

MELBECKS PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON AUGUST 15th 2013

Register of Members Interests Cllrs were given new Register of Members Interest forms to be completed as requested by Richmondshire District Council. suggested Code of Conduct was agreed upon. and the Standing Order to be adopted was to be Option A., proposed by Cllr R Alderson and seconded by Cllr Calvert. The Clerk will return copies to RDC as necessary. Bench in Gunnerside A letter was read out from the owner of the bench which has fallen into disrepair, advising that they did not currently have funds to either repair or replace the bench. Cllr Calvert has offered to remove and dispose of it. Landslip Cllr R. Alderson raised the point that some work had now been done to repair the landslip at Gunnerside. Line painting in Gunnerside The Council was advised of a reply from Highways stating that the lines would be laid within the next few weeks. The Clerk was asked to follow this up if not done before the next meeting. Financial Risk Assessment Council agreed and signed a Financial Risk Assessment Proposed reductions to bus service subsidy. The Council discussed the proposal to reduce subsidy to the bus service which could reduce services to twice daily (removing the early and late bus up the dale). The Clerk was requested to reply to the questionnaire, suggesting the possibility of school buses being available to be used by members of the general public, and if a round trip was made to Richmond, it did not allow much time before the bus would leave on the return trip, and if the time between buses could be lengthened at all. Planning Applications .The Council noted that Planning application has been withdrawn from Nell Tom, Blades. The Council noted receipt of a Planning application for Troutbeck House, Gunnerside to change one room to a cafe. Council raised no comments or objections. Decc Green Energy. The Council noted receipt from DECC (Dept of Energy and Climate Change) that community energy projects will be able to receive Feed-in- Tariff payments for clean green energy generated. Condition of the Reeth - Richmond road. Council noted receipt of an email from Cllr Blackie advising that there would be major repairs to the including reconstruction of carriageway starting in September/October. Overgrown tree. Cllr Calvert raised the issue of an overgrowing tree at junction of B6270 and the A6108, which is the obstructing vision when turning towards Reeth from Richmond. The Clerk requested to write to Highways to bring this matter to their attention.

Next meeting. The next meeting will be held on Thursday October 3^{rd} at Gunnerside Village Hall at 7.30pm.

Our new season starts with a talk from Barbara Dixon on The Fun Of Your Family History, taking a humorous look at the various pleasures of the process and the extreme measures she has taken to get at the facts. END OF THE ROAD FOR THE SWALEDALE BUS?

This summer Swaledale has once again seen buses 7 days per week with the Sunday DalesBus services complementing the Monday to Saturday Dales & District Service 30 Minibus. However North Yorkshire County Council are proposing to reduce Service 30 to just two round trips per day from Richmond at 9.35am & 2pm and from Keld at 10.50am and 3.10pm. This would give residents just 2 hours in Richmond and no chance to get to Darlington or further afield; it would make it impossible for anyone to travel to and from work by bus. It would also reduce opportunities for visitors to access Swaledale from Richmond including C2C and Swale Way walkers who often base themselves in Reeth or Richmond whilst doing 2 days walking in Swaledale using the bus to access the start or finish of each day's walk; some C2C walkers have a "rest day" in Richmond and come back up on the bus to revisit parts of Swaledale or Arkengarthdale. explore The current services are very reliable and much appreciated by those who use them; the 4.30pm from Richmond to Reeth is often very busy with a mixture of local residents returning from shopping trips, visiting friends and family and making visits to dentists; opticians; solicitors; banks etc. These won't be possible if these proposed cuts are made The Dales & Bowland Community Interest Company manages the Sunday DalesBus services and this year produced an excellent leaflet marketing the daily Swaledale bus; we are all volunteers and have invested considerable efforts to promote these vital

services for residents and visitors. Indeed the Sunday services have been financially supported by Friends of DalesBus: Yorkshire Dales Society & CPRE encourage more visitors to the Two Dales whilst DalesBus Ramblers & Friends of the Settle-Carlisle Line have organised free walks off auided the buses. GRINTON PARISH COUNCIL SEPTEMBER

GP Services

The clerk had received a reply from Mr Hague agreeing with the concerns of the council regarding pressures on rural health services. A response from Geoff Day assured councillors that he was aware of the issues surrounding withdrawal of the minimum practice income guarantee and would be taking them into consideration. On a separate matter Richmondshire District Council informed members that the Scrutiny Committee was looking at local residents' experiences of using the GP out of hours service with a view to deciding the best site for it in the future. The parish council would write to them stressing the need to maintain this vital service.

Footbridges

The white bridge over Grinton beck had been painted but the footbridge at Crackpot waterfall had been badly damaged by a tree and would be reported to the National Park ranger.

Highways

Coun Gardner reported that Highways were still investigating the best way to deal with the subsidence problems on the Reeth to Richmond road but hoped to begin work on the repairs in early October. He had also raised the question of the trees growing out of Grinton bridge with them. Coun Sunter had been approached by the Road Haulage Association who asked that HGV restrictions on the moor road to Leyburn should be lifted until the main road had bee repaired as the traffic lights were posing problems for large vehicles.

This route would be used as the diversion for all traffic during the actual repairs so Highways would be asked if the HGVs could begin to use it as soon as possible to alleviate some of the difficulties. Potholes on Whitaside and Swale Hall lane would also be reported.

Public Transport

North Yorkshire County Council informed members of a public consultation on proposed reductions to bus service subsidies which would affect services in Swaledale.

Best Kept Village

Grinton had been judged fourth in their category in the recent Best Kept Village competition.

Tour de France

Coun Gardner reported that grant funding was available for parishes on the route of the race to use for projects in the spirit of the Tour de France. A public meeting to discuss the race would be held at the start of the next Reeth parish council meeting at 7pm on September 20.

Repairs

A grant had been obtained for repairs through the Community Opportunities Fund and work would be carried out in the near future to the shelter, seats and outside of the village hall.

Has email reached the end of the road? One of the commonest questions I am asked is 'how do I get rid of all the rubbish emails?'. If I had an answer that worked I would probably be rich overnight but there are a number of things that people should be aware of. First there is no such thing as a 100% effective junk mail filter inevitably some rubbish will get through and, what is worse, some real email that you want will accidentally get identified as junk and so your junk mail needs to be checked for real email regularly. I try to check my junk mail most days but it isn't uncommon for me to get hundreds of emails a day and inevitably something gets missed and lost. The best junk mail filter I have found is the one used by Google in their gmail service. It isn't perfect but it does a pretty good job. One of the poorest performers is the on provided by Yahoo (and so that includes any service using Yahoo to provide email, such as BT Internet). The trouble with Yahoo's filter is that it doesn't identify a lot of junk at all and it wrongly classifies a lot of personal email as junk. To make matters worse if you use a program like Mac Mail, Windows Live Mail or Outlook, or a mobile device such as a phone or a tablet, then you will never see what is in the junk folder which means that you will lose a lot of legitimate email while still being plagued

by junk mail. Yahoo (and so BT too) is set up automatically so that the only place you can see the Junk mail folder is on their website - and not if you use any other method to collect your mail. Most people aren't aware of this and just assume that someone has not replied to an email. I'm afraid this happens a lot to me when people send me emails and they think I don't reply and I get irritated follow up emails - at which point I have to phone them and explain I did answer the email - they just If you use Yahoo/BT. haven't seen it!! and not via their website, there is a simple way to get over this - log in to your email account online (for BT www.btinternet.com) Click the little cog at the top right corner and look under "POP and Forwarding Settings" - make sure it is set to always deliver junk mail. (if you want you can get it to mark suspect junk with a prefix (no matter what it says on that page they add [Bulk] before the email subject). That way all email will be delivered to your phone, tablet or email program and you won't miss any more genuine email. Finally this month a word about email scamming ... imagine the following scenario: I make some headed letter paper for a fake business "Cons R Us" based in Birmingham, write a letter trying to con you out of money and then post the letter to you. You receive the letter and assume because it is on headed paper that it is from "Cons R Us" in Birmingham. The only clue that it is

fake is that the post mark in North Yorkshire - most people would miss that clue! Email can be very similar - it is very easy to send an email so that it appears to come from someone else. The only clues that it isn't genuine are probably the content of the email which looks suspicious and the email headers (the code used by the internet to track where an email came from and the route it took) - unfortunately most people never see the headers and don't understand them. A common scam that uses this is fake letters from abroad "I am stuck with no money in Outer Mongolia - please help" which are mostly pretty obviously fake, but there are an increasing number of less obvious scams around and it surprising the number of people that fall for them. Be aware that all may not be as it seems and assess each email carefully - hence the title - is email coming to the end of the road? ideas for articles or comments why not drop me line via

NEWS FROM REETH POST OFFICE

"It's a bit like being at an airport," was the comment from one of our customers when we asked if he parcel contained any restricted items-and in away it is. Some time ago, new regulations came into force concerning sending dangerous goods abroad, which have extended to include inland mail. Many everyday items, such as aerosols, nail and perfumes are aoods danaerous under the transport legislation and failure to comply with these regulations can lead to prosecution. You are responsible for checking whether or not an item is prohibited or restricted and at the Post Office, we are required to ask about the contents of parcels before we can accept them. The regulations are complex as some items can be sent inland but not abroad (aerosols for toiletry or medicinal purposes) while others can be sent anywhere but there are guidelines on packaging. The easiest thing to do is pop into the Post Office and pick up a leaflet or ask us for advice. You may think it a bit early to start thinking about posting things for Christmas, gut a little forethought could save you some money, especially if you give careful consideration to the size and shape of the parcel you are posting. For example, a second class small parcel up to 1kg will cost you £2.50 but if the parcel is to thick to fit the small parcel slot on the size guide, it automatically becomes a cost parcel and will Similarly, if you are sending parcels abroad, it is more economical to keep them under 2kg as over that weight the cost rises steeply. Again, pop into the Post Office for a price guide or ask us for advice. Finally, we have a new photocopier in the Post Office, which as well as doing back to back copies, enlarging or shrinking to name but a few of its capabilities, also prints to a better quality and can do colour copies.






