The Mesolithic Period in Wensleydale, Swaledale and across the Tees-Greta Uplands Tim Lauri

# PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS IS A CHANGE OF TOPIC AND SPEAKER FROM OUR PREVIOUSLY PUBLISHED PROGRAMME FOR 2013

In this talk Tim Laurie will introduce the contemporary Mesolithic environment. woodland vegetation and fauna. He will also summarise the lithic and other evidence for human activity on the eastern fringe of the Pennines from the Early Post Glacial period at around 10,000 years BP (Before Present) until the transition from Hunter/ Gatherina Societies to the earliest pastoral farming communities at around 6000 years BP.

Tim Laurie has been concerned with the survey and interpretation of archaeological sites of all periods in Wensleydale. Swaledale and on the Swale-Tees/Greta Uplands over a period of almost forty years. He is mentor and Hon. President of the recently formed Swaledale Arkengarthdale Archaeological Group (SWAAG). His current interest is in recordina relict woodland communities throughout this region of the East Pennine Fringe.



"Raising modern sculpture from the dead": Jacob Epstein, Eric Gill and Henri Gaudier-Brzeska.

Evelyn Silber discusses the pioneering work of artists who redefined sculpture in Britain during 1907-1915. This work includes, Epstein's Tomb of Oscar Wilde and Rock Drill; the sexually explicit carvings of Gill and Epstein; Gaudier's animal and figure studies and his Head of Fzra Pound These artists created carvings that challenged contemporary taste, stirred up controversy and public debate and set the scene for Henry Moore and Barbara Hepworth. 

# MUKER PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 1<sup>st</sup> OCTOBER, 2013

The Parish Council meeting was held on the 1st October, 2013. Councillors Porter, Metcalfe, Reynoldson, Calvert and Gardner were present with Councillor Whitehead presiding. Councillor David Crapper and Ms Jill Armstrong from Melbecks Parish Council joined the meeting for Yorkshire Ambulance presentation. The Clerk was Ms K Scott. Apologies for Absence: Apologies were received from Councillor John Blackie Appointment of Parish Clerk: Cllr Whitehead proposed the appointment of Ms Kathy Scott as Parish Clerk. The proposal was seconded by Cllr ΑII in favour Gardner Yorkshire Ambulance Service: Cllr Gardner introduced the guest speaker, Mr Dave Jones, from the Yorkshire Ambulance Service. Mr Jones advised the Council on the benefits of a static site for a defibrillator. Due to the lack of mobile phone coverage in the Upper Dales, Mr Jones advised that First Responders was not a viable option for our area. The benefits of a static defibrillator were outlined. The defibrillator is designed for lay people to use and to go in public places for safe, general, emergency use. Training would be provided for a core team of local people and a day's training for anyone interested in learning more. The members thanked Mr Jones for his information and support. Following the presentation, Mr Jones, Ms Armstrong and Cllr Crapper left the meeting. The meeting discussed the benefits, costs and possible funding

options. Cllr Metcalfe proposed that the Parish purchase two defibrillators one for Muker and one for Keld. The proposal was seconded by Cllr Calvert. All in favour. Declaration of Interests: None Minutes of previous meeting: The minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on September 2013 had been circulated. The minutes were approved as a correct record on the proposal of Cllr Porter and seconded by Cllr Metcalfe. All in favour. Matters Arising: Highways flooding: Cllr Reynoldson stated there had been an improvement, but the area was still flooding and the Clerk should contact Highways again. Cllr Reynoldson will advise Highways where the problem lies.

Highways Ivelet Bridge: Cllr Gardner is trying to find out who authorised the bat survey. No work has been done and it is not understood why a bat survey has been requested when the work needed is on the parapet and not underneath the bridge. Cllr Gardner will continue to pursue the matter. NYCC Bus services: Cllr Gardner is in the process of organising a public meeting, as the proposed reduction in service doesn't allow for anyone travelling to and from work, school or college and limits time available in Richmond to 1 hour. Cllr Gardner will advise on progress Finance: The Chairman has received the VAT refund of £274.47. PKF Littlejohn the Parish Council Auditors report has been received and the feedback form completed. The Clerk to advise PKF Littlejohn of her appointment Highways: Cllr Whitehead requested that the Clerk contact Highways as the re-painted lines in Muker village where both the wrong colour support. Cllr Gardner will pursue funding and too wide. Also, all the lines need

to date. Cllr Metcalfe stated that the resurfacing at Banty Hill on the Buttertubs is too smooth for frost and icing conditions. Cllr Gardner agreed and has already contacted Highways. Cllr Metcalfe is concerned about the overhanging trees at Scarr House Bridge and Muker Bridge which are obscuring road visibility. Cllr Gardner to take this matter forward. Richmondshire District Council: street lights are not working in Muker village. The Clerk to contact RDC. Cllr Gardner has received a letter requesting parishes to comment on switching off street lighting between midnight and 0500 in order to save money. In North Yorkshire, councils have been given three options; Lights to remain on unchanged, some lights to remain on, others to be switched off or no change. As there are very few street lights and those that are present are at key points, the Council agreed that all lights should remain switched on. Clerk to write to RDC. Register of Electors will be published on 16 February 2014. Clerk to reply to RDC with Council's preferred method receiving its copy. European Parliamentary Election will be held on 22 May 2014 noted. A copy of the Casual Vacancy Procedure received and noted. The Clerk was requested to complete the Review of Polling Districts and Places feedback form as per the members' views. The Notice of a Community Governance/Parish review of Parish Arrangements was noted. NYCC: Nothing to report YDNPA: Scarr House Farm planning granted. Tree Felling at two sites has been granted Council noted that representatives from Parish Councils are

replacing in the village, not just those done invited to Yorkshire Dales Local Plan 2015-2030 forums in Grassington on 28th October and Bainbridge on 30th October 7 -9pm. YLCA: Nothing to report Correspondance/AOB: Cllr Gardner advised the meeting that The Friarage Hospital consultation regarding Maternity and Children Services will take place in Hawes on October 17th 2014. The Chair read correspondence from Mrs Diana Hartley regarding a memorial seat. The Clerk is to write to Mrs Hartley for further clarification. The Chair read the invitation to meeting the Police Commissioner, Julie Mulligan who is coming to Hawes on 8th November. The meeting noted the poster and leaflet from Health Watch. The Clerk to put the poster on noticeboard Muker The Chair correspondence from Great North Air Ambulance requesting financial support from the Parish. # NEWS FROM REETH POST OFFICE

Once again the Post Office is supporting BBC's Children In Need and encouraging you to Go BearFaced on Friday November 8<sup>th</sup>. All you have to do is swap your makeup for a paw print on that day. The paw prints, which are more discreet than last year's version, but will add a classy touch of glitter to your face, are available from the Post Office for just £1.00, with the money going to Children In Need.

A number of people have asked us what effect the sale of Royal Mail will have on the Post Office. The simple answer is that we do not know and will just have to wait and see how things work out. One misconception that a number of people still have though, is that the Post Office is part of Royal Mail. This is not the case as the two businesses were separated some time ago.

One bit of good news from Royal Mail is that they are consulting on a change to its parcel range to allow more items to be classed as 'small parcels'. If the consultation is successful, about 80% of all parcels delivered by Royal mail would be classed as 'small parcels' - which are a fair bit cheaper than medium parcels.

Finally, the last recommended posting dates for Christmas are approaching for overseas destinations. For airmail to Australia and New Zealand (You've missed the date for surface mail which was 30<sup>th</sup> September) it's 4<sup>th</sup> December for example and for the USA it's 13<sup>th</sup> December. No panic for inland though - you've got until 20<sup>th</sup> December for first class.

# Email woes, confusion, phishing and spam

Over the last couple of months I have become heartily sick of email. Not only do I get hundreds of emails a day (many of which are junk or trying to sell me something) increasingly I am finding emails either don't arrive when I send them (with no explanation) and aren't received (again with no explanation). Even when someone does receive an email it is becoming increasingly difficult to see the important emails you want to read in the blizzard of stuff you don't want. The problem seems to be a result of massive amounts of malicious emails swamping systems. I have had some experience of this recently dealing with websites that have been hacked and abused by spammers and malicious emailers using someone else's website to send out their malicious email. This is particularly frustrating as usually the first clue someone has that their website has been hacked is either their own emails being rejected because their site has been blacklisted or getting their account suspended by their email provider for sending out ridiculous quantities of email. Additionally the poor victim is frequently attacked by the recipients of the junk. Some things to consider when emails arrive in your inbox: 1) Are you sure the email is from where it says it is from? A number of years ago someone pretended to be me and started sending out job offers on my behalf - for weeks I was inundated by people sending CVs and other emails. Almost all of this came from the U.S - and it didn't seem to occur to them that a business in the UK was unlikely to randomly offer them a job in the UK. You have to use your common sense when looking at emails - a particularly common example of this sort of email is getting requests for money from a friend stranded in some far flung country --- ask yourself is your friend likely to be stranded in Vietnam at the moment? Unfortunately people get drawn into these scams very easily and seem to throw common sense out of the window. 2) Were you expecting

that attachment from a friend? If in doubt ask them BEFORE opening the attachment! 3) Is the email from a financial intuition or official body bank, building society etc. or a government department (such as HMRC). Does it ask you to log in to their website to solve a problem or offer you a free tax refund, free cash or any other inducement? I cannot say this loudly enough: BANKS AND GOVERNMENT NEVER ASK YOU TO DIVULGE PERSONAL DATA VIA AN EMAIL. It doesn't matter convincing the email looks it is almost certainly a scam. If you are unsure then call the relevant body on the telephone and ask if this email is real - and use the phone number everyone else would use (from the directory) not the number supplied in the email. If it turns out to be genuine you need to get very angry with the institution for behaving so recklessly in the first place. You should never log in to a website from a link in an email unless you are absolutely 100% certain that the email is genuine and even then check the address of the website you end up at to make sure it is where you expect to be. 4) If you get junk from an unexpected source (for example fake 'Thank you for your order' emails that look like they come from Amazon and are very similar to genuine emails from Amazon) don't act on any of the suggestions in the email - check to see if the email address looks correct. If it does, go directly to the website yourself (not via a link in the email) and login to your account to check for fraudulent activity. Chances are the supposed sender knows nothing about it. The last two examples are what is meant when you see the term "phishing" basically someone is trying to steal information that may enable them to steal money from you. Just to say it again - the rule is switch on common sense when dealing with email (and the internet in general). If you have any doubts the simple thing is to check it out before you do anything you may regret. # UPPER DALES FAMILY HISTORY GROUP

Our new season of talks began with Sir Thomas Ingilby on the Ingilbys of Ripley Castle which has been his family home for more than 700 years. He gave us a excellent overview of several centuries of family and national history from the date when the Ingilbys acquired the Ripley estate through marriage with an heiress. One of ancestors received his knighthood after saving the life of Edward III while others were involved in the Pilgrimage of Grace and both sides of the Rising of the North as well being embroiled in the Gunpowder Plot and the Civil War. In more peaceful times one of the family undertook the Grand Tour and was so taken with the continental architecture that he rebuilt the village of Ripley in the style of a French town, complete with its own hotel de ville instead of a town hall. Coming right up to the present day Sir Thomas talked about life at the castle now that it is a tourist destination and event venue rather than a fortress and explained how ongoing research was still uncovering details of its fascinating past.

The next talk is at Harmby village hall on Wednesday, November 27, at 2pm when David Lewis will be speaking about the famous 18<sup>th</sup> century scientist Smithson Tennant (1761 - 1815) and his Yorkshire roots. Smithson Tennant had family links to Selby and Wensleydale and David is particularly keen to learn more about his local connections to places such as Mount Park and Nappa Hall. ### REETH PARISH COUNCIL SEPTEMBER

Tour de France The parish council was preceded by a public meeting to discuss the 2014 Tour de France. A group of local residents and business owners had met to discuss possibilities and matters concern and would continue to follow those up with groups and individuals within the community. Key points were that it was important to make sure all residents understood what would be happening and that visitors should enjoy their experience and want to return on other occasions. Parking issues needed to be addressed, both for visitors and for residents who would need to move their cars off the route. Councillors and members of the public felt that at least part of the green should be closed off to cars and council members later agreed to take measures to enforce the no camping rule on the green. A number of other issues such as provision of extra toilets and a First Aid base would be considered by the working group. Up to date information on the event is available on the Tour de France website.

Coun Gardner reported that current information was that the main road would be closed to vehicles from 11am on the morning of the race and that the whole caravan, including support vehicles should have passed through by about 3pm. You have to feel disappointed for the manager and his assistant, they invest a lot of time and energy keeping a local team going for the local lads - unfortunately it doesn't buy loyalty. It would appear the days where you played for and had pride in your local team are looking to be a thing of the past; maybe it is just part of a youth culture of self-interest but there is no I in team and if not supported there will be no team. The problem isn't just at Reeth though; two more local teams have disappeared from the Wensleydale league this season. A sad reality but not one just affecting Reeth AFC, those who make the decisions in government should take note - we need to keep young people in rural areas to keep the communities alive. However management is not just about the good times, when things are tough you just have to dig deep and get on with it. With a grim determination Tel and Steve have set about recruiting to support those lads that want to keep the club alive. From fielding the only eleven available they are now at the dizzy heights of luxury of having three subs on the bench. You have to be positive, a score of 5 -0 against the league leaders is seen as an improvement, not a disappointing loss. But it's not just about the management; those who have chosen to stay are what make a team in local football. As one of the lads said 'you win together, you lose

together, that's how it is you just have to get on with it'.

And so with a positive attitude the new look team took to the field against top of the league Spennithorne for the fifth game of the season. 
