Unfortunately due to a technical hitch, (broken computer) the match report for the game against Unicorn is temporarily unavailable. The concise version however was a 4-1 loss against what are looking to be hot favourites to win the league this year. A disappointing result as Reeth had already drawn 1-1 with them earlier in the season. The first game of March saw Reeth finally on the field at Redmire to play the first round of the Dales Cup. From the start Reeth dominated play rewarded after ten minutes when an error saw Shaun Charlton take the ball from a Redmire defender to score Reeth's first. Only ten minutes later James Keyse headed a second goal into the roof of the net from a Bainbridge corner. Reeth continued the pressure as Joe Woodall put a through ball from Matt Barker round the keeper to make it 3-0. Minutes before half time Joe Woodall put the ball into the box, Keyse beat the keeper again and slotted it home to give Reeth a 4-0 lead at half time. The second half proved to be a quieter time with Redmire scoring a consolation goal and Woodall netting Reeth's fifth. A missed penalty was the only disappointment for Reeth, through to the next round of the Dales Cup on a 5-1 win. Straight off the back of their first round Dales Cup win the week before. With some key players away or injured and with only two subs on the bench Reeth nevertheless were able to field a team which on paper looked more than able to take the team through to the next round. A run down the wing from Joe Woodall saw his shot ricochet off the keeper, a quick follow up and Woodall had Reeth in the lead. However Colburn were never going to be easy opponents and a defensive error saw Colburn equalise ten minutes later. With good play from both teams the score remained 1 -1 at half time. Fifty five minutes into the second half Reeth's second goal came from a run of play down the right, John Williams putting a low drive past the Colburn keeper, Colburn stepped up to the mark and five minutes later the scores were again equal. Making use of the fresh legs on the bench the Reeth manager used both this subs as continued to push forward: determined play was rewarded when they again took the lead with Williams beating the keeper on his near side for his second. With Reeth's defence holding tight a place in the semi-finals looked imminent but it was not to be as Colburn took advantage of an eighty eighth minute free kick to pull the scores back level moving the game into thirty minutes of extra time. JOSÉ TYERMAN

José celebrated her 100th birthday on 18th March. She was born Josephina Wilhelmina Verschueren Henrietta in Antwerp. Belaium in 1913 and had a sister, Georgette. Around 1936, she came for a holiday in Richmond at her auntie's, who was married to Robbie Tyerman's boss at the Prudential and that's how José and Robbie met. They were already engaged as war broke out in 1939 when José received a letter from the Home Office telling her she'd 7 days to return to Belgium. So within the week they were married in Richmond Register Office. Then a meal at Scotch Corner, before Robbie went straight back to work and José went home to Reeth. They didn't have a honeymoon. They were happily married for 42 years. Robbie's call-up saw him posted to London but, when the building was bombed, he was transferred to India. José didn't see him for $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. With Robbie away, José took over his Prudential job, inheriting his 200 sq. mile 'patch', covering Richmond and the Dales. Having no transport she relied on lifts from the coalman and Cadbury's Chocolate vans to reach outlying farms. When she did get a car, her boss taught her to drive. As it was wartime, she didn't need a licence. José recalls the two of them exchanging words, as she struggled to master a hill-start on Harkerside Everyone was very good to her as she collected on her round. An accomplished seamstress, José used to make her own clothes and also gave evening classes in dressmaking. In the 1960s she worked in Jackson's clothing shop in Silver Street. José remembers personality Wilfred

Pickles staying at the Buck and interviewing her on his radio show. Telling him she was from Antwerp, he retorted, "I thought you were a twerp of some sort!" So she has lived over 73 years in Reeth. In Langhorne Drive and, latterly, in a nearby bungalow, with the help of carers, good friends and neighbours.

José speaks English, Flemish and French; knits and crochets for charity and does newspaper crosswords every day. She enjoys classical music and a glass of red wine (something she was introduced to aged 7; as they do in Belgium).







GRINTON PARISH COUNCIL MONDAY MARCH 4

Highways The council would message to Mike Woodford his retirement expressing their appreciation for his work over 42 years in the Highways Department. In reply to concerns raised at the previous meeting the department had replied that the potholes and wall problems would be inspected and dealt with but the subsidence on the Richmond road could not be repaired until the summer as this was far more complex. Councillors confirmed that potholes along the Harkerside road were being filled in and the blocked drain at Ellers Hill had been cleared. District Coun Gardner in attendance reported that a plan of the drains had been requested to aid the gulley sucker driver as the one near the old post office was often missed when the others were cleared. Coates pointed out that the collapsing wall alongside the Leyburn road had not yet been dealt with and that this was likely to be a problem for the Tour de France route. Roadside Verges Coun Gardner had asked the local parish councils to report in writing the location of overgrowing saplings along the roads in the dale. These were now being dealt with by a flail cutter and where this was not possible the few remaining would be dealt with manually.

Road Sign Coun Gardner reported that the Grinton village name sign had not yet been fixed but he would be following it up.

Ellerton Parish The District Council would find out whether residents in Ellerton were in favour of joining with Grinton parish council.

Precept Members were informed changes to the way in which Council Tax was assessed and its possible implications for parish council precepts. Swaledale Festival Coun Brown had discussed the situation with the chairman and reported that the Festival was working hard to deal with thoughtless parking by some concert goers in the centre of the village. Coun Sunter drew attention to the road outside the church between the end of the vellow lines and the junction which could get particularly congested. Competition Grinton would be entered in this year's Kept Village Competition. Archaeology Councillors gave support in principle to a request by the Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group for permission to dig test pits to investigate the village's history. Community Funding Consideration would be given to possible community based projects which could benefit from the Community Opportunities Fund such as repairing or refurbishing the hall and bus shelter. **Next** Meeting The annual parish meeting will be held on Monday, May 6, at 7.45pm following the parish council annual general meeting at 7pm.

Statistics can be dry, but hearing that there were 184 Sunday Scholars and 57 teachers in 1847 gives a vivid picture - and that in 1831 there was only one farmer who employed labourers, 17 single farmers but 223 miners Some anecdates would fit into Gervaise Phynn's stories of education in the Dales. NEW CASH TO PUT MORE POWER LINES UNDERGROUND IN NATIONAL PARK

More cash has been set aside to get rid of unsightly overhead power lines in the Yorkshire Dales National residents and visitors are being asked to suggest areas where cables should go underground in the next few years. Ofgem, the regulator of the electricity industry, is in the process of allocating funds for the undergrounding of more power lines in National Parks and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty. Thomas Harland, the YDNPA's Planning Policy Officer, said: "We haven't received confirmation of our final allocation from Ofgem yet, but I think we can confidently estimate it to be about £3

million. "It takes a long time to plan an undergrounding scheme. This is because it's hard to find a line that doesn't create some challenges - whether due to cost, disruption to local communities, wildlife, archaeology, or for technical and logistical reasons. "This means we need to start working with the power suppliers to plan the next set of schemes as soon as possible - so we'd like to hear suggestions for lines that should be targeted. "We can't make any promises because it is common for any combination of the above challenges to undermine scheme feasibility. However, once we've got some ideas, we'll sit down with the electricity companies and see which ones they can take forward." As part of an existing £1.8m five-year scheme, the YDNPA has worked with power suppliers on projects to number of overhead underground, including some from Dent Station to Cowgill and from Grimwith to Stump Cross. And dozens of prehistoric flints hidden for thousands of years were unearthed during the first phase of a £300,000 project with Electricity North West on the Malham Moor Estate. Work was put on hold so archaeological students from Bradford University could investigate further. The Malham scheme will see 23 electricity poles removed and overhead powerlines replaced with 2.2km underground cable. Other schemes that are on-going include lines in Wharfedale from Deepdale Beckermonds and in Ribblesdale on Swarth Moor. 

EMAIL WOES FROM BT AND YAHOO

Over the last month my telephone has been busy with people calling about problems with their email account and virtually all of them have been customers of BT or used a Yahoo or YMail email address.

The symptoms experienced are that everyone in the users' contact list (address book) received unwanted mail containing only an odd looking link to a website.

A lot of people were concerned that their computers had somehow been broken into but if this has happened to you fear not it is very unlikely that your computer has been attacked

The problem has arisen because of a security issue with Yahoo's email servers. For a number of months all over the world people have been reporting these problems. It seems to have come to a head in the UK during March as BT customers have been affected. (BT use Yahoo to provide their email services).

Basically what has happened is that someone somewhere has designed a computer program that hacks into Yahoo's servers and manages to access user email accounts. Once the program is there it sends out emails to everyone in the contact list which appear to come directly from the account when the emails are received. As far as I can tell no one has had information stolen or other problems.

Initially Yahoo and BT denied there was a problem. Instead, they blamed users for being careless with their passwords but it soon became apparent that so many people were reporting the issue publicly that Yahoo eventually had to admit to the security breach which they claim had been fixed months ago.

So if you use BT or Yahoo what should you do? Even if your account hasn't been Carol Haynes

affected the first thing I would suggest is to login to your account and change the password as soon as possible. To login go to www.btinternet.com www.yahoo.com or (depending on your email address) and sign in with your email address and password (note for yahoo account you only need the bit before the @ symbol - not the full email address). Once you are logged in click on My Account (BT) or click on Your name and choose Account Info (Yahoo). From there you can change your password.

If you are a long time BT Internet customer it is particularly important you change your password. At one time BT stupidly assigned pretty much everybody the same password (esp. if it is something obvious) without giving users a clue how to change it! In the last couple of years they have got more sensible but I still come across customers on a regular basis with staggeringly obvious passwords!

If you change your password make it a good one - make it long and a mixture of letters and numbers. Also make it different to all your other accounts or website passwords. Too many people use one password on all websites - if one site is hacked (esp. email account info) it means that it is easy for hackers to get into all sorts of other accounts (such as a online shopping sites).

If you want to see if your account was actually hacked you can visit the following https://api.login.yahoo.com/login/ history and login with your email account details. It will show a history of where your account has been accessed. Typically hacked accounts have been accessed from other parts of the world (eq. Vietnam or Korea)!



We advise you how to report any information or suspicious

activity to the police as soon as possible using the non -emergency 101number or 999 in an emergency. Please don't hesitate to contact myself using the 101 number or leave a message for me at Leyburn Police Station or at Hudson House in Reeth. should vou require further information or wish to register your businesses or farm with the Ringmaster system . With your vigilance, you can help North Yorkshire Police make a significant difference in preventing and detecting crime. 

MIDDLEHAM AND DALES LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

Tuesday 16th April, 2pm Middleham Key Centre
The 5th John Rettie Memorial Lecture
The English Civil War in the Dales

John Rettie, a renowned international iournalist, humanitarian and dalesman, was chairman of this group until his death in January 2009. This fifth lecture to honour his memory will be given by military historian, David Cooke. In 1644 King Charles, in a letter to his nephew, Prince Rupert, wrote that if York was lost, so too would be his crown. His words were prophetic. From early 1642 until Christmas 1645, Yorkshire saw armies marching along her highways and byways, battles and skirmishes fought in her fields and her towns and castles besieged. The first overt act of defiance against the king and the first siege of the Civil War took place at Hull, the largest battle of the Civil War raged a few miles to the west of York at Marston Moor, and one of the longest continual sieges of the Civil War was at Pontefract. This talk tells the story of the campaigns fought between the King's supporters and their Parliamentary and Scots opponents for control of the county. Our area became caught up in the conflict as soldiers marched through the Dales and both Skipton and Bolton Castles were besieged. David Cooke was born in Barnsley, joined the Army at sixteen and spent twelve years in an armoured regiment. He now works in the railway world, but has remained fascinated by Yorkshire's rich and long military history. He has had seven books published on various aspects of this subject, covering a time span from the Romans to the Civil

War. He is also an active member of the Battlefields Trust, which tries to protect military heritage sites, and regularly takes battlefield walks and gives talks. Annual membership of the group is £10 and visitors are welcome to attend individual meetings for a fee of £3. 
