All the drivers have been checked by the Criminal Records Bureau and they all carry identification so you can be sure that they are genuine. The main courses include vegetables and potatoes, rice or pasta, so each is a complete meal in itself. If you are diabetic or on a special diet there are options to suit you

The cost of the main meals is from £2.80 with soups at £1.10 and desserts from 60p. Paying for your meals is simple: just choose the way that suits you best. Your options are:

- by cash or cheque directly to your driver when they deliver your order
- by direct debit, or
- by invoice sent to you, or to someone who pays on your behalf.

### IT'S 'FLU JAB TIME AGAIN!

For those of you who missed out on the 'flu clinic earlier

in October, there are still some vaccines left. If you are eligible for the vaccination, please get in touch as we will be running some top up clinics. We have managed to secure more vaccines than last year, when there was a national shortage, but please book soon to avoid disappointment! Eligible patients include the over 65s, those with heart or lung disease, carers, those with immunity problems and pregnant women - if in doubt, please ask.

### MELBECK'S SOCIETY DONATION HELPS PATIENTS

Last year, the practice received a very generous donation from the Melbeck's Society Coffee Morning. The Society's donation enabled us to purchase two new items of equipment to help with patient Firstly, we were able to buy a dermatoscope. This is a specialist light, which enables doctors to look into the deeper layers of odd skin lesions. By doing so, we can get a bit more information about the structure of a mole or rash, which can help us to work out if things are normal or suspicious. I am very pleased to report that the light has been used many times so far, and we were able to detect a cancerous skin change in a patient at the practice using the light and make sure the person was referred urgently for treatment.

The other item we bought was a tiny, portable heart tracing recorder. Any of you who have had a heart tracing in the past will appreciate the unwieldy array of wires and sticky pads (as well as Nurse Carol's razor for the more hirsute amongst us). The new device is about the size of a spectacles case and works by being pressed directly onto the patient's chest. It can also work with the usual wires on the chest as well. We have used the device both at the practice and also on home visits and ambulance service call outs and I am really pleased with the help it has provided so far.

Oh No! Disaster! A number of times over the last couple of weeks I have been helping people with a computer that has either stopped working for some reason or they have lost all of their data. The usual response is panic and the main cause is lack of a plan for WHEN disaster strikes and almost inevitably no backup, or a very out of date backup. Computers are not perfect machines, and despite what we think of our abilities they are not operated by infallible users. You need to have a plan for what you would do if all your precious photographs were to be lost or all your business email and documents. I have written before about backing up computers but I would guess that of the people I meet day to day over 95% have no strategy for protecting themselves against loss of their digital life! I also have a confession - my own strategy is not 100% perfect either there is no perfect strategy - but having a plan and implementing it will at least protect you from total disaster.. There is no one size fits all plan but here are a few things to think about: 1) Hard disks store your data and they are mechanical devices that wear out. Hard disk manufacturer's usually warrant their devices for 3 years manufacture (though computer manufacturers often only provide 1 year cover to consumers) so if you have a computer that is older than 3-4 years it isn't really a matter of if the device will fail but rather when. 2) Desktop drives tend to be more reliable than laptop drives - especially if you move your laptop when it

is switched on (we are all guilty of it). They are high precision, mechanical devices which move at incredibly fast speeds - it doesn't take much of a jog or knock to permanent and irrecoverable cause damage. If damage occurs to key files used by your system to get it to run you system may die instantly or not start up again after even a minor accident. 3) USB sticks/thumb drives, whatever you call them, are not a solution for backing up data. They are great for carrying a copy of data but they are too fragile and too unreliable to be a good form of backup. If you must use USB sticks use at least 3, and rotate them in use so that you always have at least 3 recent backups. Also do backups often with this sort of device. 4) Blank DVDs are a good way to store backups BUT you must use good quality disks. Unbranded or supermarket brands are just not as good as high quality branded disks. My preferred manufacturer is Verbatim. Even if you do make good backups onto DVD they are only good if you check the contents are correct (use verify with a backup program - OK it takes twice as long but your backup is only useful if the disk is burnt correctly. Storage is also important - don't store disks in a way where they can get dirty or scratched -

buy proper covers for them or use CD cases - and store them in a cool dark place. Manufacturers recon that properly stored DVDs should last 100 years but that is probably a bit optimistic! One last thought - don't think you will save money by using rewritable disks - buy write once disks (such as DVD+R) as you are likely to encounter fewer problems. 5) The best solution for backups is an external hard disk. They are more expensive but they are guicker and more efficient and hence you are likely to do the backup more often - or even schedule a regular backup. If you do use an external hard disk make sure you remove it when not in use - a lightning strike might well kill your backup as well as your computer if it is plugged in during a storm Make sure to use the appropriate procedure before removing the drive to tell the system you are going to unplug it or else shutdown your computer before unplugging.





Council Land The clerk would check the status of some areas of land at Healaugh, Village Seats Coun Allinson reported that Dr Corbett no longer wished to proceed with a memorial seat on the green and nothing further had been heard about the request for a seat at Arkle Cottage. Highways The white lines near the Half Moon had been added to the works schedule and the blocked drain opposite the Old Temperance would be investigated. Coun Frankland pointed out that the drain on Back Lane and the path between Quaker Close and Langhorne Drive which had been reported previously had not yet been attended to. In addition a lamp post had been knocked down by the refuse wagon and not yet replaced. Coun Rutter reported that the cattle grid on Raw Bank was loose and that overgrown saplings were causing a problem along the road to Healaugh. Coun Gardner said that he was asking local parish councils to write to the Highways Department requesting a co-ordinated plan to deal properly with roadside saplings which were causing damage to vehicles throughout Swaledale. It was suggested that a programme of recobbling a small section every year should be put into place. The weed spraying had made a great improvement but some patches had been missed where cars had not been moved at the appropriate time. Allinson would look into this. 11/09/2012 (27) 13.43hrs: The team were called to assist YAS rescue a female with a lower leg fracture on the Pennine Way between Keld and Muker. The team assisted with loading the casualty to the Yorkshire Air Ambulance for onward transport.
