### GRINTON PARISH COUNCIL SEPTEMBER 3

Grinton Bridge It was noted that the trees were going to be removed from the Reeth end of the bridge and councillors hoped that the others would be dealt with at the same time. Cycle Rally Notice was received that the Polaris Mountain Bike Challenge would be passing through the parish over the weekend of September 22 and 23. Highways An update on services received from was the Highways Department drawing attention to the effect of the bad weather on their programme of road maintenance. Recent work had been mostly concentrating on repairing the winter damage and other works would be carried out when the problems reached intervention level. Coun Sunter pointed out that the pot holes in the Summer Lodge area were already at this level and these would be reported to the department. The broken stock gate at the cattle grid near Low Whita bridge had been reported some time previously but was still awaiting repairs. It would be reported again. Highways would also be asked to deal with the problem of saplings along roadsides throughout the parish which were damaging car mirrors and needed to be cut back. The missing name sign from the east end of the village would reported. Parish Hall The Swaledale Festival meetings would be held in the Festival Office in future rather than in the hall Accounts The audit of the parish accounts had been returned with no further comments. Grinton Beck Nothing had been heard back yet after the meeting to discuss the under cutting of the sewer

pipe across the beck. The clerk would pursue this. A local resident reported that there was also a problem where the beck discharged into the Swale and the bank was being washed away but the owner of the property was aware of it. Tree Preservation Orders The clerk would check the status of two trees, believed to be the subject of tree preservation orders, on land which had recently changed hands in the village so that the National Park could inform the new owner of the situation. ### IT'S 'FLU JAB TIME AGAIN!

It is hard to believe it's that time of year again when the bugs and bacteria start

to make us all suffer. For those who are eligible, the combined influenza vaccine will be available and we are holding our 'Flu Clinic on Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> October between 10.30 and 13.00.

Those who are in the eligible or 'at risk' groups can just turn up for their vaccine as before. Just to clarify, eligibility is defined by those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, and those who suffer from the following conditions:

Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)

Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure)

Chronic Kidney Disease Chronic Liver Disease

Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g.

Parkinson's Disease)

Diabetes

Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some, it can even be life-threatening. I can't recommend the 'flu vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible. As before, we have chosen a charity to raise funds for, and this year it is **BLISS**. This charity is dedicated to babies born prematurely. They help hospitals to purchase vital lifesaving equipment and provide support for worried parents. We have already made a

### MORE COMPUTER SCAMS

I am sorry to say there has been a resurgence in activity in the scam world over the last couple of months. An old scam has seen a facelift and is being widely spread via internet pages. This is best avoided but if the worst comes to the worst and your computer is infected here are a few things to try before calling for help:

### Symptoms:

You switch on your computer as normal and are confronted by a screen saying illegal activity has been detected - pay a fine now to be allowed to use your computer again. The screen is designed to look convincing and usually mentions a police force with official looking logos. There was an older scam that was easy to spot as it used the FBI as a threat but now the scammers have become more clever and use local police to look more convincing.

#### What to do:

In the words of the late, great, Douglas Adams: Don't Panic!

First: don't be tempted to pay. It won't work - they steal your money and don't even have the conscience to unlock your computer.

Second: there are various versions of this annoyance and some are easier to despatch than others. Here is the method to get rid of the easiest version:

Turn off your computer (if you can do this no other way press and hold the power switch for 5 seconds and your computer

will switch off)

If you normally connect to the internet wirelessly then find an Ethernet cable and connect your computer to your router by wire - the following steps will probably not work with a wireless connection. Ethernet cables are supplied with all routers.

Start your computer in SAFE MODE. To do this switch on and as soon as you see the manufacturer's screen start rapidly tapping the F8 key which brings up the advanced startup options menu. Use the up and down arrows on your keyboard to select Safe Mode with Networking and press enter on the keyboard. Your computer will start up but look a little different - this is normal. If you are asked to enter a password do so as normal.

If you get to a desktop with icons and a start button you are in luck (if you still see the police notice you probably need professional help).

Go to www.malwarebytes.org and download Malwarebyes AntiMalware and install the programme. You can use it for free but the paid for version is cheap and is a lifetime license. During set up it will update itself automatically and then run. When you see the window click on Full Scan and click Scan. Go away and have a drink of your choice - the scan will take some time.

When finished it presents a report in a new window - you can close that. Click Show Results. Make sure all the boxes are ticked in the list (quick way is to right click and select all) and then click Fix Selected.

Finally restart your computer.

If you got infected consider changing your antivirus protection. Microsoft Security Essentials is free and very good. Just be sure to uninstall any antivirus you already have installed before installing a new on.

### YORKSHIRE DALES NATIONAL PARKS AUTHORITY

### INFORMATION DAY ON HISTORIC BUILDINGS

Historic buildings in the Yorkshire Dales National Park will be the focus of attention in a special event next month. (October)

Called 'Caring for Your Historic Building', the annual day school is organised by the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) and will be held in the Memorial Hall in Dent on October 13 from 9.30am to 5.00pm.

Gaby Rose, the YDNPA's Building Conservation Officer, said: "This event is very popular and, although it is aimed primarily at owners, managers and occupiers of historic buildings, there is plenty to interest people who just want to learn more about the architecture of the area or old buildings in general.

"Places are limited and it usually sells out, so I would advise people to book early."

Illustrated talks by leading specialists will cover the characteristics of the historic buildings in the area, how they have developed over the years, how they perform and how they are best cared for.

Other topics covered during the day will include design, repair, maintenance and energy sustainability issues as well as bats and building work. And there will be a guided walk through Dent to look at many

of the architectural and historic features of this outstanding conservation area.

Participants will also have the opportunity to interact with the speakers and have their specific problems or questions regarding old buildings discussed as part of the programme. In addition, there will be practical demonstrations showing how traditional lime mortars and plasters should be prepared and applied as well as using Limecrete - an innovative, ecofriendly alternative to cement.

Robert Bingham, the YDNPA's Member Champion for Conservation of Cultural Heritage, said: "Our architectural heritage is one of the glories of the Yorkshire Dales National Park. It helps to highlight the diversity of our landscape from patchworks of field barns and squat farmsteads to relics of the industrial revolution and of the railway age.

"Together they encompass building activities from pre-historic earthworks and Roman forts to Victorian schools and later structures like the YDNPA's 21st century offices in Bainbridge."



### MIDDLEHAM AND DALES LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

### <u>Looking at Dales prehistory with the</u> <u>Muddy Archaeologist</u> Gillian Hovell with Jim Brophy

Autumn course of 3 sessions beginning on Tuesday  $16^{th}$  October at 2pm at Middleham Key Centre and continuing on  $6^{th}$  and  $20^{th}$  November.

In the first session Gillian Hovell will take a journey of discovery through the prehistoric ages in order to provide an overview of the different eras and set the scene for what is to come. She will also consider ancient features that survive in the landscape today - not just the large famous sites but also the small, often unnoticed ones on our doorsteps. Gillian will be joined by Jim Brophy for the second session, and together they will discuss local investigations into prehistory, including community project research and work in Wensleydale, Coverdale, Swaledale In the third session and Nidderdale Gillian and Jim will narrow the focus of interest further in order to take a detailed look at The Iron-Age (Nidderdale) Project. Findings from this project are helping to shape understanding of how the iron-working industry evolved ancient settlements, how it changed the lives of prehistoric people, and how it left a widespread legacy of industrial activity that continued through the mediaeval period, evidence of which can still be identified today.

Gillian Hovell, 'The Muddy Archaeologist', is co-leader for the *Iron-Age* (Nidderdale) and *Prehistoric Nidderdale* community

archaeology projects. She is also a guide and lecturer on the *Visiting the Past Tours*, a professional public speaker, teacher and freelance writer. In her 'spare' time she is currently working towards a doctorate.

Jim Brophy's active involvement in archaeology started with a community project in Nidderdale in 1998 and has continued ever since. His view of archaeology is influenced by a lifetime of involvement with construction and engineering, including thirty years teaching in Further Education.







Wednesday 17th October at 7.30pm Fremington Sunday School Dave Carlisle will give a talk entitled: "Better Late than Never', Arkengarthdale Mining Company 1870 - 1891'. It will be preceded by the Friends of the Museum AGM to which all are invited. It will, we hope, be very short! The next event will be on Wednesday 14th November at 7.30 pm at Fremington Sunday School. Professor Charlotte Roberts, Palaeopathology Course Director in the Department of Archaeology, Durham University will talk about 'Death and disease: stories from our ancestors' remains'. She explains that the study of human remains from archaeological sites is a popular 'occupation' in the UK and elsewhere in the world. The wealth of information their burial sites, and indeed their skeletal remains, can tell us about their past lives and deaths is wide ranging. This has been increased in recent years with the use of very sophisticated methods of analysis that can inform us about their diets, their health problems, and how much they moved around from their original birthplaces. This talk will provide a general overview about how and why the study of life, death and burial is important to understanding who we are today. It will take examples from both the UK and elsewhere, from prehistory to the post-medieval period, including some of results of the speaker's research from burial in northern England. Charlotte's students Ashley Tallyn has been working on our Accessions Database. 

This gives us arguably the most highly qualified coaching in the League and we are already working on this years Under 8/9's to field a team in 2012/13 and we have some good players.
