MIDDLEHAM AND DALES LOCAL HISTORY GROUP

Tuesday 21st May 2pm - Middleham Key Centre The Christopher Pratt story David Pratt

In this talk, David Pratt will tell the story of his forebear, Christopher Pratt, the eleven year old son of a Gunnerside lead miner, whose widowed mother took her family to Bradford in 1830. Christopher served his time as a cabinet maker and started his own business some fifteen years later. He was eventually joined by his four sons, and the business became the home and contract furnishing firm of Christopher Pratt and Sons. Surviving two World Wars and witnessing the reign of five royal monarchs, the company is still in business today. David Pratt is a member of the fourth generation of his family to run the business and since he retired he has had time to look more deeply into its history. His research resulted in the publication of an article entitled "From humble beginnings..." in The Yorkshire Dalesman of May 2010. David's presentation will be a new departure for MDLHG as he will use sound recordings in addition to visual images to illustrate the fascinating history of this important Bradford retail firm.

THE SWALEDALE BIG DIG

Some of you may have noticed references to a local archaeology project in recent editions of the Gazette so we thought we had better explain what this is about. The Swaledale & Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group (SWAAG) is intending to investigate the development of Reeth and Grinton in medieval times and perhaps earlier. Reeth and Grinton both have long histories going back at least to Anglo-Saxon

Cont. from page 8: times and perhaps country and the construction of the church earlier. Both are mentioned in Domesday Book of 1086AD and it has been suggested that there might have been a Roman fort in Reeth. In the 1980's Andrew Flemina & Tim Laurie excavated an Iron Age settlement East of Healaugh and recently SWAAG has uncovered a Romano-British settlement in Fremington, We aim knowledge of to our development of the two villages through a project which we are calling Swaledale Big Dig". We hope to involve the community, together with members, in digging a number of test pits in gardens and public spaces around the two villages. With respect to Reeth, a primary objective is to increase our understanding of the layout of the village prior to the granting of the market charter in 1694/5. It is assumed that the development of the market town led to the layout of the buildings around a central green, as it is today. One theory is that prior to 1695 or thereabouts. Reeth was probably a typical medieval village with a row of tofts(dwellings) & crofts(gardens / small fields) roughly on the line of High Row and another line facing them, with the crofts extending back towards where the Post Office is today. We propose to undertake a geophysical survey of the Green and then dig a number of test pits on and around Reeth Green in order to test this theory It would be really good to also put test pits in people's gardens in Reeth to get a wider understanding of how the village evolved. Our objectives respect to Grinton are similar to those for Reeth. At one time Grinton was one of the largest ecclesiastical parishes in the info@swaaq.org

in Norman times suggests that Grinton was the major settlement in the area but little is known about its development until more recent times. Whilst it does not appear to undergone such radical transformation as Reeth may have done. nonetheless there are some intriguing questions regarding its early development. Early maps suggest that the layout of the routes in and out of the settlement may have changed over time. John Leland, on his tour of England and Wales in Tudor times, wrote about Grinton being a little market town for corn and linen in c1540: the location of the market is not known. Ariel photographs show a number of 'lumps' and bumps' in fields close to the village. Are these the remains of medieval tofts and crofts? Was Grinton much bigger in times? The Swaledale Dia aims to answer these and many other questions about the development of the two settlements of Reeth and Grinton. We are applying for support from the Heritage Lottery Fund in order to carry out the project. If we are successful we plan to undertake documentary research over the winter and begin the test pits in the late Spring or early Summer of 2014. We hope very much to involve as many members of the local community as possible, together with the two local primary schools, the local scout group and the Help for Heroes Centre in nearby Catterick. which she was a founding and enthusiastic member) have been invited to give us a short lunch time concert. We have a Pilot Programme from the new Centre for Swaledale Studies. Three seminars on objects found locally that give special insight into the history of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. These events will begin with coffee/tea in the Museum at 10.30 by presentations followed discussion, and finish at 12.30. The idea is to build up a series of case studies. incorporating the most recent research and ideas that reveal the history of Swaledale Arkengarthdale and Prehistory to the Present, Tickets: £10 in advance; £12 on the door, includes admission to the Museum, coffee and tea, and a reading list. Book all three at the same time for £25. Places are limited. The programme is as follows: Saturday 18th May - Session 1: Two exceptional local prehistoric finds, their chronology and possible use. Tim Laurie will launch this series with an investigation of two prehistoric tools found locally, an axe and a hammer. Saturday 22nd June - Session 2: Romano-British pot fragments in the context of a settlement uncovered by the Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Archaeology Group at the Hagg, Fremington in 2012 and Saturday 6th July - Session 3: Medieval Glass Fragments from Marrick Priory. This seminar will focus on a small group of plain alass fragments deposited Swaledale Museum by the Rev. Bailey in 1978, and simply described as 'Medieval Glass from Marrick Priory'. 

LEAD MINING UNDER THE SPOTLIGHT IN NATIONAL PARK ART SHOW

The impact of lead mining on the fragile landscape of the Yorkshire Dales National Park is the theme of a new art exhibition in Bainbridge next month. Called 'Making a mark - lead mining in the Yorkshire Dales, the display of work by Gargrave artist Bev Parker will be on show in the Yoredale offices of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) from April 8. It will be her first solo exhibition and focuses on lead mining sites in Wharfedale and Swaledale. Bev. who worked for the Authority for 23 years, said: "I have always been interested in local history and archaeology, and my fascination for maps along with a deep interest in the uplands combine to stimulate my work. golden opportunity to be able to interpret a live environmental study has really fired National imagination. The Authority and the Environment Agency have been examining ways to mitigate pollution from historic lead mining in the Yorkshire Dales and this work has proved to be a keystone for my colourful expressive pieces." Bev, who is a B. A. Fine Art student at Craven College, said: "*'Making a mark*' has references and monetary, environmental outcomes. Marks in a landscape can be a wall or a road, or the effect of centuries of mining activity. "The remains of the lead mining industry in the Dales uplands have a fascination at many levels. The work for this exhibition is inspired by bleak uplands, changing vegetation and artificial shapes and lines in the landscape." Richard

Burnett, the YDNPA's Director of Corporate Services, said: "The exhibition focuses on an unusual subject in a very unique way and we hope it will provide some food for thought to visitors and staff alike." The exhibition runs until May 24 in the reception area of the offices, which are open between 8.30am and 4.30pm, Monday to Friday

There is no charge to use the new locator logos, but applicants must be registered with the Intellectual Property Office as licensees permitted to use the trademark. NATIONAL PARK HELPS THE HEROES

Injured members of the Armed Forces are giving some extra help to the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority's Ranger Service. MGroups of four to six residents at the Phoenix House Recovery Centre in Catterick Garrison have been spending time learning new skills in the stunning landscape of the National Park Phoenix House is one of four specialist recovery centres that provide a wide range of support for wounded heroes. veterans and families. Run by Help for Heroes, the Centre forms part of the Defence Recovery Capability and is an important step along the road to recovery for residents and day visitors alike. Providing rounded support in the form of education, training, welfare, sport and adventure, many of the activities on offer focus on helping those injured prepare for Civvy Street. The groups, accompanied by a Help for Heroes leader, have been assisting the Rangers in the Swaledale and Wensleydale areas of the National Park on a number of different projects connected with the Authority's 'usual' area of work - the maintenance of 1,500 miles of public footpaths, bridleways and byways within the National Park boundary. This involves repairing replacing pieces of 'infrastructure' - the stone or timber stiles, gates, bridges, fingerposts - and maintaining the surface typically found along the network of trails. They have also helped build timber tree guards for a tree planting scheme in parkland at Ellerton Abbey and they have been hanging timber gates, putting up post and rail fencing and trying their hand at dry stone walling on the new sculpture trail at Hawes National Park Centre. In addition,

they have been busy working on a dozen red squirrel feeders that will be used as part of the Authority's on-going red sauirrel monitoring programme in Upper Wensleydale. And they have built bird and bat boxes, and then put them up Freeholders Wood, near to Aysgarth Falls. The wood is managed by the National Park Authority and is a great habitat, comprising semi natural ancient hazel coppice woodland. Mo Usman, Centre Manager at Phoenix House, said: "This work provides those recovering from physical mental and injuries, with the chance to get outdoors and contribute to looking after the National Park. Some learn new skills and others are able to use skills gained during their military service. UPPER DALES FAMILY HISTORY GROUP

The March speaker was June Hall who delivered a fascinating talk on a little known emigration between 1772 and 1775 when around a 1000 settlers from North Yorkshire moved to an area around the Bay of Fundy in what was then Nova Scotia. The region had originally been occupied by the French who had turned salt marshes into fertile farmland. The French were evicted after a battle in 1755 and the land began to revert to marsh. Attempts to resettle the region from America were foiled by the War of Independence so the Governor advertised for help in the English specifying that he wanted press Yorkshire Methodist farmers! The attracted Governor was by their agricultural expertise and work ethic but from the settlers point of view it was a good time to leave England. Social and technological upheaval and revolutions in industry, transport and agriculture had led to large estates squeezing out small farmers and many landowners took the opportunity to tighten up restrictions on Methodist families.

With conditions in England making it increasingly unlikely they would ever be able to buy their own land, many tenant families chose to risk the hazardous crossing to begin again across the Atlantic. Timing was crucial; they had to leave England late enough for the sea passages to be open but arrive in Canada early enough to buy land, plant a crop and be ready for the following winter. Letters home advised families to bring with them a bag of seed corn to use as a pillow - it would keep the seed dry and keep the rats

away from it!

Many of the families still live in the same small area of Canada and can trace their ancestors back to the Yorkshire emigrants, even down to which ship they sailed on. Family correspondence survives along with pieces of furniture which made the voyage with them, traditional crafts such as patchwork and a deep sense of attachment to their roots.

Just a few warnings this month from the Computer Corner:

- 1) Telephone scammers still seem to be very active and I have had a few people contact me over the last month to say they have been conned (or nearly conned). If you get an unsolicited call about a computer problem it is more than likely a scam - especially if they say the work on behalf of (or even are) Microsoft. Treat them like any other potential thief and whatever you do don't allow them to remotely access your computer.
- 2) Microsoft issued a patch in April which has caused some people problems. The patch ID number is 2823324 and the symptom of a problem is "You receive an Event ID 55 or a 0xc000021a Stop error in Windows 7 after you install security update 2823324". The problem only seems to affect Windows 7 and Windows Server 2008 - you can check for the event by clicking start, type "Fvent Viewer" (without the guotes) and then press enter - it will be under the section Windows Logs > System. Microsoft have issued instruction on how to resolve the problem here: http:// support.microsoft.com/kb/2839011
- "Registry Cleaners", 3) "System optimisers" and 'Speed up you PC" type tools are everywhere on the internet. It doesn't seem to matter which page you go to on the internet you get bombarded with adverts and download links to download these tools. At best all of these tools are smoke and mirrors, at worst they are simply cons to get money from you. There

are a lot of tools that are very useful but there is a big problem - to be useful you need to be VERY knowledgeable about the inner workings of your computer and Windows - almost none of them work well as one click fixes - even though many advertise themselves as such. The fact is that all of these 'tools' clean up what they consider to be rubbish but there is no way they can genuinely identify rubbish with 100% accuracy. Even a clean, fresh install of Windows straight from the factory will have 'errors' according to these tools. Used without a great deal of caution they can cause huge problems and even stop computers working altogether. 'tweaking' the tools do is almost always unnecessary so if in doubt don't download them at all. If you want a quick clean up tool the only one I recommend is CCleaner (which can be downloaded for free from www.ccleaner.com - note there are paid for versions just make sure you choose the version you want). CCleaner is an excellent, and safe, way to clear rubbish (esp. internet related rubbish) from your system - even so I would avoid the built in registry cleaner section unless you really know what you are doing. NEW LEASE OF LIFE FOR HISTORIC BUILDING

A piece of railway history in the Yorkshire Dales National Park has been restored to its former glory. The Station Master's House at Ribblehead was in dire need of some TLC when it was bought by the Settle and Carlisle Railway Trust. The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) granted planning consent for the facelift and, after months of hard work it is due to be officially opened for the day on April 24. Roger Bingham, the Member YDNPA's Champion Conservation of Cultural Heritage, said: "It marvellous that it has been sensitively restored. "Bringing the building back to life also has a valuable financial spin-off because it will be used for holiday occupation and will bring in much needed revenue for the local economy." "By its very name, the house illustrates social attitudes of 150 years ago as even an employee of the railway was regarded as a 'master' by lesser employees and no-one would have envisaged there being a

'station mistress'. The building itself illustrates both domestic and transport history. "Architecturally it illustrates that non-vernacular forms were accepted even for relatively humble dwellings, although the house itself with its earth privy, cold tap, large clear pane windows, high ceilings and separate bedrooms for parents, girls and boys would be way above the living conditions of the labouring class." Trustee Graham Dalton said: "The stationmaster's house was last owned by a school for outdoor pursuits and it was in a poor condition when we bought it. "Since then we have carried out a major refurbishment to return it to its original state - complete with the cream and maroon livery of the Midland Railway Company. "Tt important that the renovation supported the heritage aspects of the railway line and we think that has been achieved very successfully." The Trust owns the buildings at Ribblehead, Horton and Kirkby Stephen stations on the line and maintains and develops them.






