Most people think stillbirths don't happen in the 21st century, yet stillbirth in the Uk is 10 times more common than cot death. 

Bus Stop In response to a query regarding the exact location of the bus stop in Reeth it was pointed out that as this was a 'hail and stop' service the bus could pick up passengers anywhere. GP Surgery

A letter from Arkengarthdale parish council drew the attention of members to a possible threat to GP services due to the

removal of the minimum income guarantee. The clerk would write to the local surgery to check the situation before any further steps were taken. Highways A schedule of outstanding repairs in the parish had been received from the Highways department. The white lines on the road near the Buck had worn off causing confusion over right of way and repairs were needed to the tarmac near Lane House - these will be reported. It was also noted that overgrown grass and a tree at Downholme lane end were blocking the view of the junction on a dangerous corner. War Memorial Information had been received from the family of Lance Corporal Riddell which would be passed on by the clerk who was also researching other names which might be added to the memorial. contractors who had been approached regarding cleaning the stone had advised against pressure washing. Memorial Benches Enquiries had been received about repairs to an existing seat on the green and the installation of a new one near the mill. The seat for Healaugh green was ready to be replaced and Coun Allinson would take another one to refurbish. Parking Members considered a letter from a resident regarding parking problems on the green near the Burgoyne Hotel and noted his observations. Yellow lines had not been replaced when the road was resurfaced and this led to the slip road becoming blocked with parked vehicles causing wagons to mount the curb and damage the grass. Coun Gale reported that the problem with parking by Ivy Cottage had been resolved. Highways had marked 'no parking' signs on the road by Bridge Terrace but cars were still blocking

access to a driveway. **Tenders** A number of tenders for repair work were discussed and would be considered further at a later meeting. Tour de France Coun Gardner reported back on public meetings which had been held to discuss the Swaledale stage of the 2014 Tour de France. The clerk had received a letter from a group of local residents and business owners raising a number of points on which they hoped the council would be able to seek clarification such as what steps would be needed to deal with possible litter and sanitation problems, what arrangements could be made for parking for residents and visitors staying in the village and whether it would be possible to keep the green free of cars to allow space for possible entertainment and accommodate the number of spectators Councillors understood that the district council already had the auestion of litter and sanitation in hand. Coun Bearpark stressed that it was important to take into account the large number of local people who would be affected by the race and to work to minimise disruption for those trying to get to work or move about the dale. Gardner would keep the meeting informed of further developments as the planning moved forward. Footpaths The status of the path through the old Workhouse area from the Copper Kettle to Back Lane was discussed and it was noted that this was a right of way rather than an official footpath. Facilities Coun Gale reported that repairs were being carried out to the Ladies public toilets. The larger bin from outside the toilets had been moved to the green but the dog waste bin for the

bottom of Mill Hill had not yet been delivered. Village Green The owner of a dog which had been seen fouling on the green would be approached as this was interfering with the grass cutting

Why is my computer SO SLOW ?? That must be the commonest question I am asked and as you might guess there are a number of possible reasons.

1) If your computer is very old (8-10 years plus) it probably has little memory (not storage space though that too may be limited) compared to modern computers and if you run an antivirus it is probably struggling to just do that not leaving you much capacity to actually do something with the computer. The march of time and ever more powerful computers means that people who write programs (such as your antivirus) assume users have ever faster and more capable machines. Best solution is to consider replacing your machine as it probably isn't cost effective to upgrade, especially as Windows XP support ends early next year. If it is an oldish computer (3+ years) or running windows vista it may be useful to upgrade the amount of memory in your computer and shouldn't be prohibitively expensive. Many computers with Vista shipped with 1Gb of memory but it really isn't adequate to run Vista well upgrading t 2Gb or 4Gb makes a huge difference.

2) Windows XP and Windows Vista machines (and increasingly Windows 7 too) have had a lot of updates from Microsoft (in the case of XP about 13 years of updates!). These will disorganise the way data is store on your hard disk making it much slower to access files and hence slow down your computer. Defragmenting your hard disk is a good way shuffle files about and speed things up a bit. There is a built

in tool in windows but I recommend PerfectDisk which can be purchased from www.rexco.com.

3) Loads of rubbish installed on your computer that has been downloaded unwittingly the internet from infections. Uninstall any programs you (Control don't use Panel, Uninstall a Program) and use a good virus checker and malware checker to scan your system for infections. For malware I recommend Malwarebytes **AntiMalware** from www.malwarebytes.org. worth Ιt investing in the paid for version as it then updates and runs all the time and stops you visiting dodgy websites!

4) A hardware fault - commonly a disk fault. Running a disk checker to fix disk errors (which are surprisingly common) can help speed things up. There is one built into windows (go to Start > Computer and right click on disk C: and select properties. Under the Tools tab click Check Now ... Make sure all the tick boxes are ticked and click OK - you will then be prompted to restart your computer. Note this check can take a long time (upwards of 2-3 hours in some cases).

There are other reasons for slow computers but these are the most common. On a final note - lots of people have been bringing me laptops with damaged hard disks - please treat your laptop with kid gloves when it is witched on. Moving it while it switched on, and especially jogging it, can cause permanent damage to your hard disk which in worst cases mean a dead computer. And that brings me to remind you to backup - none of the damaged hard disks I have been looking at in the last few weeks had backups so files were lost - if

Rubbish is a problem all the year round ranging from dog poo bags left hanging on fences to drinks bottles and food wrappers dumped on paths. But it increases dramatically when the summer arrives,

according to Alan Hulme, the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Head of Ranger Services "Rangers and Dales Volunteers have already noticed a huge increase in the amount of rubbish dumped in the fragile landscape over the past two weeks - everything from used disposable barbeques and soiled nappies to empty bottles and plastic food containers," he said. "The warm weather means we see far more people coming into the National Park and, while the vast majority responsible and caring enough to take their litter home, there are always some thoughtless litterbugs who are too selfish bodies stuck in discarded jars and cans and six-pack plastic loops, and that can lead to a slow, painful death. "Discarded bottles can also cause another problem in sunny weather - they can act as magnifying alasses and start fires which, when the vegetation is dry, could be absolutely devastating for the landscape and the wildlife." In the area of the National Park covered by Craven District Council, the YDNPA Lower Wharfedale Rangers have been given the power to issue fixed penalty notices to people who leave litter behind and to dog owners who fail to clean up after their pets.

GRINTON PARISH COUNCIL

Swaledale Festival Parking for Festival events had been less disruptive than in previous years due to better signage and advance information sent out with tickets. Footpaths The clerk had been in touch with the National Park ranger regarding the White Bridge over the beck. He would inspect it with a view to having it repainted by the volunteers. Bus Shelter The shelter had been inspected and the clerk was awaiting another quote for the work. Erosion The council was still waiting for Yorkshire Water to look into the problem of erosion of the banks of Grinton beck .Highways The Highways programme of capital works was discussed. Scheduled work in the parish included repairs on the Leyburn to Grinton road which had already begun and slope stabilisation on the road between Grinton and Downholme. GP Services County Coun John Blackie outlined concerns for rural GP practices arising from the discontinuation of the minimum income guarantee. Most of this funding went to small practices in towns where there were other surgeries to hand, but would inevitably also affect rural areas where this was not an option. Funding was based on the numbers of patients in attending a practice but in sparsely populated districts individual surgeries were limited in the numbers they could reach while also having to travel greater distances between each house call. 
