so it has been a priority to repair the path as soon as possible. "When this stretch is finished, the farmer is going to reseed the area from sweepings of the floor of the hay barn so that traditional local grasses go back. "Much of the damage caused is the result of a heavy rabbit population infesting the riverbank and destabilising it, so once the repairs are carried out, landowners and farmers are encouraged to control the rabbits to help prevent a recurrence on such a scale." And, in the last few weeks, local police officers and members of the Swaledale Outdoor Club have volunteered some of their spare time to help repair drystone walls near Low Row in Swaledale. Several officers from Leyburn were given a crash course in drystone walling by the Authority's Dales Volunteers after offering to help in the repair work, and they have spent three days rebuilding walls between two farms in Low Row in time for lambing. Michael said: "Sgt Grainger of Leyburn Police contacted me after the floods. He was really keen to help. This was an offer I couldn't refuse so we co-ordinated them with our volunteers and landowners to get the walls back up. Hopefully there will be more walling days to come. "Harold Brown, the YDNPA's Deputy Chairman, said: "Farmers have created and care for the distinctive landscape that we see in Swaledale and. although we can offer only a limited amount of help at this financially challenging time, we are pleased to do that through our fantastic Dales Volunteers."




