CHEAP PETROL DETOURS WASTE OF TIME

Making a detour to find the cheapest petrol station is a waste of time and money, research has found.

For an average motorist the saving generated by a five pence a litre discount will be wiped out by a 10-mile drive to the forecourt. The owner of a gas-guzzling "Chelsea Tractor" will be out of pocket after a detour of only five miles. Despite this drivers are still going out of their way to make savings, even though they are proving a false economy. Forecourt prices can vary considerably according to local market conditions, which can mean that filling up in one town can be far cheaper than in another a few miles up the road.

The AA, which monitors fuel prices closely, says they are often driven down by the presence of a supermarket selling cheap petrol in the area. One study showed one in seven drivers would make a 10 mile detour to save five pence a litre.

Another nine per cent, found in a survey by Gocompare, would travel more than 20 miles.

The study also found drivers were confused about how fuel efficient their cars were. This was because efficiency is quoted in miles per gallon, while forecourts now sell fuel in litres.







UPPER DALES FAMILY HISTORY GROUP

Our March speaker was Paul Dryburgh from the Borthwick Institute of Historical Research who gave us an entertaining introduction to the history of the Institute and the resources they have there which are available to the public.

The collection in the Borthwick dates back as far as the 13th century and was once the archive of the Archbishop of York. The main documents there are church related, including copies of parish registers, marriage bonds, probate records and cases which were tried by Church courts. They also hold records of some key businesses from the area, such as Terrys and Rowntrees, and of York hospitals and asylums.

Paul gave a detailed explanation of the various documents and what could be found in them at various dates - including a warning about which ones were in latin!

The next meeting is on Wednesday, June 26, at 7.30pm in Harmby village hall near Leyburn. The speaker is Suzie Lennox on 'Bodysnatching in the North of England'. Suzie will be looking at the period from 1740 to 1832, considering the reasons behind the phenomenon, how it was done and some of the, not always very effective, deterrents employed against Contemporary newspaper reports other documents often quote the name of the disinterred and where possible Susie links these with pictures of gravestones and register entries, highlighting examples from the North of England and some of provincial gang members individuals operating during the period. SWALEDALE MUSEUM in Reeth

Dr Geoffrey Hope (assisted by Nurse Nicky) will give us a 'A Tour Round Dr Speirs's Medical Bag'. Dr Speirs's sister gave the Museum a wide range rather gruesome instruments and Dr Hope has kindly agreed to delve his hands into the Collection to reveal their uses and context. Many of you will remember Dr Speirs, who was the GP in Swaledale between 1907-1963. This talk will be followed up with a visit to York Medical Society on Saturday 13th July, a rare opportunity to have a tour of this historically important place. The July talk will be on Wednesday17th July (NOT on 10th as previously advertised) by Andre Berry who will be looking a local peat spades. So if you have one, bring it along! The second of three seminars on objects found locally that give special insight into the history of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale is on 22nd June. This seminar will discuss the results of work by SWAAG - the Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group - in 2009-2013 on a site at the Hagg near Fremington. Stephen Eastmead introduce the site and surrounding area and focus on the excavations of 2012-13 (the latest scheduled to finish the day before the seminar) which have revealed a Romano-British settlement of circular structures occupied until towards the end of the 4th century: few such late dates have so far been found in the Dales. Peter Denison-Edson will then discuss the late-Roman pottery (principally Crambeck and Huntcliff-style ware) and glass finds from the site and the possible implications for the interaction of the occupants with the Roman economy, society and culture. The third seminar will be on Saturday 6th July looking at Medieval Glass Fragments from Marrick Priory deposited in the Swaledale Museum by the Rev. Bailey in 1978, and simply described as 'Medieval Glass from Marrick Priory'. All sessions will take place in the Swaledale Museum, Reeth: 10.30 -12.30 These events will begin with coffee/ tea in the Museum at 10.30 am followed by presentations and discussion, and finish at 12.30. The heritage of dry stone walls in the Dales

Kevin Cale

As they snake across the valleys and moors, dry stone walls are one of the most iconic features of the managed historic landscape of the Yorkshire Dales. In this talk Kevin Cale will introduce the rich heritage resource that they provide us with by drawing on Mashamshire case studies. He will then go on to consider where to collect evidence for wall studies. look at wall chronology, and also describe features found in walls. In the final part of the talk he will look at management and conservation issues as he discusses the future of dry stone walls. Over the last two months despite poor and at times extreme weather conditions we have still received several reports of incidents of theft .By ensuring property both in and out side of the home is secure and safe will help prevent such incidents occurring and make it difficult and less desirable for thieves.

Lastly we have had sightings of trail bikes riding recklessly across public rights of way and on private moorland, there are specific designated routes for off road bike riders so anyone seen the restrictions should ignoring reported to the police immediately so that they can be dealt with and the general public and wildlife can remain protected. 

20/04/2013 (26) 13.35hrs: The team were called by the Ambulance service to rescue a fallen climber at Slipstone Crag, the team treated the casualty along side the air ambulance crew & raised the casualty on our mountain rescue stretcher up the crag & then a carry to the aircraft.

10/04/2013 (25) 16.05hrs: Team called to rescue an injured walker high in Gunnerside Gill, a slip had caused a hip injury. We attended & with the paramedics treated & evacuated across the gill to the Air Ambulance.




