IMPROVING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Members of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) have agreed to extend the time available to members of the public to put their views across at meetings of the Planning Committee. It is just one of several alterations to the procedures that will come into effect for the first time at the Planning Committee meeting on 11 December. The move follows a survey carried out by the Authority which found that people thought the current arrangements could sometimes seem unfair. Harold Brown, the Chair of the Authority's Planning Committee. said: "The new procedures allow a bit more time for people wanting to speak for or against a particular planning application before it is considered by the Committee, while ensuring that both 'sides' get the same total amount of time. "I'm delighted to say that there will now also be an opportunity for the relevant parish council or parish meeting to address the Committee. This is just one of a number of things that the Authority is doing to try to increase local democratic accountability and to strengthen the involvement of parish councils in shaping the way the Authority deals with development management issues. "Obviously, we will be keeping the new arrangements under review to ensure they are working effectively." Under the previous arrangements, the number of speakers was normally limited to one on each 'side,' speaking for up to three minutes. The new arrangement increases that time limit to five minutes and allows up to two speakers on each 'side'. The Chairman retains the current discretion to allow more speakers where there are exceptional circumstances. In addition. there will be an extra five-minute slot for an authorised representative of a parish council or parish meeting. LOGO OFFER 'WOOL' HAVE BUSINESSES

FLOCKING TO REGISTER Businesses, charities, groups and individuals in

the Yorkshire Dales National Park are being

given extra help to boost trade and the local economy. The registered trademark of the National Park - the famous Swaledale ram's head logo - is now available free for them to use to show potential customers that they are linked with the fantastic landscape and communities of the Dales. Sarah Nicholson, the Authority's Communications Officer, said: "We believe that being part of a National Park is very special. The Yorkshire Dales National Park logo provides a strong identity for this beautiful area and is a nationally-recognised brand. "The ram's head logo represents the National Park - there is a different one for the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority - and it has been used for many years to identify this stunning part of the UK. "We have now designed five versions of the logo that can be used by businesses, community groups, individuals or charities that carry out the substantial part of their work in the National Park or that stage an event in or about the National Park. "We believe that, by using the logo, they will make it clear to potential customers that they are part of the National Park experience. "There is no charge from the National Park Authority to use the logos - in fact, to encourage take-up in the first year of promotion, the Authority will pay the £50 fee required by the Intellectual Property Office to register each licence. Once registered, the licence lasts in perpetuity, so this fee is a oneoff cost." While the logos are not a quality mark and do not represent an endorsement, funding or any other support by the Authority, they will hopefully offer another tourism boost to local people. Sarah continued: "We hope that those proud to work or operate within the area will be inspired to use the logos and help us build on the strong, recognisable brand which celebrates this unique place, as well as helping local businesses strengthen their own promotion." Meetings in January 2013
Into the New Year with the Bellerby
Study Group

Our 2013 programme starts on Wednesday 16 January when 'The Walking Englishman', Mike Brockhurst, describes his 80-day, non-stop walk down the full length of Britain. A journey of solitary days in the far north of Scotland, encounters with walkers and incredible experiences of spectacular views. Brought up in the Northallerton area Mike discovered walking around Osmotherley and the North Yorkshire Moors.

Mark Whyman describes 'Arts and Craft Buildings and Gardens' on Wednesday 23 January. The Arts and Craft Movement flourished from the 1860s and produced some exceptional gardens and buildings. This talk traces some of the best, particularly those in Yorkshire and the North-East. Mark is a well-known speaker with a long-term interest in local history and architecture.

'Of Fish and Actors' celebrates the 100th anniversary of the Darlington Civic Theatre. On Wednesday 30 January Chris Lloyd describes its colourful founder, Signor Reno Pepi, and traces the early history of theatre in the area and the underhand methods used by the ruling elite to try and shut down theatres. Chris is deputy editor and political editor of The Northern Echo.

Artists' Colonies in Britain and Europe Fired by a desire to get away from the new cities, to what was perceived to be the simple, purer life, men and women flocked to fishing villages and rural hamlets to paint what was a vanishing world. In 'The Good and Simple Life' Sandra Pollard discusses artists' colonies, a feature of the 19th and 20th centuries. Some groups were the precursors of important modern movements whilst other individual artists were leaders of the avant garde, such as This lecture Gauguin at Pont Aven. explores the many different artists and lifestyles in these colonies. Sandra Pollard has been a part-time lecturer for over 35 years, presently for the Open University and also for Liverpool University School of Continuing Education. 





A VOLUNTEER WHO HELPS KEEP THE YORKSHIRE DALES NATIONAL PARK IN TIP TOP CONDITION HAS WON A NATIONAL COMPETITION,

David Preston has been picked as winner of the individual category in this year's UK National Park Volunteer Awards, which is run by the UK Association of National Park Authorities (UK ANPA). The 39-year-old began as a Dales Volunteer with the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority in 2009 and, since then, he has put in 273 days' work, which works out at an average of 91 days a year - way above the 15 days the Authority asks volunteers to give. "I'm absolutely delighted to receive this award. it has come as a complete surprise," David said. "I'd also like to say a huge thank you to all the staff and volunteers who I've worked with in the Yorkshire Dales for giving me SO much support and encouragement since Ι started volunteer for the Authority." Car Lis, who is chair of UK ANPA and of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, said: "It really is wonderful that David's efforts have been recognised by UK ANPA. "His input into the Authority's work has been first class. "It also serves to put a focus on the fantastic contribution all volunteers have made to the Yorkshire Dales National Park, which has gradually increased over time to the current level of more than 5,000 days during the last year." David, who lives in Askrigg in Wensleydale, has developed such a passion for his work that he's about to embark on a degree in environmental conservation. He began by helping the Authority's Access Rangers with jobs like drystone walling, hedge hanging gate and footpaths and bridges. And he has gone on to train in habitat management (coppicing and tree planting) and is working towards obtaining a licence to handle hazel dormouse so he can help protect this endangered species. He has also collected seed samples to help restore precious hay meadows and has created an image library of tasks carried out by the north east team as well as recording flora and fauna found while working on projects. presents the images twice-yearly volunteer meetings. Ιn addition volunteering in the National Park, David also volunteers for a local mental health charity. He was nominated for the award by Dick Laidler, who is the Dales Volunteers' north east team area ordinator The awards which supported by the Countryside Council for Wales, Merrell, Natural England Scottish Natural Heritage - recognise the efforts of those deemed to have gone above and beyond the expectations of volunteers in helping to protect, maintain and enhance the environment and heritage of their area. A panel of judges comprising BBC Countryfile's Julia Bradbury, explorer and presenter Helen Skelton, and Emily Carr from UK National Parks brand partner Merrell had to choose a winner in each of the three categories - projects, groups and individuals. David wins a prize of outdoor footwear of his choice from Merrell and a certificate. He is one of 240 Dales Volunteers working for Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority people who freely gave 4,200 days of their spare time this year to provide vital help in the conservation and protection of the Yorkshire Dales National Park and its special qualities.
